



MUZZLELOADING TRAP



IMPROVE YOUR DEFENSIVE PISTOL SKILLS

Come on out to the IDPA Monthly Match. It is the 4th Saturday every month. Sign up is 8:00 a.m. and the match starts soon after. Show up about 7:00 a.m. and help set up the match. We have a lot of fun!

Defensive Pistol matches typically require the use of a service type pistol or revolver of 9mm / .38 special or larger caliber. Shooters competing in Defensive Pistol events use practical handguns and holsters that are suitable for self-defense use. No "competition only" equipment is permitted, since the goal is to test the skill and ability of and individual, not his or her equipment or gamesman-ship.

We set up 4 or 5 stages, where you could be shooting around barricades or barrels, shooting while moving, shooting targets that are moving and engaging multiple targets. Stages are limited to 18 rounds of ammunition; a minimum of 150 rounds of ammo is needed.



RANGEMASTER SOUNDOFF

In keeping with this year's theme, "get involved", let's talk about being a Range Master. Getting involved as a volunteer Range Master is an easy way to give a little back to the Association, in the form of time. Just a few hours a month is all you need to give. "Ray, Neil, what would I have to do?" you ask. As a Range Master you are responsible for the safety and well being of everyone at the range during your duty time as well as maintaining a safe environment around the Association property. Basically you would be in charge of seeing that the ranges were well kept. Brass swept up, trash in the proper receptacles, etc. You would see to it that all participants, whether shooting or not, were wearing proper eye and ear protection. Shooters should be adhering to all of the Association range rules as well as the Administrative rules. Members and guests alike would all be signed in on the proper sheets. All participants would have a clear understanding of what was expected of them in terms of safety habits as well as personal habits. Should an incident occur, the Range Master would gather all of the pertinent information, write and submit an incident report to the Chief Range Master.

Range Masters are the eyes and ears of the Association during range hours. You would have a great deal of responsibility and as with all responsible positions, a certain degree of power. The Range Master on duty always has the <u>final say during any questionable act(s) on the Association properties.</u>

So, if this sounds like something you would like to get involved with, here's all you have to do. Go to the trap Ramada first aid box and open it using the same number as the gate combination. Inside you will find copies of the Range Master Monthly Schedules. Each book is for a different month so be sure which one you are holding in your hands. Now, (and this is the fun part), turn to the page that has the date you would like to volunteer and write your name in the space provided, either A.M. or P.M. Wow, you've done it, you are "involved". All you have to do now is show up on that date, at that time, wearing your red shirt and cap and go out there and make sure all is safe and well for anyone who wishes to utilize our wonderful facility.

Range Masters: Please remember we are now sporting a new blue membership card. Range Masters will be checking all property users over the next couple of weeks to ensure that they have their current blue membership cards with them each time they are at the range.


Members: Please remember to have your new current blue membership card and proper I.D. The Range Masters will check these items and anyone attempting to use the Association facilities without these items in their possession will be asked to leave. A parent/guardian of a junior member attempting to utilize the range without the junior member present, will be asked to leave.

The giving of the gate combination to a non-member is strictly forbidden. Members who are found to be doing this can have their membership revoked by the Board of Directors. Also, please remember to always return the gate locks to 0000.


