

LEGISLATIVE REPORT APRIL 2009

CALIFORNIA

AB 357 would return California to a "shall issue" state from a "will issue" state.

Read the ballot initiatives for the May Special election carefully. Prop. 1a would continue the tax increases that Sacramento recently implemented for Two (2) years.

FEDERAL

There are a number of bills that would impact buying/ owning firearms and ammunition, but none are making any movement at this time. Stay alert.

The Department of Defense stopped the sale of fired cases by the military to commercial reloaders for remanufacturing and sale to law enforcement and civilians. The brass was to be "demilled" and sold for scrap. They reversed themselves within a week due to the pressure they received.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Members and Range Officers,

Today I would like to share some insights on the responsibilities of our volunteer Range Officers and the importance of everyone following the rules of our association. Over the past two years I have been involved in many conversations and discussions concerning our range officers. I have come to the conclusion that many of us don't fully understand the functions and responsibilities of our Range Officers and the importance they have on protecting the present and future of our association as well a providing a safe environment for all members.

With that said, let me give you a brief outline of a day on the range for a typical Range Officer. Arrive before 7am. Walk the entire circumference of the property and check all the gates and look for anything out of order. Check all the locks on the sheds including the trap houses. Pick up the green sign in sheets and replace with newly dated sheets on all ranges. Deposit yesterdays sign in sheets in the trap Ramada. By now members and guests are coming in, so it's time to start checking ID's and reminding folks to sign in. Oh, there is a guy shooting on the pistol range and the rounds are not impacting the bank. People around him apparently don't see the bullets hitting the ground and ricocheting everywhere. It's time for a safety talk and then it's off to the 100 yard range and then the 150 yard range. Target frames are in disarray so the RO straightens them up and puts new cardboard on the frames.

A significant amount of time is spent addressing rules that have not been followed by members. For example, some members forget that the rule is to remove their targets when the frame is retired to frame house. We have a sufficient supply of cardboard in the trap Ramada. You will need to cut the sheets in half and you will have a 24X24 piece. A member approaches the RO and wants to know why he can't shoot his pistol on the 150 yard range. Time is spent going over the rules and pointing out to the member that the rules are posted on all the ranges. It is not the responsibility of the Range Officer to educate members on the range rules. It is the responsibility of all members to know the range rules and the Association rules and to abide by the rules at all times. All rules are posted on the Web site and the range for everyone to review.

In the event of an incident the RO must write a detailed report, email it to the CRSO and call the assistant RSO or a board member. Pictures may be required. Five hours are gone before he knows it and it's time to sign out on all ranges. The goal of all our Range Officers is to maintain a positive friendly attitude at all times, even when a member is in a hostile mood.

Range Officers volunteer their time for the good of the association and it is important to be respectful to these volunteers. I will include a few of the comments from our members that have been tossed around: "you guys are just a bunch of police officers", "I thought this was America", "What do you mean I can't shoot my pistol on the 100 yard range at 25 yard, I have always done that." "This used to be a fun club," "You guys make up your own rules", "We never had to show our ID cards before". "Who says I can't have 4 guests", and the list goes on. Believe me, there are many more quotes I prefer not to mention. Fortunately the complaints come **from a few**, and in my opinion that number needs to be reduced to ZERO.

This is a litigious world we live in today and the Range Officer is doing his share to ensure this range remains open for all our members and guests and future members. How about helping the RO's out and pick up after yourself, put some new cardboard on the frames, help watch over the range and share a polite word with the shooter next to you that is bouncing bullets and endangering the safety of others. Buy yourself a lanyard to display your ID card so the RO can easily check your credentials. Ask yourself, am I doing my part? You could even volunteer five hours a month as a Range Officer. Don't worry; we have a training program for the new RO's. The RO is a busy guy volunteering his time (five hours a month) for you. He is doing his part to protect all members' rights to enjoy this shooting association now and in the future. Perhaps it's time for more members to get out and volunteer their time to help out. Assisting is much more productive than complaining and more rewarding. For your convenience the area directly behind the 150 range is now open for LOADING AND UNLOADING. Please unload and move your vehicle to the parking lot and do not block the entrance. Do not abuse this privilege.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the possible administrative action that can be applied to those members violating our range or administrative rules. Any member written up must appear before the board of directors to explain his or her situation and face the possibility of suspension and in severe cases revocation of membership.

Remember, the Range Officers word is final. – A Good Attitude is Contagious- Tom Arendell is our Range Officer of the Month- He is also one heck of a good shot with a flintlock. Thanks Tom.






