





RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

he Board of Directors has approved a couple of changes to the "Escondido Fish and Game Casual Shooting Rules" and the "Range Safety Officer Range Manual". The same changes are reflected in both documents. The changed documents can be found on the Range Safety Officer Internet site www.efgarso.org. In essence, the changed sections are noted as follows in italic:

• Juniors, those shooters 17 and under, must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or an adult with a signed permission slip from their parent or legal guardian. Youth shooters, 18 to 21, who are members, may not be in possession of a hand gun unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or an adult with a signed permission slip (EF&GA rule). Youth members may shoot rifle, shotgun and archery without a parent or guardian. Youth members may bring two guests to the range with the same provisions as above.

And

• Open fires permitted in the fire rings only and use the permanent BBQ's located in the camping area. Supply your own wood for the fire ring and charcoal for BBQ'ing.

While I am on the subject of safety rules, I think it is time to review a few range safety rules that our Range Safety Officers have noted as not being followed by all of our members and their guests or just being forgotten for the moment. Here are a few:

- The range hours are from 7:00 a.m. to local sunset; that is sunset on the range.
- The speed limit on the range is 5 miles per hour.
- Always sign-in on all ranges visited and sign-out when done on each range.
- Rapid fire is not permitted. That includes "double taps".
- When a "cease fire" has been called and the range is "cold", stay behind the yellow line, except for those shooters going down range to service their targets. Do not handle any equipment, including firearms and magazines, while the range is "cold". Open Chamber Indicators are preferred.
- One target recommended, two maximum, located vertically on the target stand cardboard. No likeness of any political person(s) or any person(s) living or dead are allowed.
- Giving the gate code to anyone, including family members, is grounds for loss of membership.
- Two guests per member. For more than two guests, written permission is required in **advance** from the Board of Directors. E-Mail the Association Secretary for approval. A copy of the written permission must be with the member. You are responsible for your guests and you must stay with your guests at all times while on the property (except for visits to the rest rooms). Children must stay with adults at all times, even in the primitive campground area.
- Rest room door code is 3-0-3-0.
- The shooter must be in control of their firearm at all times. We are experiencing many cases of shooters putting holes in the range ramadas (the over hangs covering the ranges). Do not shoot anything but paper targets. Do not shoot at things on the ground, at range property or equipment.
- Place bullets and shells that fail to fire in the red storage cylinders located on each range. Do not throw them on the ground or in the trash.
- When using the trap range for manual throwing of your targets, load two shells maximum.
- Clean up the area of the range you were using before you leave.

I keep writing about safety and proper firearm handling and some members or their guest just do not seem to get the message. Last month I noted that we had 29 bullet holes in the pistol range ramada (over hang) and just a couple of weeks later the count has increased 34 (as of 14 Mar). If any member or their guest is noted shooting anything but approved targets by our RSO's or other members, they will be asked to explain their reasoning for doing so to the Board of Directors. Let us all be safe and sane.






