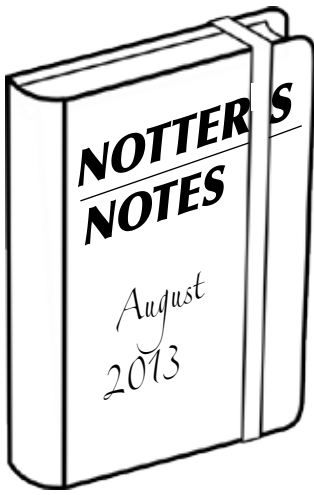

## HAVE YOU TRIED OUR ORGANIZED SHOOTS?

They are fun and will improve your shooting skills. Shoot Trap and Five Stand and watch your hits on birds in the field improve. Shoot any of the rifle events and you will be amazed at how your ability to hit a deer, elk, or wild boar will improve. Not sure that you have the correct firearm for any specific match? All of the Match Directors will be happy to answer your questions about equipment required, course of fire, etc. Oft times a firearm you already own will suffice to participate and determine if that type of shooting is for you. Fire the National Match Course and qualify to buy firearms from the Civilian Marksmanship Program. The Association owns M-1 Garands which you may use to shoot this match. You are always welcome at any match as a spectator. The shooters and Match Director will answer your questions as they have time. The Cowboy Shooters have practice sessions, a great place to start if you have an interest in shooting pre-1890 guns or replicas. Remember, most scheduled events are open to the public, you can bring a buddy. Shoot one of these events, you will be glad you did.

### ALL STEEL TACTICAL RIFLE MATCH AUGUST 17th

Come out Saturday and join us for our all steel, rapid fire semi-auto rifle match at 8:00am. Bring your AR-15, AK, M1 carbine, or other semi-automatic rifle. Acceptable calibers are .223/5.56, 7.62x39, 30 carbine, 5.56x39, 9mm and 45 ACP. Please NO 308's. Please note that all rifles must comply with California law. Also, no steel core or armor piercing ammunition is allowed. Make sure your AK ammo passes the magnet test. The course of fire will be four, 18 round stages, so bring about 100 rounds of ammunition. Distances are 50 to 100 yards. Shooters will need in addition to their rifles, 3 mags and 2 mag pouches or cargo pants to hold their mags.

## For Goodness Snakes!



OK, OK it is a goofy heading, but there is a method to my madness. Hot weather has arrived in Southern California and OUR range is no exception. With it comes a somewhat increased danger from rattlesnakes. They can be dangerous, of course, because their bite can be poisonous and painful to say the least. Having said that, they rarely bother anyone and they are quite helpful in keeping the rodent population under control.

I have heard it said recently that the only good snake is a dead snake. Quite frankly, I personally consider that to be a rather ignorant thing to say for many reasons, but I shall elucidate one as far as EF&GA is concerned. Under the terms of our lease we occupy a wildlife refuge where wildlife is to be protected. There is no exception made for rattlesnakes. Do not kill them! It is easy to walk away and I defy anyone to prove to me that they have been chased down and bitten by one. I am personally available to remove and relocate any that happen to come into the club house! RSOs are fully authorized to pull the card of any member who is observed killing any wildlife on the club grounds. Said member can then try to convince the BOD that it was necessary.

Throughout the next several months there will be an influx of new members who will have varying degrees of knowledge regarding range safety and gun safety in general. Older members are encouraged to take the newbies under their wing when it makes sense. Give the RSOs a hand. We are all responsible for safety on the range. Some rules are broken through ignorance. If the shooter is corrected and advised of the correct procedure, perhaps we can prevent it from becoming a full blown incident.

One final warning is on the issue of reloading. The cost of ammo has driven many shooters to consider reloading their own ammunition. While it certainly makes cents(spelling noted), it does require care and some forethought. It might make sense to sign up for a class with someone such as Elario Marchi before you start. At the very least, ask a lot of questions before you start. There are any number of competent reloaders in the club who will be more than willing to help you get started.

# Survey Finds Law Enforcement United Against Gun Control

## 99 Percent Believe "Assault Weapons" Ban is Not Most Important Measure to Stop Mass Shootings

FAIRFAX, Va. – PoliceOne.com released today the results of an extensive survey of about 15,000 active and retired law enforcement officers of all ranks and from departments ranging in size from less than 25 to more than 1,000.

These results strongly show that law enforcement officers do not support President Obama's gun control agenda. They do, however, strongly support the Right-to-Carry by law-abiding Americans. The survey respondents are united in their desire for politicians to focus on keeping firearms out of the hands of the mentally ill and to reject unconstitutional gun control measures that infringe on Second Amendment rights.

- Almost 96 percent said that a ban on standard capacity magazines would not reduce violent crime.
- More than 91 percent stated that the use of a firearm in the commission of a crime should have stiff, mandatory sentences, and no plea-bargains.
- More than 91 percent stated they supported the Right-to-Carry by law abiding Americans.
- More than 81 percent said that "gun buy-backs" do not reduce gun violence.
- 80 percent believe legally armed citizens can reduce casualties in incidents of mass violence.
- Nearly 80 percent said that a ban on private transfers of firearms between law-abiding citizens would not reduce violent crime.
- More than 76 percent indicated that legally armed citizens are important to reducing crime.
- More than 76 percent support the arming of trained and qualified teachers or administrators who volunteer to carry a firearm.
- More than 70 percent said that a ban on "assault weapons" would not reduce violent crime.
- More than 70 percent opposed the idea of a national registry of legal gun sales.
- Nearly 68 percent said magazine capacity restrictions would negatively affect them personally.
- More than 60 percent said that the passage of Obama's gun control legislation would not improve officer safety.
