Scholarship Awards

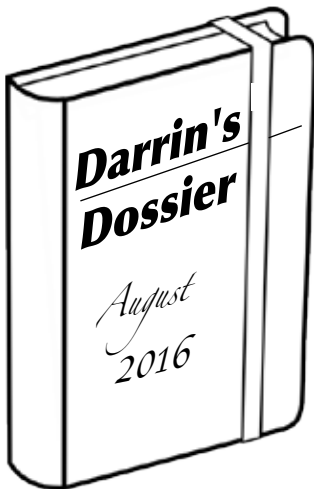

JR. CORNER

Summer is here, this is a time when everyone likes to relax, but that does not mean that we can relax on safety. Please remember the four basic safety rules:

1. **TREAT** every firearm as if it were loaded.
2. **NEVER** point your firearm at anything that you do not intend to shoot.
3. **KEEP** your finger off the trigger until you intend to shoot.
4. **KEEP** the firearm on safe until you are ready to shoot.

On July 17th, the Jr Rifle program had its latest event. This time there were some noticeable changes. The most noticeable would be the new, bright blue sandbags. These sandbags were used by the shooters to support the rifle for a more stable shooting platform. The change from emphasizing the use of sandbags instead of the single point sling, is seen by many as major change in direction for the program. The idea behind comes from many conversations over the last couple years. By emphasizing the use of the sandbags, we are now able to better focus on teaching the shooters the fundamentals of shooting. These include proper shooting position, sight alignment, sight picture, trigger control and follow through. These are skills that the young shooters will be able to use for the rest of their lives. The more advanced shooters were permitted to continue using a single-point sling. The decision to use a sling or sandbags was decided by each shooter. If the shooter selected the sandbag option, they were allowed to use as many as needed to make the shooter comfortable and accurate. We asked for feedback from the shooters as well as the coaches. The majority of the feedback was positive so we plan to research and consider this change for the time being.

Impressions from a Junior

The Junior Program at Escondido Fish and Game is safe, fun, and educational. I have learned so much about shooting and firearms safety just by participating in some of their junior competitions. Before each shooter can partake in a competition, they have to attend a mandatory safety briefing. This briefing is full of information about firearms safety and how to safely handle a firearm. Additionally, throughout the competition, each junior shooter has a coach. The coaches assist the shooters in handling their firearm safely and accurately hitting their target. I have had great experiences with each coach that I have competed with. Lastly, the Junior Program's awards system makes it so that each shooter is competing with his/herself, not the other shooters. This allows room for improvement for each junior shooter. The Junior Program at Escondido Fish and Game is a great way for young shooters to learn how to safely and correctly handle firearms and have fun while doing it. It is also a fantastic way to introduce young shooters to shooting.



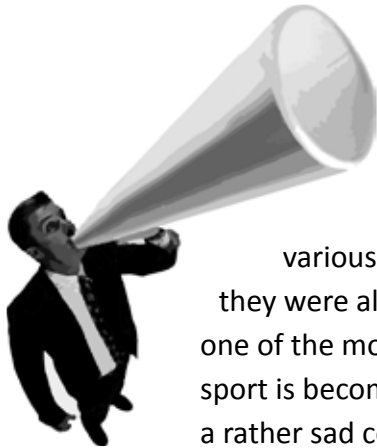

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

A few weeks ago EF&GA was the scene of an event for kids known as the Jakes Event. A “Jake” is another name for a young turkey. The “Jakes Event” was hosted by The Wild Turkey Federation, a group that helps teach youngsters various hunting skills such as archery, shotgun, .22 rifles and air rifles. Also this year they were allowed to fire a muzzle loader rifle and as far as I could discern the latter was one of the more popular shoots. I mention it because as a muzzle loader lover myself, the sport is becoming one that seems to be dying out, at least here on the West Coast. That is a rather sad commentary because shooting them is a great way to learn the true basics of shooting a firearm. Dads and Moms might think hard about getting your kids involved. The 4th Sunday of each month is an organized shoot that is open to the public. Please feel free to stop by to watch and join in.

Last issue I asked for reader input for issues that could be mentioned in the monthly article. I have not received any, although many members routinely mention that they read my thoughts. Just remember, this article was originally designed to allow our membership a forum on issues...good, bad or indifferent, you might help to make EF&GA a better, safer range.

When you drive in the main gate to the range be alert for others parties who might enter right behind you. They might not be authorized to enter and it is the duty of each member to ascertain whether or not anyone has a right to be on our range. Just two days ago the same person tried three different times to enter. As soon as someone started to ask for I.D. he quickly backed out and left. You can draw your own conclusions!

Note to all RSOs.....when you are checking the 150 yd range, especially when it is necessary walk behind the berm, and especially when no one else is around when you go down range. Turn on the “downrange lights” and place the “RANGE CLOSED” sign in a prominent position at around the 15 yard line. It is too easy for someone to come onto the range, not see you and possibly think that the lights were simply left on by mistake and start setting up a shooting position. Let’s take an extra few minutes to eliminate a potentially dangerous situation.

July 31 is the next scheduled RMAD. (Range Master Appreciation Day). Our association sets aside this day each year in appreciation for all the selfless time our team puts in to help keep our range safe and secure for our members and guests. You are invited to join us next year. Of course you must be an RSO. So join our team. What are you waiting for? One never knows, you could be next in line to receive the prestigious Range Master of the Year award

Special Permission for Special Things

We have numerous rules that we follow for safety, etiquette, and to keep us all civilized. There are certain instances when specific rules have exceptions. In the three cases listed below, written permission is required to document the fact that one has been granted permission to utilize the range in an unusual manner. In all three of the examples, written permission must be documented by a printed e-mail from the Secretary (Geoff Orchin).

Campground Use Overnight

The campground has become more popular over the years and because of this we want to be sure that don't have events conflicting with people camping. If you want to request use of the campground, please submit an e-mail to the Secretary with a description of what you want to do including the date(s). For example, you may want to request to park an RV and 2 tents for family and friends on February 30th and 31st. Geoff could approve or decline the request depending on the circumstances and he will respond via e-mail. If it is approved, print a copy of the e-mail and have it with you in case an RSO asks you to present the documentation.

More than TWO Guests per Member

Each card-carrying member of EF&GA is permitted to have up to TWO guests for casual shooting. You may petition the Secretary for permission to have additional guests. He will then review the request on a case-by-case basis and at his discretion could approve such a request. Again, submit the request via e-mail and he will respond via e-mail. If it is approved, print a copy of the e-mail and have it with you in case an RSO asks you to present the documentation.

Cannons

A few members have purchased black powder cannons (scale replicas) and want to test them at the range. We have ranges designed for pistol, rifle, trap, archery, etc.. but nothing designed for a cannon. If you want to test a cannon, you will need to appear before the Board of Directors to get permission as well a prescription for what range to use it on. If it is approved, the Secretary will send you an e-mail with a summary of the decision. If it is approved, print a copy of the e-mail and have it with you in case an RSO asks you to present the documentation.

Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (9/3/2016)

Ammo has plentifully come back to the market. But are you getting the accuracy and precision you and

your rifle are capable of? The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent, accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on Sept 3rd, 2016. **The First Part** is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session, 12:00 on Saturday, Sept 3rd, 2016 and will last until approximately 4 P.M. **The Second Part** is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session. The cost is two tiered: EF&GA members = \$90; non-members = \$100. For those individuals beginning and are without any reloading supplies (empty cases, powder, primers, etc.) a \$10 surcharge will be applied. Prior registration and a \$20 deposit is required to secure a place in this class. Registration is necessary and limited. NRA Home Defense class (8/26/2016)

This one-day class addresses range exercises that emphasize potential home encounters, movement to cover and use of cover/concealment, awareness, avoidance, and multiple threats, and a classroom session that expands upon the concepts you experience on the range. It will be held on Friday, August 26 and includes the certificate (NRA Personal Protection in the Home) and handbook. This is an intermediate class: Students (adults 21+ who must have prior basic to intermediate experience/training in the safe use of, and legally be able to use handguns) will shoot their own handguns and ammunition. Open to the public (please let me know if you are an EFGA member to receive your discount).

NRA Concealed Carry) class (9/23/2016 & 9/25/2016)

This is the NRA's most advanced class (NRA Personal Protection Outside the Home) and students (adults 21+ who must have prior basic to intermediate experience/training in the safe use of, and legally be able to use handguns) will shoot their own handguns and ammunition. 

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
