
Work Party (8/20/2017)

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

have mentioned it before, but shooters should be aware that during this time of the year we conduct a safety walk through for all new members on the third Thursday of the month. The walk begins about 1700 hours (5:00pm for anyone not familiar with military time). We try to keep the interruption as brief as possible, but a cease fire will be called as the group approaches each range. There could be as many as three groups on any given day. The point is that there will be interruptions in your shooting. I am apologizing in advance. These tours are important for our new members and I certainly appreciate your cooperation.

I must admit that I am a bit of a stickler for hygiene especially on the range where lead is present. When the youngsters are involved it is more important than ever since they can be quite susceptible to some of the problems lead can cause. While I am an avid shooter I am also a trained molecular biologist who can say with confidence that heavy metal poisoning is nothing to laugh at. Before leaving the range the problem can be easily eliminated by washing your hands with COLD water and soap. Use cold water to close the skin pores. If any of you old guys feel the need to laugh at my caution, feel free to do so, but ignorance is not always bliss.

Safety on the range is nearly always on my mind and this time of year does nothing to ameliorate the situation. Fire is just one more way to interrupt my sleep at night because knowing that we are never more than one good spark away from a major problem. The range itself is probably one of the safest places to be in the event of a fire. Having said that, let us be sure that none of us is responsible for starting any fires. Every member needs to be aware of where the fire hoses are located. Familiarize yourself with location, operation and how to use them. If you have any questions, please check with me, any RSO or any Board member. You will find that we are all happy to assist.

There seems to be a bit of confusion regarding the use of "Zombie" targets so let me clear it up in my always clear and concise manner! **YES you can use them! However, there are some limitations.** The target cannot look like me or anyone else such as a known political figure. They must also conform to the same size limitations the same as any other target. Additionally, target size for the short pistol range is increased to 12" x 12" rather than the posted 10 x 10. The slightly larger target should never have been a major problem, but it seems to have caused some controversy at times. All other short range rules apply.

I actually reached the ripe old age of 74 before deciding to grow a beard while on vacation this year. 

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.



JUNIOR CORNER

RULES TO LIVE BY

- 1. Treat every firearm as if it were loaded
- Never point your firearm at anything you don't intend to shoot
- **3. Keep** your finger straight and off the trigger until you intend to fire
- **4. Know** your target and the surroundings

If you hadn't noticed, summer is here. The hot weather has awakened all the warm weather creatures around the range. This includes rattle snakes and black widow spiders.

Though uncommon, rattlesnake bites do occur. So, have a plan in place for responding to any situation.

Carry a cell phone, hike or shoot with a friend who can assist in an emergency. Do not step or put your hands where you cannot see. Step ON logs and rocks, never over them, and be especially careful when climbing rocks or gathering firewood. Check out the area under and around benches and tables before taking a seat. In addition to the rattles snakes, we need to be on the look out for black widow spiders. Black widow spider bites can be dangerous, especially to young children and elderly people. Hospital treatment is sometimes needed, but fatal bites are rare. A black widow spider bite often is painful right away. There will be tiny puncture wounds at the bite site, with some local swelling. Wash the area well with soap and water. If there is no pain, or if the pain is mild, no special treatment is needed. After a bad bite, severe pain and muscle cramps can start in a couple of hours. Muscle cramps start in the area of the bite (often a hand or foot) and move towards the center of the body.

Because black widow spiders hide, you might not see them even if they're close by. Protect yourself in areas where they might live.

- Shake out your gardening gloves before putting them on. Shake out boots or shoes that you've stored in garages, basements, or sheds before putting them on.
- Always wear gloves when moving wood, reaching into wood piles, handling mulch, grabbing empty flower pots, etc.

BLACK POWDER NEWS

June Contest: No secrets, it was a hot one. Fourteen brave souls showed up to shoot rifle and eight showed up to shoot Pistol/Revolver. Our July and August contests promise to be equally warm. Please remember to hydrate during our summer shoots. Paramedics love to respond to hot sweaty heat cases, but they might draw the line at patients smelling like Sulfur and Brimstone.

Jr Muzzle Loading Program: Our second ever BP Jr program took place on July 9th. Again it was HOT so attendance was lighter than expected. We had seven juniors show up with their parents. The juniors got to shoot 13 round balls at a 25yd paper target with the best 10 rounds counted for score. The juniors got to shoot both a cap lock and a flintlock during the shoot. As a bonus, both the juniors and their parents had a chance to shoot steel silhouette targets as well. Lots of smiles seen all around. The next Jr Muzzle Loading date has not yet been set, so watch the newsletter for the next announcement.

Practical BP Accuracy

I planned to write quite a bit about this subject, but he deeper I get into the discussion, the more involved it gets. To start off the subject let me ask you, how accurate is your Black Powder rifle shooting round balls at 100 yds? We are talking about shooting from the bench accuracy now, not offhand. Is your 100 yd group larger or smaller than 6" in diameter ? I will make a bold statement here as say "almost" any currently available Black Powder round ball rifle is capable of shooting a 6" group at 100 yds from the bench with the following

qualifiers..... Qualifier one is you need decent sights that you can see over, or through, consistently. Most reproduction BP rifles have fixed or adjustable sights that are pretty poor. Some have wide blade front sights, some have narrow brass front sights, and some have bead front sights.

There is no universal answer to this problem because everybody has eyes are different. If you are vison challenged, don't be afraid to look at aftermarket sights that might better fit your unique vision problems.

It's really not that hard to buy and fit aftermarket sights. Most rifles have a pretty universal 3/8" dovetail for front and rear sights. After a quick mail order package and a little time with a cheap jewelers file, you could have a new, (and more accurate), "Look" down your barrel.

Qualifier number two is this: You have to be willing to test different powder loads, ball sizes, and patch thicknesses. Here is where the work really begins. For the purposes of testing, the rifle I will use is an old Thompson Center Hawkin rifle fitted with a replacement 1-70 twist Green Mountain round ball barrel. This rifle has been fitted with a 40 year old Thompson Center hood and globe front sight, and a Thompson Center vernier aperture rear sight.

More on this next month.

Tales From the Chronograph - Black Powder Edition vol. 1 Yes, I have a chronograph, and I am not afraid to use it. This will be a series where we can draw totally erroneous conclusions, from statically questionable data, to support whatever harebrained preconceived notion that we might have. Unless otherwise identified, all the published results are from a 32", 1-70 twist, 50 caliber, Green Mountain barrel using lead round balls.

OK. That was 45 balls, and the better part of a pound of powder to find out the following....
3f powder has more energy than 2f powder, Increasing patch thickness theoretically forms a better seal, which also increases velocity. Testing showed that as velocity increased, the Point Of Impact went up, and shifted to the left. That is, there was a diagonal line of impact points from the center of the target that climbed to the top left corner of the target as velocity increased.

75 grns 1750 fps

Why do we care ? Well round ball ballistics suck is the simple answer.

Supersonic RB behavior is predictable to a point, but, when a RB drops subsonic weird things happen. In the interest of accuracy we would like to keep the round ball supersonic all the way to the target.

Realistically that is not always possible for ranges beyond 100 yards.

More on that next time. To sign off I will leave you with a URL link to a round ball ballistic program. Not terribly accurate, but there is not the interest in refining the program like there is for modern projectiles....
