Some of you might have heard about or even seen the pelican who decided to call EF&GA home for a while. Someone shot the pelican.


THIS IS UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR!

Now Open at the Pistol Range – 5 yard, 7 yard and 10 yard Shooting Lanes

At the right side of the pistol Ramada, lanes 13 to 16, there are now target stands at 5, 7, and 10 yards.

The standard pistol target frame will be used. To ensure bullets hit the bank and to prevent ricochets and/or skips, the following conditions will apply to these shooting lanes. Signage will be posted reflecting these conditions.

5, 7, & 10 yard Target Rules
One Target per Frame
Maximum 10" Round or Square Target
Center Target on Cardboard
BULLETS MUST HIT BANK!!

All other pistol rules apply.

As noted, all other pistol rules apply. This includes, but not limited to, no holster draws, no rapid fire, no cross lane shooting, etc. Range Safety Officers will be observing closely to make sure this new addition is safe and fun for all members and their guests. We expect these new firing lines to be popular, therefore if you are shooting at 15 yards or longer please leave these lanes open.

HI-POWER RIFLE MATCHES

High-power rifle matches are held on the second Saturday of each month. Match start time is at 8:00 am. The Hi-Power Rifle Match has two separate courses of fire; a 100-yard 4-position match course and a 100-yard prone course. The 4-position match has prone, sitting, kneeling and offhand stages of fire. The prone course can use a front-end rest (ie: bipod) and the shoulder for a stock rest. Each match course consists of firing forty (40) rounds for score plus unlimited sighter rounds. Competitors may elect to participate in either or both matches. Entry fees are \$5.00 per competitor per match. Juniors under age 18 shoot free.

Any legal center-fire, cartridge-firing rifle, regardless of caliber or action, is acceptable. Competitors may use open (iron) sights or rifle scopes. Slings are allowed except in the offhand position. No artificial supports are allowed in the 4-position course. Hearing and eye protection are required.

The intent of the matches is to improve your skills and have fun while doing it. Call the match director listed in the newsletter or on the website if you need additional information.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF



hope you all had a Happy Thanksgiving. Christmas is just around the corner with a new year not far behind. Where did 2011 go?

At the December Christmas General Meeting, some lucky Range Safety Officer will win the "Savage" bolt action rifle in .308 Win., with an "Alpen" $4-12 \times 40$ mm scope and "NRA" rifle case. There will be a another prize as well; an "Alpen" $15-45 \times 60$ mm spotting scope. There may be a third prize as yet to be determined.

All Active Duty Range Safety Officers' are eligible to win. Active duty is defined as working one five hour shift per month (or more). Every shift worked during the past year gets one ticket in the "bucket" for the drawing. Good luck to all RSOs'.

You will see an addition to the Range Safety Office wardrobe; a red jacket with "EF&G Range Safety Officer" printed on the back and the Association logo on the front. The jackets will also have the appropriate shoulder patches and possibly a name tag.

By the time you read this, the pistol and 150 yard Ramada's will have had lights installed in the shooting bays. The lights will be on a "twist" timer and hopefully will help with the visibility under the roof. This does not mean that shooting after sunset is going to be allowed. *All shooting activities must stop at local sunset (Trap is the exception)*. *It is a lease and permit specification.*

There will be another addition to the Pistol Range by the time you read this or soon thereafter. There will be target butts installed at five, seven and ten yards in the last shooting bay. There are specific rules for the close range shooting. Target must be 10 inches maximum (10 inch maximum envelope size for more than one target) and centered in the 24 inch by 24 inch target backing. The target backing must be at the top of the target frame. No silhouettes allowed. The target placement is designed to keep bullets impacting the backstop. Also, check to make sure your bullets make it to the backstop. Some small caliber handguns will not make the backstop and skip into it, hopefully. If you are not going to use the last bay with the close in target butts, close range shooting, please set up in another bay keeping the close in shooting lanes open for those that wish to use them. The rules will posted.

My "What the?" for the month. For some unknown reason, there are a few members out there that are shooting up the facility. Everything but paper targets are in their sights. Think about it for a moment...you are shooting up your range. Flag poles, equipment, fence lines, etc., are being "holed". I know it may be tempting to shoot range stuff and the wildlife, but do not do it. It is not only unsafe and destructive but, in my opinion, dumb.

If you see anyone shooting up our range, please advise any Range Safety Officer, or contact me or any Board Member. I know it may sound like "squealing", but we all want to keep the Range. This foolish activity of shooting up the range could lead to the range being closed. We all do not want that!

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. One target recommended - two maximum. No political figures or likeness of any person living or dead. **Paper targets only.** Target backing cardboard size is approximately 24 x 24 inches at the top of the target frame. Please keep targets as far from the target frame uprights as possible.

Shooting anything but paper targets (except for sanctioned matches) will cause your membership to be revoked and possible banishment from the range for life. Shooting anything other than paper targets could result in the closure of the range.




