Junior Muzzleloading



Make Time to Attend a General Meeting







have a tendency to mention on a regular basis that there is a sign one passes upon entering through the main gate. It says STOP. If you do not stop, do not be surprised when an RSO requests that you return to the gate and practice the proper procedure!

Note: There will be a mandatory meeting for all RSOs on December 11th from 0900 to noonish. The meeting is a semi-annual meeting where we will try to cover a number of issues that arise. I am always trying to clarify rules and procedures that come up periodically. The more uniformly we inforce the association rules, the better we all will be. Please bring any discussion items with you. We will also be going over the sign-up procedures so bring with you a cell phone or whatever device you normally use.

Has anyone else noticed that the pistol range seems to be accumulating a lot of .22 cartridges? Granted, it is pretty hard to reload them and once fired many people seem to consider them to be worthless. Well a gum wrapper may be worthless also, but that doesn't mean you throw it on the ground. There are trash containers and there are also containers for spent cartridges. In fact, far from being worthless, spent brass of any kind has value. Any brass that is not reloaded can be sold for scrap....the money received goes into our youth fund. Neither trash nor your spend brass needs to be left on the ground!

When one looks at the range bulletin RSO calendar it looks as if an RSO is needed for virtually every time slot. Fortunately, the guys (and ladies) know that an open time slot means that all they need to do is to show up and assume the watch. It is not the most efficient method of covering the range, but it is all we have for now. Change is in the works in the near future. Stay tuned.

Gun owners were not particularly good at preventing state anti-gun legislation from being passed in November. I am hopeful that court action will reverse some of it, but this is California and fore-warned is fore-armed. Place you ammo orders early and quickly. Life for us who use the range on a regular basis is about to get sticky!

Life Member Nominations

Each year the Board of Directors may vote in up to two members to receive the honor of EF&GA Life Membership. This is an excerpt from the EF&GA bylaws:

Candidates for Life Membership shall have been Regular or Senior members of the Association for at least three years prior to their candidacy for Life Membership and must have performed "outstanding service" for the Association. This "outstanding service" must have been performed over a period of time and must consist of more than a single act. It must be of such a nature that it can be documented by the Committee for presentation to the Board of Directors. It is desirable that candidates have performed outstanding leadership such as an Officer or Board Member or Chairperson of the Association in a satisfactory manner.

If you know someone that you think meets the criteria and you feel strongly that he/she should be nominated, please write a letter to the nomination committee for consideration. Nominations must be submitted in writing before April 1st, 2017. Nominations may be submitted via e-mail to the Committee at LifeMembership@escondidofishandgame.com. That will pass it on to all of the committee members – Geoff Orchin, Ren Everett, and Ed Migdal.

Holiday Goodies

Each holiday season there are many people who receive something awesome from Santa, the Great Pumpkin, or an awesome wife/husband. If it is something that a shooter is not experienced with, he/she may need assistance operating it properly. If it is a firearm, start with the basics. Be positive that the ammunition matches the cartridge identified on the barrel of the firearm. If you are unsure about operation of a firearm, consider taking a class on its operation. There are many NRA certified instructors listed in this newsletter that could help direct you to an upcoming class. It would be cheap insurance to prevent possible issues. As we all know, improper operation of a firearm can not only cost a lot of money in repairs, it can cause serious injuries.

No Junior Pistol or Archery in December
Junior Pistol and Junior Archery are typically held on

the 4th Sunday of even numbered months (February, April, June, August, October, December). However, the 4th Sunday in December is the 25th. Because there is so much holiday travel and family plans we will not be holding these events on Christmas day.

The NMC event is are typically held on the 1st Sunday of the month. Due to the fact that the 1st Sunday in January is New Year's Day, the event is cancelled for January of 2017.

NRA Concealed Carry Class (1/28/2017 & 1/29/2017)

Please note that this two-day class will be held in January on Saturday (28th) and Sunday (29th). This is the NRA's most advanced class and students (adults 21+ who must have prior intermediate or greater experience/training in the safe use of, and legally be able to use handguns) will shoot their own handguns and ammunition. This class includes a full day on the range with exercises that provide increasing challenges through advanced drills that demonstrate principles of concealed carry, the draw, defensive shooting, movement, single, multiple and moving threats, use of barriers, and awareness of situations that may be encountered. The classroom session includes review of the course textbook, flashlight techniques with laser trainers, and other important information to compliment and reinforce the range sessions and the essentials of concealed carry. This class includes both the Basic and Advanced NRA Certificates upon successful completion.



How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


