I hate to keep harping on the same old thing, but the Board of Directors (BOD) and the Range Improvement Project committee needs your help!

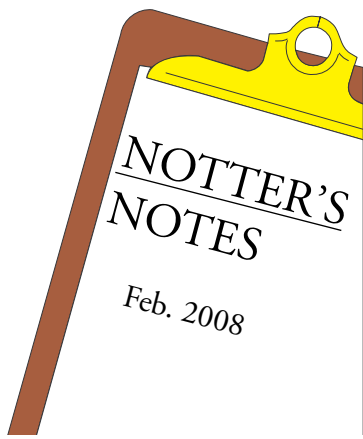

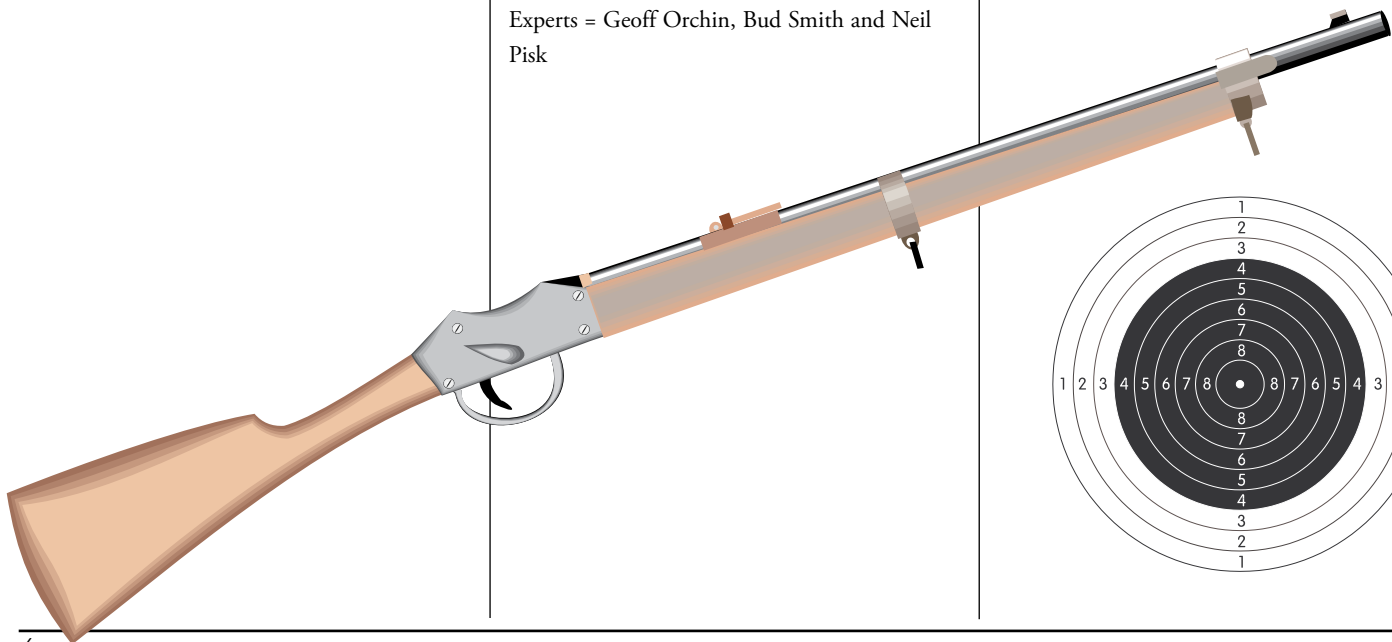

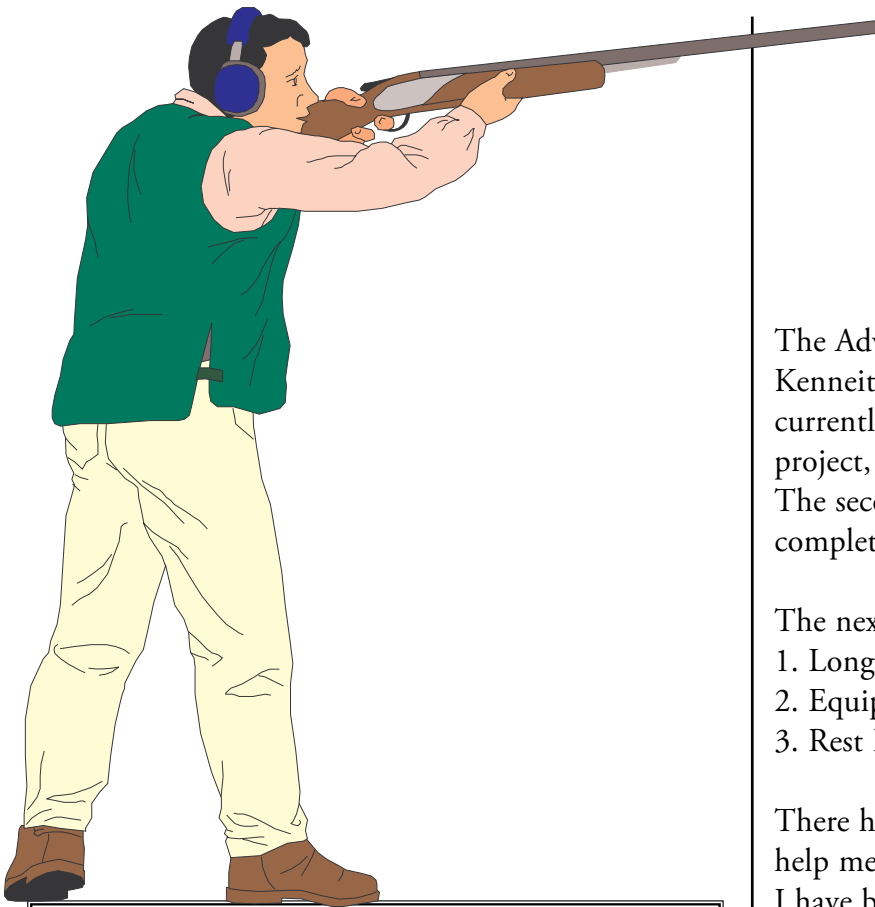

## **Range Enhancement Projects Currently in the Feasibility and Planning Phase**

The Advisory Committee, made up of Frank Alessio, Kenneth Notter, and myself, have four projects currently in the feasibility and planning stages. One project, (perimeter fence) has already been completed. The second project, (secondary entrance), will be completed by the time you read this article.

The next projects to be completed will be:

1. Long Distance Rifle Range.
2. Equipment Storage Building
3. Rest Rooms

There have been several people that volunteered to help me organize and head these projects. Up to now, I have been able to get the first two projects completed with the help of a few people and the Board of Directors.

As far as the three projects listed above, the following members have asked to serve on the committee: Ed Migdal, Lonnie Fowler, Smitty, Dave Ransberger, & Craig Rogers.

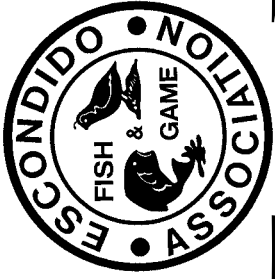
It is my intention to gather information and then meet with the committee so we can move forward. We need carpenters, electricians, plumbers, and some with strong backs.

We will be completing these projects under my General Contractor Status and Performance bond for the permitting process.

The other two major projects to be completed under the lease agreement, (Pistol Range Enhancements and the Trap Ramada) are being planned by others.

### **Escondido Fish & Game Trapshooting Etiquette**

1. Make your entry far enough in advance, so that the office can properly process it. Clubs want shoots to start on time, but they can't if shooters don't sign up enough in advance so that squadding and record keeping can be done.
2. Be ready when your squad is called and also when it is your turn to shoot in the squad.
3. Do not lean over each time to pick a shell out of a box on the ground, or to pick up empties. Have your shells where you don't have to stoop to get them.
4. Do not raise your gun until the shooter ahead of you fires.
5. Remain at your post until the 5<sup>th</sup> man has fired, then move to the next position at the end of the round. Stand facing the traps until the last man has fired the last shot. If you are leadoff, do not fire until all squad members are in position after each change.
6. Never load your gun before changing positions. When going from position 5 to position 1, turn to the right to avoid bumping guns with the man coming from post 4.
7. Load only one shell at a time except in doubles. Close the gun only when it is your turn to shoot. If a delay occurs, remove the shell.
8. Do not let ejected shells from your gun hit or annoy other shooters.
9. Do no unnecessary talking when you are on the firing line. When you are not on the firing line, keep your voice down when you are around other squads which are shooting.
10. Time your shooting to establish rhythm in the squad. Call in a loud clear voice so there is no confusion about when the puller should respond.
11. Be a sportsman at all times. Be sure your competitors get what is due them, but do not be a target claimer.
12. Observe safety rules. Do not point your gun at another, even if it is unloaded. On the firing line, always keep your gun pointed toward the ground or the trap houses.
13. Shooters are always willing to have you look at their guns, if you ask permission first. Do not pick up another's gun from the gun rack and handle it without asking.

# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Hi all, vacation is over. Time to get up and get the job done. Here is the new Range master volunteer requirement. In order to qualify for an invitation to the annual Range Master Appreciation Day festivities, all Range Masters will be required to stand a minimum of forty eight (48) duty hours per year. Come on, think about it. That's only four (4) hours a month on average. See, that isn't so bad, is it? Range master Appreciation Day will be by invitation only this year. The invitations will go to the Range masters who have completed their forty eight hour requirement, which will be based on tabulations from the green sign in/out sheets at the ranges. Please remember to sign in/out each time you are on duty in order to get credit for the time. Also remember to sign up for Range master duty in the scheduling books located in the Trap Ramada.

**Range masters:** Please remember that there are many projects going on around the property. Sometimes this will require a range to be shut down for an hour or two. This work is vital to the safety and well being of the entire membership. Please explain to any casual shooters that the work will be completed as quickly as possible and thank them for their cooperation and understanding.

As most of you know by now, the lead miners were not able to do their work due to the backstops being too wet too mine. We will have to reschedule them to come back at a later date when the hill is dried out.

**Members:** Many of you have been using paper targets which portray the image of a real person, living or deceased. Please refrain from the use of these types of targets as it sometimes offends other members using the range.

New target frame designs are now being worked on. These new designs, and your cooperation, (target placement) should make the new frames last a little longer. This Association has spent quite a bit of money over the past year repairing and replacing target frames. Common sense is the key. Do not place targets over the wood parts of the frame. Do not use association target frames for shotgun patterning boards. Make sure all targets are centered on the cardboard and spaced so a miss will still not hit the wood frame.

The slogan for 2008 is; "Remember Operation Range Pride". Keep your range clean and neat. Police your shooting space immediately after you've finished shooting. Please place trash, brass and cigarette/cigar butts in the proper receptacles.

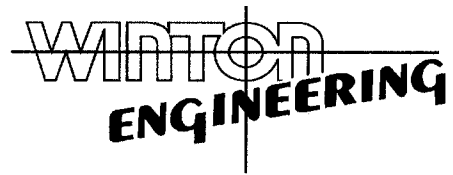

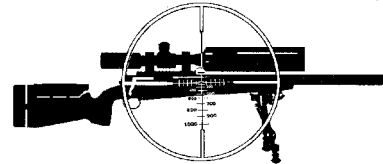

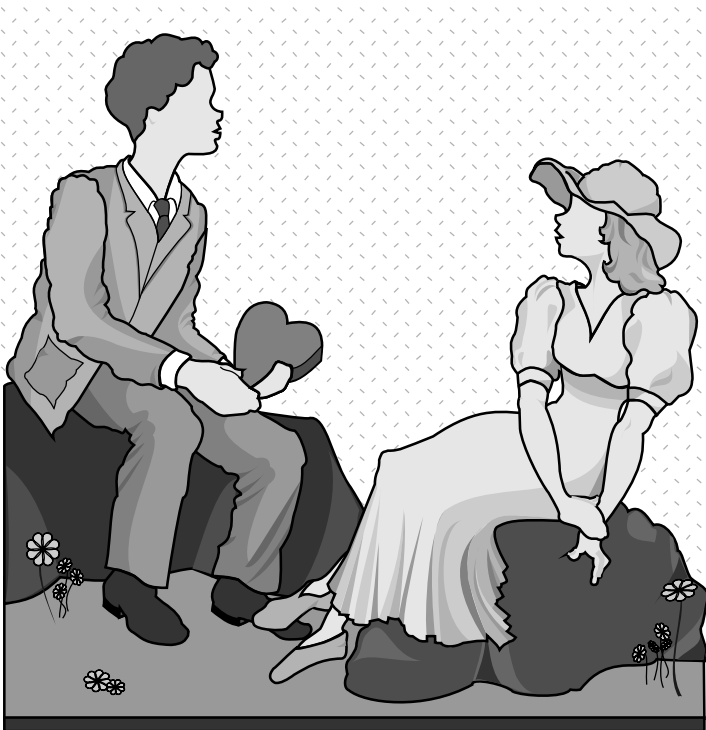
