■<u>PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE</u>

Dear Members,

By now, you should have your feet on the ground and running. Here's hoping this year will be good to all of us. Recently the Board of Directors met and discussed our expenditures and


operational needs for the coming years. A careful evaluation and analysis of the past five years of income and expenditures revealed we should consider an increase in our dues. The last dues increase was in July of 2004. I know this creates some deep concerns, where we are going. All of us are being impacted by the economy, gas prices, utilities and food cost in particular. Believe me; it has affected all of us. It was the BOD decision to raise the dues 50% (i.e., Annual dues from \$100 to \$150.).Let's look at it from a different perspective. When you break it down to a monthly basis, it would be a little over \$4.00 a month. The Senior rate would be just over \$1.60 a month. Granted, every little bit counts.

Although a dues increase is not desirable, it is a matter of necessity. As we all know from family and business finances, if the dollars coming in don't cover the dollars going out, you run a deficit. That can only lasts so long. If the money runs out, you can't pay the bills and things collapse quickly. Same holds true for our association. None of us want to see adverse things happen to our great organization, so we all need to share the burden and help ensure that EF&GA is around for a long time. Increasing the dues will help balance the budget and ensure you all have a place to shoot and enjoy great comraderie in the future. The BOD thanks you for your understanding.

I recently attended a meeting involving the new range ordinances for San Diego County Ranges. You the members can be extremely proud of our representatives, Kurt Nelson (chairman), Neil Pisk and Denny Martin. These three members have done nothing less than excellent in presenting proposals to Supervisor Bill Horn's office and the San Diego



Range Officers and Members,

My hopes are up for the New Year. Two new Range Officers signed up and another will be ready next month. As many of you know, we are conducting an RSO class on March 21, 2009 at the clubhouse from 8-5pm, cost \$50.00. This class is for Range Officers interested in becoming NRA certified RSO's and have committed to an active work schedule of 60+ hours a year (12 five hour shifts equals one shift per month). 15 Range Officers have signed up for the class. If you are interested in becoming a RSO, there may still be time. Call FrankAlessio or me after you read this information. If you miss this class, another will be scheduled in 3 or 4 months. Approximately 75% of our active Range Officers are currently NRA RSO certified. This is important for insuring a safe range experience and also helps out on the insurance costs. In a nutshell it's about SAFETY, SAFETY, SAFETY- the more trained Range Officers; the better it is for all our members. My goal is to have all Shoot Chairs and Range Officers become NRA RSO certified by the end of 2009. Shoot Chairs with questions; please call me or Neil Pisk for clarification.

More and more members are remembering to sign in and out on the green sheets. It's a rule and everyone, members and guests must comply. A note to Shoot Chairs: All Shoot Chairs must use our green sign in sheet at their shoots and require all shooters to fill in their names. If the shooter is not a member he or she must still sign in and out. If the Shoot Chair keeps his own documentation, that is good but he must also complete the association green sheet. Simply, it is a liability for our association.

Members are now showing their EF&GA ID when a Range Officer approaches. This is great. Yes, that means more are reading and following the rules. Remember, members must have a picture ID and Association ID on their person while on the range. NEVER give the gate combination to ANYONE.

Sunday February 15th- the day all members need to remember. Whoops! Yes, it's a work party. Bring rake, gloves, hat, and be here at 8am. We need more than the usual 13 that always show up. The more members helping out, the sooner we get done. Hot dogs and burgers to follow.

Weekends, yikes!! We still need Range Officers to fill Saturday and Sunday positions. It may look like we are covered but the Shoot Chairs are busy running their events and the gate is open.
