Hello Everyone,

I will start out by letting you know the progress on the Range Enhancement Project.

The concrete has been tested for the Structural engineer. I do not know the results yet, but feel quite confident. The Electrical Engineer met with us and has all that he needs to complete his design. The Architect only has to design

the rest rooms and address the list of corrections provided by the County for plan check. Once these designs are complete, we can re-submit to acquire a permit. When a permit is issued, we can have the Electrical Distribution inspected and finalized. At that time we can have SDG&E install the final stage and meter.


The Septic situation is still under review. We had holes drilled to test the level of ground water to determine the possibility of installing leech lines in lieu of having the tank pumped regularly. The results before this recent rain were the water level is at 10 ft. I believe the Dept. Of Health is looking out for our best interest in the long run.



PROCEDURE FOR LOST AND FOUND, GUNS / SCOPES

Procedure for securing lost guns, scopes or **expensive items** found on the range: All other items such as shirts, hats, etc should be stored in the lost and found container located in the meeting hall or trap ramada. (permanent location in the club house to be determined)

- If a Range Officer is on duty pass the equipment to the RO with detail of when and where you found the gun or equipment.
- If a RO is not on duty secure the items and immediately call from the Trap ramada or cell phone: Denny Martin (President) 760-685-2886 or Kurt Nelson (VP) 760-745-2640 or Bud Smith (CRSO) 858-922-6489. Leave a message in detail concerning the items you found to include make, model, time and location found. Leave your name and contact information, telephone number and time of call.
- At this point take the item or items home with you if a RO is not on duty.
- You will be contacted by one of the three members you called and he will instruct you on returning the items.
- The officer of the association will then email the entire BOD, CRSO and Kenneith Notter and pass on the information. Kenneith will place a notice in the bulletin under the lost and found section.





RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Range Officer and Members,

Sunday, February 14th 2010 is a special day all men must remember. This special day should be spent with the lady in your life, that being you wife, mother, girlfriend, etc. Make this a special day for the women you love and do something unique for her. Buy her a gun, a ring, some perfume or flowers. Make reservation to her favorite restaurant or go to a movie. Treat her like a Queen, she deserves it. Whatever you do, <u>DON'T leave her HOME ALONE.</u> Now, some range business.

Many of our members have come to realize the job of the Range Officer is the most important position on the range and one deserving respect. It is also a tough job that requires patience, knowledge and an individual with a special attitude and thirst for helping others. Many of our members have learned how to help our range officer by following our range rules. Many have taken the extra step and purchased a lanyard and holder to hang around their neck to display their association ID Card. This gesture is appreciated by all our officers. I know this because they have told me. Thank you all. Taking it up another notch, I would appreciate another step to help our range officers. This is our situation: As you all know members receive a discounted price to participate in sanctioned shoots whether it's Cowboy, Combat, Trap, Black powder, Small bore, etc. When you sign up for a shoot please show you club ID card. Every time you purchase a new trap punch card please show your club ID card. By taking this extra step you will make the shoot chairs day and lessen his administrative function resulting in more time to participate in what you like best, shooting. Thanks, in advance.

True or False: You arrive at the 150 yard range and the first thing you do is safely unload your gun. <u>FALSE</u> **Answer:** you wait for the gate to close then proceed to a range and sign in.

The sun just went down but the sky is still light so it is ok to shoot until it is dark. <u>FALSE</u> **Answer:** when the sun drops from sight it's time to stop shooting. Please clean up your brass and sign out before you leave the range. Legal shooting hours end at sunset.

Your son in law and his three kids are down from Seattle and want to shoot at the range. You call a Board Member or Chief Range Officer, explain the situation and request permission to bring more than two guests.

TRUE Answer: the board member or CRSO will give you permission and instructions via e-mail. This written document should be presented to the range officer on duty.

You are shooting on the pistol range and you notice the shooter on your right is bouncing bullets off the ground and they are not impacting the backstop. You should leave the range to search for a range officer to address the member. <u>FALSE</u> **Answer:** Lots of answers but the first to mind is immediately call a cease fire. In a quiet friendly manner explain to the member why you called a cease fire and explain how to remedy the problem by raising the position of the target on the frame.

50 Range Officers is sufficient to cover all our shifts. <u>FALSE</u> **Answer:** We do have 50 Range Officers but we need 100 to cover this range. Please join our elite team. We will train you and we offer on the job training. Only you can help.

Please let me know if questions like these are helpful. If the response is favorable I will continue to come up with true/false situations. I have numerous actual range situations to share.
