#### Hello Everyone,

For those of you who are wondering how we survived during the heavy rains, I am happy to say that after all the work we did, the water flowed through very well. The range was perfectly accessible during and after the rain.

Regarding the Range Enhancement Project, we finally have a permit. It wasn't without dramatics at the end but


after making three trips to the county, we were finally successful. Now that the project is in our control, we can proceed at a much faster pace. We only have to shore up the foundation on the outside edge and some minor electrical cleanup inside the building and that should be it. SDG&E will make the power transfer next Wednesday the 26th of January.

The positive things about this ordeal is that we will have a well of much larger capacity, a septic system that eliminates most of the waste disposal fees, and an approved hydrology study that will enable us to build additional structures in the future if the need arises. For now, I would like to see us take a break and let the funds build back up in our account.

We do have three Eagle Scout projects planned in the near future. Depending on the costs and board approval, one scout wants to build a bridge over the drainage ditch between the picnic tables for better access when we have major events. The second scout has agreed to purchase and install safety bollards around the septic system and the new storage facility. The third scout is working on a proposal to install a cedar fence around the back of the building where we store materials not frequently used to make it look better.

I would like to thank the entire membership for being patient with me on this project. It hasn't been any easier for me than it has for you.


A Judge has stopped implementation of this law saying it was "too vague". The state will appeal and the legislature will undoubtedly attempt to "fix it".

# R A N G E M A S T E RS O U N DO F F

Many of you will have noticed the "big" sand bullet trap past the 25 yard line on the Pistol Range. Ed Migdal and Denny Martin completed this improvement that will trap, stop or at least drain-off the energy from the bullets going down range. Ed and Denny finished up Tuesday, 04 January. The following Thursday evening, 06 January, Scott Kendall, Norm Porst and I walked down to check the bullet trap. We noted several little trenches in the sand. Scott dug into the backside of one of the trenches a couple of inches and retrieved the spent bullet. It looked to a .45 caliber full metal jacket.

The sand trap appears to have worked as planned. This does not mean we can relax our attitude about knowing what your target is and what is behind it. What the tracks in the sand mean is that some shooters are still not paying attention to what is behind their target and where their bullets are really going. We stress this over and over and I will repeat it again, make sure your bullets are making it to the back stop. Do not rely on the sand trap.

In Januarys' Sound-Off, it was announced that we would be unveiling what promises to be a helpful and informative new program for the RSO Corps and general membership at the January 13 General Meeting. This new program is a dedicated web site for EG&GA Range Safety Officers; www.efgarso.org. There are only a few places that require log-in, other than those few, the site is open to anyone with internet access.

The site contains: a description of what it is to be a Range Safety Officer, RSO Dailey Duties, Active Duty RSO's and CRSO's (login required), Incident Report Master, Range Rules, Casual Shooting Rules, photos of this years' Range Master Appreciation Day, the December Meeting RSO Give-away and more. There is a Sound-Off (blog) section that will be open soon. Log-in and passwords will be for Active Duty Range Safety Officers' and Chief Range Safety Officers' and will be available in the near future.

We want to give a big thank you to Jay Zimmett, our web master. Jay designed the site and put it all together. We also, want to thank Lee Allen and Bud Smith for helping pull this project together. Visit the RSO internet site and check it out. We welcome comments and suggestion.

Range Safety Tip of the Month. When a cease fire has been called, firearms have their actions open, chamber clear, magazines, clips, etc., empty and removed if applicable. An "Open/Clear Chamber Indicator" in place is preferred. Firearm placed on the shooting bench with the muzzle pointing down range. When all firearms are in the safe condition, and all shooters and guests are behind the yellow line, the range is said to be "Cold". Only then does anyone move down range.

We all know this, but many RSO's have noted that some shooters are becoming careless in this regard. Let's all be safe out there.
