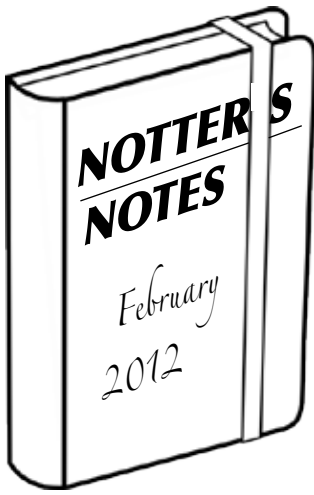

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Another major holiday season has come to pass and I hope you all had a fruitful year. During this past year we have seen many positive changes at the range and there are more to come. If you have any ideas about how to continue to improve the Association, please send a note to me or any Board of Directors' member. We are always interested in hearing your views and comments, that is how we continue to move forward.

I would like to discuss targets and their placement since there seems to be much confusion regarding this matter. The published rule for target placement is: "One target recommended - two maximum. No political figures or likeness of any person living or dead. Paper targets only. Target backing size is approximately 24 x 24 inches and affixed to the top of the target frame. Please keep your paper targets as far from the target frame as possible".

On the pistol and rifle ranges, one is target recommended - two maximum. If using two targets, center them on the target backing - Vertically preferred. Check to make sure that bullets will impact the backstop. This can be done by taking aim at the lower target, if two are used, move off the target frame keeping the same horizontal position, shoot one round and see where the bullet impacts. If the bullet does not impact the backstop, do something to make it impact the backstop or do not shoot, please.

As noted in my January Sound-Off, there are special considerations for targets and placement for "the five, seven and ten yard distances. The target must be 10 inches square or round maximum (10 inch maximum overall size for more than one target) and centered on the 24 inch by 24 inch target backing material. The target backing must be at the top of the target frame. **No silhouettes allowed.** Target placement is designed to keep bullets impacting the backstop. Also, check to make sure your bullets make it to the backstop".

Setting the target(s) in this manner will assure impacting the back stop and keep from hitting the target frame. Please keep targets as far from the target frame as possible. It is quite obvious that the target frames are taking a beating and we use way too many target frames. There are only a few volunteer members that make and repair target frames and we are getting tired of making and repairing them due to inconsiderate members shooting up the frames and range.

Regarding targets: A single sheet of "paper" that may have multiple bulls-eyes is considered one target. It must conform to the above statements. As always, if in doubt about targets, check with the on-duty Range Safety Officer. Sometimes, there are exceptions to any rule.

Also, the sand "speed bumps" placed in front of the 15 yard, 25 yard and 35 yard lines are meant to trap errant bullets. They are not to be used for target shooting backstops and for holding the target frames. Please stay off the sand piles.

My "What the?" for the month. Those of you out there that smoke, please use the green disposal containers. Those of you out there that are not paying attention, **the green cigar/cigarette disposal containers are not for discarding bullets.** We have already had one bullet "cook off" in one of the green containers and fortunately no one was injured. Use the red cylinders located one each range for bullet disposal. Using the green "butt" cans for bullet disposal (and maybe a practical joke) is just plain dumb.

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. Use the red cylinders, generally located by the kiosks, on each range for bullet disposal. Use the green "butt" cans for cigar/cigarette disposal, not bullet disposal
