

Meet More EF&GA Members


When I first became a member of EF&GA I was interested in shooting lots of pistol and a little rifle. I came up to the range on my days off from work and did some casual shooting with some friends but not


JR. CORNER

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

here are constantly reports, filed to my in-box, filed by one RSO or another, regarding the use of ammunition that attracts a magnet. Folks, this ammo is strictly forbidden on our range. I have given the reasons many times, but for now the best reason is that our RSOs are directed to have it removed from the Range immediately. Each Duty RSO carries a magnet and can test any suspicious ammo at will. Each shooting bench has a magnet on it so you can check it yourself if you have any question about it. RSOs are also directed to file a contact report any time this ammo is found on our Range.

All of our RSOs are given first-aid training as quickly as possible and we hold regular classes to keep their training updated. While on duty a well-stocked first-aid kit is provided for them. Each duty RSO is expected to have a kit on their person or near-by such as in the cart at all times. Certainly, we keep well stocked kits in the meeting hall, but that may not be close enough and sometimes time is of the essence. Believe it or not there are many ways to hurt oneself on the range. For example, one might release the safety on one's shotgun while one's finger is on the trigger. Severe bleeding might occur to a finger from the unexpected recoil. Two lessons might be learned in such a case: 1. always keep your finger off the trigger until one is ready to engage the target. 2. be sure to have a first-aid kit close at hand. In case you are wondering we have had two such incidents over the holidays and yes, fortunately the first-aid kits were close at hand.


You may see other references to Range Security in this bulletin, but it is important for the general membership to always keep it in mind. Range safety and range security are the responsibility of each and every member and not just the RSOs, Board members etc. We have had too many break-in instances lately that might easily have been avoided by paying closer attention to open windows and unlocked doors. Last man out needs to make certain the doors and windows are securely locked. If you are not sure whether you are the last one out, lock them anyway!

Speaking of locks, the main door to the Trap Ramada will now be locked at all times with a number punch combination lock. Any member can access the Ramada with the same combination used for the Meeting Hall.

Rule review:

The two best ways for me and our RSOs to draw the ire of some of our members is to have to remind them that: 1. each member is only allowed two guests unless they have received **prior written approval from our Secretary Geoff Orchin.** Without it extra guests will be requested to leave whether they are shooting or not. The situation can easily be remedied by simply checking with Geoff first. 2. Junior shooters are always welcome on the Range; however they must always be under the direct supervision of a responsible adult. **Direct Supervision does not mean that the adult is also shooting 10-15 feet away! 3. Silhouette targets are allowed on all ranges except the short pistol range.** However, they must fit within the 24" x 24" background. And they must not depict any known personage. Fortunately I do not know of any that look too much like me!



Energy Efficiency Improvements Coming Soon

Everyone's electric bill is steadily going up as SDG&E has been increasing the price per kilowatt as well as charging additional surcharges for the privilege of having each kilowatt delivered to your electrical meter. EF&GA has the same problem on a larger scale.

In order to combat this problem and reign in the costs we have worked with SDG&E and their partner company (Willdan Energy Solutions) to find grant programs to make the range more efficient.

We will be upgrading most of the lighting (indoor as well as outdoor) to products that last longer and use less electricity. We expect the installation to happen during the first quarter of 2016.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title - This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
