
Kudos

C Let's Be Well Regulated I was having a discussion with a family member recently and I was informed that the Second Amendment intentionally contains the words *well regulated* and that was a good reason to restrict our rights to keep and bear arms. As we all know, a person with a firearm is far more dangerous if he/she does not know how to handle or operate it safely. If you are trained, effective and ready then you know how to operate and handle your firearm safely, you have practiced to the point where you can hit targets with it, and you are familiar enough with it that you can use it without having to re-learn how to use it every time that you pick it up. Safe firearm handling as well as effective marksmanship are perishable skills. In order to remain *well regulated*, we all need to practice and teach others around us so that they can be *well regulated* as well.

Blue Light Specials Coming Soon

In order to eliminate some of the confusion regarding our range safety lighting we will be making some changes. Within the next sixty days the red lights at the pistol, 100 yard and 150 yard ranges will be changed to blue. Simply put, blue means cold as in cold range. If the lights are on, the range is cold. All cold range rules apply when the blue lights ore on. To make it even easier, when the blue lights are on remember these three main points.

- No unloading or handling of guns or gear.
- The area between the yellow and red lines is a NO man's land.
- Targets are placed and retrieved at this time.



We here are highly dedicated to our four safety rules:


<u>**Treat**</u> every firearm as if it were loaded.

he holidays are finally over. I hope that Santa brought you the new toy that you have been drooling over. I also trust that you read all the operating instructions before bringing it to the range and loading up. Believe it or not there were a few times recently, on the pistol range, where I had to instruct a new user on how to get the pointy end of the bullet facing toward the front of the gun. Just keep in mind that even your favorite Range Chief had to learn how to properly operate a firearm at one point in his long and illustrious history. Do not be embarrassed to ask questions, sign up for a course and practice, practice, practice. Good shooting technique comes easier to some, more so, than others, but it is a perishable skill. Also remember that in their infinite wisdom, our legislators have decreed that ammunition should be available to you in limited supply. Take heed and act accordingly.

March 18th from 0900 to approximately 1300 will be our next first aid class. If your card is two years old or close to it you need to renew your certification. I urge all RSOs to check your cards and sign up ASAP if you need to renew. We need to order materials well in advance of that date and you must be registered in order to attend. General membership is welcome to attend, but only if not enough RSOs have signed up. Use the email above to request a seat in the class.

February 18th is the date reserved for the next NRA certified RSO class. This class is designed to get any new RSOs fully certified to NRA standards. As you are no doubt aware, EF&GA has its own RSO certification program, but it only qualifies you for duty on the EF&GA range. Be ready to upgrade your skills from 0800 to about 1300. Do not waste any time letting me know if you wish to attend. As always we need time to order class materials. Any chiefs who need "class time" are welcome to assist also. Please mark your calendars.

I get a lot of calls from new members asking how to find hours to complete their six hours of volunteer time. Beside range cleanups there are numerous opportunities to get your time in. Many of the "Junior Events" are always in need of additional coaches. Don't worry if you have not coached before. You will be given plenty of instruction and there is even a special training class that you may wish to attend.

As I mentioned recently, RANGE SAFETY is not just keeping your firearm pointed in a safe direction. It encompasses a whole range of issues that includes situational awareness and safe firearm handling. I prefer to think of it as a MIND SET. You will be as safe as you choose to be and there is room for neither carelessness nor error.


NRA Home Defense class (2/11/2017).

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class (3/4/2017)

Ammunition has plentifully come back to the market but we will soon be dealing with additional complications when we attempt to purchase ammunition in the stores as well as the elimination of online purchases due to the new laws in California. Besides the availability concerns, are you getting the accuracy and precision that you and your rifle are capable of? The opportunity to learn reloading techniques that will allow you to produce timely, consistent, accurate ammunition while receiving NRA certified reloading instruction is available on March 4th, 2017.

The First Part is strictly academic in structure and conducted at the EF&GA meeting hall. This session will begin at 8:00 AM on Saturday, Mar 4th, 2017 and will last until approximately 12 noon.

The Second Part is a "Hands On" reloading bench experience. This session generates the practical, detailed experience necessary while you successfully complete a number of your personal reloads. Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session. The cost is two tiered:

TRAP CORNER

Puller Appreciation

When you show up and shoot a round of trap, 5-stand, or pot, the puller is behind you keeping score. In reality, the puller does a lot more than just press the button to make the machine throw clay birds. At the start of each game the puller makes sure that the participants all have proper eye and ear protection and that there is no wildlife downrange. While keeping score, he or she is constantly scanning the hillside for wild turkeys, hawks, owls, deer, coyotes, and even the occasional human. He or she works closely with the Trap Master to be sure that the participants are behaving safely and that the events run smoothly with minimal interruptions. The puller also makes sure that the trap machines are stocked with clay birds and are operating properly so that we don't have to stop in the middle of a game to fill the machines. The next time that you are out shooting a round of trap, take a second or two to thank the puller.


Gate Fee for Shotgun Events (4/1/2017)

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as gualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


