### PRESIDENT'S VIEWPOINT

Hello Everyone,

Happy New Year! Hope everyone is doing well and has a chance to spend some time with family and friends during the holidays.

The Range Enhancement Project is moving along quite well. We had a courtesy inspection from the County of the underground electrical and it passed. We also received


approval of the fire sprinkler system in the new shed from the Fire Marshall. We are also making progress on the Architectural, Structural, Electrical, and Civil Engineering designs. This is the period of time during a project that a project manager feels he has lost control but really hasn't. It's all in the hands of the Engineers at this point.

I want everyone to know that when I went out to get bids for the fire sprinkler system in the new building, the bids were coming in at \$10 to \$12k. When I contacted Bob Bradshaw, of Bradshaw Engineering, a long time member of our Association, things happened rather quickly. He submitted a design to the Fire Marshall and installed the system right away. When I asked him for a cost estimate, he said he wanted to do this for the club. It was his way of contributing. Now that's a contribution! We all need to thank Bob when we see him.

In order to achieve the specifications of 240 gallons per minute at 40 psi for the sprinkler system, we have to install a 10,000 gallon water storage tank and a 7 ½ horsepower pump. We will install the tank within the next week and Bob Bradshaw has volunteered to finish the installation of the pump when it arrives. This gives us sprinkler capability for one hour which is what is required.

In closing, I would like to thank all of you who gave generously to our campaign for Toys for Tots this year. As you will see in another article in this newsletter, we were very successful again this year.


### "TOYS FOR TOTS"



### RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Good Day All. I thought I would put words on paper or electronic bytes, whichever way you receive your monthly news letter again and give 'poor old Bud' a rest.

You all are probably aware that we had a break-in recently and nothing of value was stolen; however, they did do a lot a damage. Denny Martin's message last month covered this well and I am sure the rumor mill has filled-in a lot of blanks.

Reminder, when entering the property, you must press the "#" key first, then enter the numbers that open the gate. Drive through and please wait for the gate to close behind you. Also, please wait for the gate to close when leaving.

Please do not move target frames between ranges. I continue to find that 7' 6" frames for the pistol and 100 yard ranges moved to the 150 yard range. Using the tall frames will allow bullets to clear the top of the back-stop/burm. Bullets leaving the area are not a very good thing to consider. We did have one not to bright bulb ride his mountain bike down the hill behind the 150 yard range, onto the 100 yard range and he did not hear the load booms. We must pay close attention to our surroundings while we are at the facility. You never know what you may see.

I read in the 'California Rifle and Pistol Association's Firing Line' monthly publication the statement from our Governor as to why he signed AB962, the ammunition restriction legislation. I have included portions of it here for you information and I think we all can see what a load of B.S. it is.

### "To the members of the California State Assembly:"

"I am signing Assembly Bill 962. This measure would require vendors of handgun ammunition to keep a log of information on handgun ammunition sales, store ammunition in a safe a secure manner, and require face-to-face transfer of ammunition sales." (My comment – name, address, thumb print and photo identification. Ammunitions stored an area inaccessible to the customer. No internet sales allowed).

"Although I have previously vetoed legislation similar to this measure, local governments have demonstrated that requiring ammunition vendors to keep records on ammunition sales improves public safety. These records have allowed law enforcement to arrest and prosecute persons who have no business possessing firearms and ammunition; gang members, violent parolees...Utilized properly, this type of information is invaluable for keeping communities safe and preventing dangerous felons from committing crimes with firearms."

"Moreover, this type of record keeping is no more intrusive for law abiding citizens than similar laws governing pawnshops or the sale of cold medicine. Unfortunately, even the most successful local program is flawed; without a statewide law, felons can easily skirt the record keeping requirements of one city by visiting another. Assembly Bill 962 will fix this problem by mandating that all ammunition vendors in the state keep records on ammunition sales. As Governor, I have sought the appropriate balance between public safety and the right to keep and bear arms. I have signed important public safety measures to regulate the sale and transfer of .50 caliber rifles, instituted the California Firearms License Check program, and promoted the use of microstamping technology in handguns. I have also vetoed many pieces of legislation that sought to place unreasonable restrictions and burdens on firearms dealers and ammunition vendors. Assembly Bill 962 reasonably regulates access to ammunition and improves public safety without placing undue burdens on consumers. For these reasons, I am pleased to sign this bill."

### AB 962 is slated to go into effect February 1, 2011.

My comments are extensive and I will not bore you with them, but this bill is a load of crapola. I recall that there is a 50 round per month limit on purchases. The transfer between private persons limited to 50 rounds, more than 50 requires a vendor license, no more bringing your kids or grandkids out for a day .22 shooting.) Oh, and prices will go up. Internet, catalog sales of ammunition will be banned. It is already unlawful for persons prohibited from possessing firearms to obtain or possess ammunition. We all know that gun control, no matter how warped, does not lower or stop crime.






