Hello Everyone,

This month I have great news! Last Wednesday, I received a call from the County Project Manager asking me to bring the copies of the revised Hydrology Study down to him so he could review it. It was short notice but I did not hesitate to respond and motored on down there. He reviewed the revised study and stated that he would stamp our plans when we bring them in. In other words, he has approved the study and we can now actually pull the permit and move on. We had the Civil Engineers re-survey the creek to show the deeper depth than they previously indicated on their studies. This really paid off because

the creek is much deeper than the FEMA studies of 1982.

We had a work party this month and almost forty people showed up in the pouring rain to help out. We repaired shooting benches, tore down the overhang on the last shed, put deck screws in the boards for our long fence, and cleaned up the broken clay birds and wads. Somewhere in this newsletter, their names should be posted and those who could not make it should take time to thank these people.

We also built a fence around the surge tank in the campground as well as placed the fire rings. This was an Eagle Scout project and it went just fine. Thanks to those who came to my aid.

We also ran the water line and electrical conduit to the 150 yard range. Thanks to John Johnson for excavating, Mark Pederson, as well as Craig Rogers for doing the plumbing.

All this was achieved by volunteers including the Project Manager that I am doing.

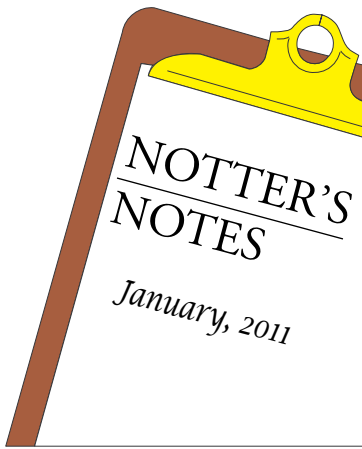
If someone tells you that we do not have enough volunteers doing the work up there, have them read this article.

U.C.S.D. SHOOTING CLUB

APPLESEED PROGRAM

The Board of EF&GA expedited approval of a One Day Appleseed for the Shooting Club of U.C.S.D. held on December 15, 2010. Nine students (including Julian, a foreign exchange student from France), two of their fathers, and four others attended. Kurt Nelson served as the RM. The morning opened overcast and drizzly, but the rain predicted to start mid-afternoon held off. The targets were set next to the berm on the 150 yard range, with the firing line being 25 meters back, so there was weather exposure.

First was the introduction, then a safety briefing, then the line commands to be used, then direction re. squib, fail to fires, hot brass, etc., then retrieve rifles from cars and to the line. The morning Redcoat target was the first to be shot, to evaluate the shooter's starting ability. Instruction proceeded point by point with shooting in between.

At lunch, some history of the Revolutionary War was told, the 'Three Strikes', with the first two flaming out, but the third lit and burnt brightly and the war was in earnest.

After lunch, two AQT's were shot (Army Qualification Target) producing three Riflemen, shooting scores of 210 or above of a possible 250. Then the closing 'Redcoat Target' was shot to show the relative improvement from the morning's starting target. EVERYBODY IMPROVED!!! **Kurt shot the Redcoat and cleaned it**

We have a new member to our Range Safety Officer Corps – Mr. Richard MacInnes. He completed his on-the-job training early in December and will be at the Range. Welcome Richard when you meet him.

For a very long time now we have written about, talked about and worried about bullets skipping on the various ranges. The Pistol Range is truly troublesome in this regard. I and many others have thought about how to reduce the number of skipping bullets. A couple of months ago I sat down at the Pistol Range and tried to think of a solution. Nothing seemed to be feasible; a full length cover, baffles stationed every few yards to block the exit, etc. Then I remembered that simple is best. I envisioned a bullet trap in the shape of a speed bump made of sand or some other material on the ground about 35 yards down range. I proposed the concept to the Board of Directors and they were in agreement. Ed Migdal stepped up to help out on the project.

Ed called a friend of his in Florida that belongs to a gun club regarding the 'speed bump' concept and was told that is how they solved the problem. A couple of weeks ago during the Range Clean-Up, Ed and I walked the Pistol Range looking for good place to lay down the 'speed bump'. It became obvious. There in the ground starting at about 35 yards down range was the beginning of many little furrows tracking to the back stop.

Ed will be trenching and building the 'speed bump' with sand in the near future (if not already done). He will also lay down sand at the bottom of the back stop that curves upward to catch the low fliers. I am unable to help out right now, so, Thank You Ed!

At the January 13th General Meeting, we will be unveiling what promises to be helpful and informative new program for the RSO Corps and general membership as well.
