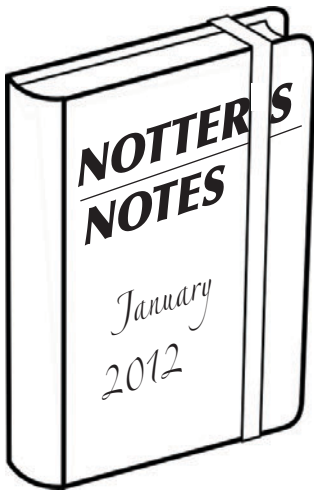

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

I hope you all had Happy and Safe Holidays'. 2012 has all of the indicators of being an exciting year. Get out the vote.

At the December Christmas General Meeting, we held our annual Range Safety Officer drawing. Ron Bowman won first prize, the "Savage" bolt action rifle in .308 Win. with an "Alpen" 4 – 12 x 40mm scope and "NRA" rifle case. Ron is recovering from an auto accident and the news of his win brightened his day. There was a second prize as well; an "Alpen" 15 – 45 x 60mm spotting scope, won by Bill Williams. Bill won second prize last year, an "Alpen" spotting scope. Bill donated this new scope to the annual picnic prize table. Third prize, a light fresh water fishing rod, reel and stocked tackle box was won by Roger Fannin. Roger said he may have to go fishing now that he has the equipment.

The five, seven and ten yard distances are open on the Pistol Range. There are specific rules for this close range shooting. Target must be 10 inches square or round maximum (10 inch maximum envelope size for more than one target) and centered on the 24 inch by 24 inch target backing cardboard. The target backing must be at the top of the target frame. **No silhouettes allowed.** Target placement is designed to keep bullets impacting the backstop. Also, check to make sure your bullets make it to the backstop. If you are not going to use the last bay with close range shooting, please set up in another bay keeping the close in shooting lanes open for those that wish to use them. The rules are posted nearby and all normal range rules apply; i.e., no rapid fire, no draw from a holster, etc.

My "What the?" for the month. For some unknown reason, there are a few members, or their guests, that are still damaging our range. While shooting on the pistol range, one of our members' and a RSO heard a loud "pop". They looked to see where it came from and noted the big green cigarette disposal container "smoking" (no pun intended). Upon examination of the containers' contents, Denny Martin removed over 100 bullets. Denny checked the 100 yard and 150 yard range and found approximately 100 more bullets. Some bullets appeared to be misfires and some good. The bullet that "cooked off" was a .22 caliber long rifle; nested in with a whole bunch of small and large caliber bullets. If one of the bigger bullets had exploded, there could have been a serious problem and possibly injuries. It seems some of our Members and their Guests are using the big green cigarette/cigar/tobacco receptacles, those green things with the big round base, tall neck and the odd shaped top with the hole where the "Butts" go, as a receptacle for misfired or just plain bad bullets. This is not only an unintelligent thing to do, but very unsafe. **Please use the big red metal tubes located by the range kiosks for bullet disposal.**

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. Please, please, please keep your finger off the trigger until you are actually ready to shoot. The 150 yard ramada and front baffle now have bullet holes in them. The pistol range ramada and baffle continue to be "holed". Range equipment is being shot up as well. What the '....' is going on at our range. We all do not want a membership fee increase, but if shooting up our range property and doing just plain dumb things continues, it may well happen. We could also lose our lease and have the range closed if these activities continue. If you note someone doing something like this, please bring it to the attention of any RSO, Board Member or me. When we find out who is doing this "stuff", and we will, they will be invited to a Board of Directors' meeting and asked to explain their actions. They will then, probably, lose their membership.

Range Safety Tip Of The Month, part two. If you are unfamiliar with your firearm, especially Santa gifts, read the manual, then ask a fellow shooter or an RSO for help. Our RSO's and many members are well versed in proper firearm use. We had a shooter recently on the pistol range that did not know where the safety was on his self-loader, a 1911, how to load it properly, how to lock the slide back and how to shoot it correctly. He and his guests did not speak English well (they all spoke different languages other than broken English): an accident waiting to happen.
