Rules Review

I would like to take this time to review a couple of association rules. First, let's review the RSO rule. The RSO on duty has the final word. If he or she feels that an unsafe condition exists, whatever action they deem necessary to correct that condition must be followed, period. DO NOT ARGUE WITH THE RSO. If you feel the decision is unfair, contact the CRSO, Tim Geiser and he will take whatever action he deems appropriate.

Here's another common mistake. When the range is "cold", NO EQUIPMENT OF ANY KIND WILL BE HANDLED, with the exception of target frames and targets being set up and brought down range. Do not take your shooting things out of your car until the range is "hot". During sanctioned events, the event chair will decide what may be specifically okay or not for their event. In either case, the duty RSO has the final say on matters of safety and property protection.

All firearms should be cased and/or uncased at the firing line. Unused rifles should be placed in the rifle racks, pistols on the shooting bench. No firearms should be placed lying on the work tables behind the firing line(s).





background you probably have some familiarity with the term "situational awareness". Essentially it refers to an ability to identify, process and comprehend the critical elements of what is happening. In other words knowing what is going on around you. What, you say, does that have to do with a gun range? Other than everything, I say, not much. Range safety is not exactly an easy thing to define sometimes. For example, at EFG&A the Trap and 100 yard ranges are shared ranges. As such, shooters on both are required, at all times, to be aware that what happens on one range can easily affect the safety on the other. Placing or changing targets on the 100 requires making certain that shooters on the Trap Range go to a "COLD Range" condition. A situation occurred recently where trap house three was being cleaned out. The flashing light and cone on top of the trap house as well as the "RANGE CLOSED" sign placed at the 100 yd. range was either not seen or was completely ignored. It led to a potentially dangerous situation which was simply unacceptable.

Using a rifle with a muzzle brake or setting up a semi-automatic rifle next to a shooter firing a bolt action are other potential awareness situations that while they may not affect safety, they can certainly be aggravating to say the least. A bit of thoughtfulness can go a long way.

The safety rules for our Range have been developed over many years. They have changed and been improved as situations have been identified. At times some members have objected to changes, but the fact that we have acquired an excellent safety record speaks for itself. Rule changes will continue as necessary. Members are encouraged to always be aware of safety and to offer up ideas for improvement. Your BOD and I are always open to suggestions.

By the time you read this, Christmas and New Year holidays will be over. I trust that you enjoyed them. New California laws will be going into effect. Many of them will be seen as punishment to gun owners. Hopefully, many of them will be overturned by the Courts, but in the meantime we will have to deal with a very negative gun environment. My New Year's resolution is to continue my efforts to make EF&GA the best and safest range anywhere. If you all join me it will happen.



It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


