

COME TRY YOUR HAND AT THE BLACK POWDER SHOOTS

On the fourth Sunday of every month there is a lot of white smoke on the range. A rotating schedule is used as the shooting program varies. For two months, muzzle loading pistols and rifles are shoot. The third month has no pistol shooting utilizing smooth bored long guns at stationary and moving targets. On the third month, breech loading single shots (black powder) may be shot as well as muzzle loaders. Any month with five Saturday's may have a muzzle loading trap practice (watch the calendar).




