

HANDGUN SAFETY CLASS

A three hour afternoon instructional, safety and shooting class for members and non-members who have purchased or plan to purchase a handgun is offered on second Sundays of the month from spring through fall at the Escondido Fish & Game Association shooting range in Valley Center. The class will run from 2:00pm to 5:00pm. Classes are available during the winter months on availability of the range. Weekday sessions are available for anyone who cannot fit a weekend into their schedule. The HSC (Handgun Safety Certificate) and test required by the State Department of Justice to purchase a handgun is also available for purchase at these classes. Anyone under the age of 21 will be required by the club to have a signed permission slip. For more information or to sign up for this or future classes, contact Jack Bryson at 760-746-2868. The club range is located at the corner of Lake Wohlford Road and Guejito Road just east of Lake Wohlford.

Jr. Rifle Program



The goals of our Jr. Rifle program are simple and straightforward. We will teach the participating kids to be safe around firearms and to handle them in a responsible manner. We will teach them to shoot competitively and coach them as they hone their skills in friendly competition.

Shooters need not bring anything except themselves and a parent or guardian. (Minors can attend with a valid signed and dated permission slip – available for download on our website.)

Escondido Fish and Game Association provides everything else!

- All equipment required for the rifle match (including rifles, ammunition, shooting jacket, sling, shooting glove, mat, etc.) is supplied by EF&GA
- Eye and ear protection
- A coach for each shooter.
- A certificate showing the shooter's score and classification.
- Lunch and drinks.

Shooters are allowed to use their own rifles (.22 cal., single shot, bolt action only) and equipment if they so desire.

The course of fire consists of unlimited sighter shots in a 15 minute period, then 40 rounds for record at a distance of 15 yards, then two sighters plus 10 shots on a steel gong at 50 yards. All firing will be conducted from the prone (lying down) position.

Each bullet is worth a possible 10 points, for a possible total of 400 points. The shooter's final score will be used to place them in one of six different classifications: Unclassified, Promarksman, Marksman, Sharpshooter, Expert, and Distinguished Expert. The shooter's skill level, not age, is what determines their classification. Trophies are awarded for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} place in each of the six classifications.

Safety Note: This match is held at an established, recognized, and licensed range under the close supervision of adults, experienced competitive shooters, and Certified Range Safety Officers. There is a Range Safety Officer on the firing line during all shooting. Each shooter will have a coach sitting beside them for safety purposes and to give instruction in marksmanship.

• <u>Cost:</u> There are no match entry fees. The Association pays for all costs.

- <u>Age Limits:</u> 8 21.
- <u>Time:</u> Registration and squad formation begins at 8:00 a.m.

R A N G E M A S T E RS O U N D O F F

July is here and a new membership year has begun. Our Range Safety Officers will be asking everybody for their membership card and photo identification. We appreciate you cooperation in this regard. Remember, there will be a new gate code and you must enter the # sign first.

We have two new Range Safety Officers: Steve Willer and Don Jackson. Welcome them aboard when you see them.

We had a target frame building party Saturday, 05 June. We managed to put together over 50 tall frames, 8 prone frames and 10 tall frames tall for the 150 yard range. We will be phasing out the mid height frames (the 6 footers) that are on the 150 range. We no longer need these since the back stop has been elevated. The mid height frames will be replaced with the 7/12 for tall frames when mid height ones become unusable. There is one caveat regarding the tall frames on the 150 yard range; the cardboard is mounted against the top cross bar. This assures that when the tall frame is setup at 50 yards, bullets will impact the back stop. Having one size tall frame will make life a bit easier for us.

Those that attended the frame party: Ira Bryant, Don Jackson, John Matson, Scott Kendall, Steve Willer and yours truly. We had a good time and lunched at the Lake Wolford Café. Next time we need frames, I will put out call and ask for volunteers.

Next time you are at the range, you will see a 'camo' box on a stand at the base of the hill by the trench between the Pistol Range and Trap Range One. This is a shotgun patterning piece of equipment that can be used by members and their guests. The rules and instructions are posted on the wall between the two ranges on the trap side. The rule and instructions are as follows:

- Pistol Range and Trap Range MUST BE COLD (not in use).
- Shotguns only.
- No steel shot allowed.
- Trap Master must approve use during sanctioned trap functions.
- Report any malfunctions or damage to a Trap Master.

Basic Instructions

- Lift front handle and pull paper down to bottom bar.
- Use clips to hold paper on sides. If windy, clip to bottom bar.
- Use black marker to place a 3 inch circle in center of paper. Marker is "velcroed" to bottom of the paper holder.
- Aim and shoot at the 3 inch circle. There are cement markers at 30, 35 and 40 yards.
- Unclip and tear paper cleanly at the top bar.
- Leave clips on the side bars.
- Study your pattern at the tables or in Trap Ramada, not in the field.

The rules and instructions are subject to change since this is a new piece of equipment and there will be a learning curve. The Escondido Fish and Game Association Casual Shooting Rules and New Member Briefing will be changed to reflect this Patterning Stand.

A special thank you to Norm Porst for arranging BOD approval, designing, building and installing the patterning equipment.

Range Safety Tip of the Month – Please make sure your bullets impact the back stop. The RSO's have noted too many instances of bullets skipping off the ground before hitting the back stop. Skipping bullets have a tendency to leave the range property and our neighbors have been kind so far when returning the spent bullets. We need to be extra careful.
