


### Make Time to Attend a General Meeting

Summer is here, this is a time when everyone likes to relax, but that does not mean that we can relax on safety. Please remember the four basic safety rules:


- **1. TREAT** every firearm as if it were loaded.
- **2. NEVER** point your firearm at anything that you do not intend to shoot.
- **3. KEEP** your finger off the trigger until you intend to shoot.
- **4. KEEP** the firearm on safe until you are ready to shoot.



# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

am not at the range everyday although my wife might argue that point. Even so I make an honest attempt to maintain an awareness of what is going on. Are members keeping a safe mind frame? Our RSOs and I are truly doing our job when we are on the alert for anomalies rather than having to constantly remind our members and guests about safety violations. Overall, I see a lot of improvements in the way our members view our range safety rules and I wish to commend you. Please keep up the good work.

Now, with all the "kudos" out of the way we still have some work to do. For example, our range SOP dictates that you must sign in before you even start unloading equipment from your vehicle. AND unloading is NOT to commence if there is anyone down range. This has become the most common mistake that members make and while some members think that it is a silly rule, it is a rule none-the-less and if you are the one down range you might feel a bit less exposed to inadvertent fire!

When we run "sanctioned shoots" SOP rules may be somewhat modified at times. For example, we do not normally allow long guns to be fired on the pistol range, but may allow them during special events such as Junior Rifle. Having said that, under no circumstances will safety be compromised. Bullets must always impact the embankment and targets must be placed properly so as to allow it. Any time a shooter is bouncing rounds off the ground or keeps hitting one of the intermediate berms, an adjustment must be made to correct the situation.

Trap shooters and long gun shooters on the 100 yd range, partially share space during casual shooting days. This means that shooters on both ranges need to be constantly cognizant of movement of the other range. When the 100 yd shooters are changing targets at 50 yds and beyond, the trap shooters must go cold also. "COLD RANGE" means that all firearms on both ranges must be cleared and not being handled by anyone on either range until a "HOT RANGE" is declared on both ranges.

Believe it or not people still leave their firearms on the range not to mention other items such as scopes, hearing protectors and such. We go to great lengths to return items as far as possible, especially firearms. I strongly suggest that everyone mark your gear with your name and a phone number. There have been many instances where I have had only a green signup sheet to go on. I usually go down the list and make phone calls whenever possible. If you do your part, I will do my best to see that lost gear is returned to its rightful owner.

As a "Safety Officer" I tend to be a bit one sided in these columns. If there are other issues you would like to be addressed or expanded upon, feel free to let me know. You never know, it might become the basis for my next book!



These Safety Briefings are mandatory for participation and contain valuable information.

At the Junior Rifle and Junior Pistol events we are getting our more experienced Junior Members to assist with these briefings so that they can be more like participants than audience. At the Combat Match and AR-15 Steel Match, the participants are made to feel welcome and we all get the required instruction along with the course of fire descriptions.

When you attend any sanctioned event, please be sure to be present in time for the Safety Briefings. In most cases, if you miss the Briefing, you don't get to shoot. If you bring a friend or relative who is new to an event, please be sure that they pay attention during the briefings as well. It is tempting to chat with your friends but it is is important that we all get this critical information. It usually takes just a few minutes and there is no reason to distract others around you. We have a great safety record and we are going to keep it that way. All of our participation makes this happen. The safety briefing is a critical component of this record and your participation is greatly appreciated.

# How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

**Category** – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

**Subject/Title** – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

**Description** – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

**Price** – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

**Contact Info** – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
