Well, as you all know the election for the Board of Directors is finished. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Al Anzelone for his dedicated service these past two years.



Fire Season

This past winter we had enough rain to end the drought. The rains also made our area lush and green like we have not seen in many years. Most of us think of the growth as an improvement on the environment. However, if you ask a firefighter about it and he/she will refer

to the growth as fuel for brushfires. In May of 2017 there was a large brush fire in the Southeast area of San Diego and the media has been linking it to recreational shooters in the area. The CalFire investigation is still not complete but the media has presented their assumptions as facts. We need to remain vigilant to practice fire safety at our range so that we don't have any issues like this at our location. This means that we need to keep the property clear of brush and weeds. At the regular Work Parties (the next one is August 20th, 2017) we use weed-whackers and volunteers to clear the brush from the hillsides. If you watch the time-lapse video of the last work party (www. escondidofishandgame.com/volunteer) at the end of the video you can watch someone clearing the brush and weeds from the berm between the 100 and 150 yard ranges. (This information is not useful but I thought the video was pretty cool).

The point is that we must all be proactive about the upcoming fire season. When you are at the Range, make sure that you and your neighbors are NOT shooting with ammunition containing steel. You can test it with the magnets on all of the shooting benches. If you want to help clear brush at a Work Party you are welcome to join us on August 20th. Your cooperation and vigilance is appreciated.

Make Time to Attend a General Meeting



RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Keep the date! RMAD is a day set aside by our organization to honor and thank the members who volunteer their time to become RSOs for our range. The day starts with games of skill such as tomahawk throwing and archery and ends with a great lunch and raffle. This year the event will be held on Sunday, July 30th. Invitations will be sent out and it is important to RSVP so that I can be certain that there is enough lunch to go around.

Summer hours are now in effect. This means that the evening RSO shift is more important than ever. RSOs that have a hard time making a day shift can now help us provide sufficient coverage by coming up for a later one.

All of the DUD buckets have been emptied so there is plenty of room to get rid of bad ammo. Having said that, be sure to place ammo in the clearly marked RED containers. Cigars and cigarettes only go into the green clearly marked containers. All too often I am finding live ammo in the green containers and vice versa. That is a big **NO NO!** It clearly is a potentially dangerous situation and there is no excuse for this kind of negligence. Strangely enough I also found a large amount of live .223cal rifle ammo in the DUD bucket on the Trap Range. I find it strange that someone went from a rifle range to the trap range to get rid of what appeared to be perfectly good rifle ammunition.

With the warmer weather comes an increase in fire danger. Always keep an eye out for anyting that may create a spark. Grasses can flare up unbelievably fast. Water hoses are located at each range and every member should familiarize his/herself with their operation. All the hoses will stretch all the way to the impact area if necessary. Steel core ammunition if banned also. I know that it is cheaper, but there is always a danger of sparks and RSO will be particularly vigilant in using their magnets. Any steel core ammo must be removed from the range immediately.

New members will soon be added to our membership rolls which also mean that periodically we will be conducting **Safety Walks**. Typically, these walks are conducted late afternoon on the third Thursday of the month. If you are shooting that day, please be aware that there may be a 10-15 minute interruption at each range while a group presentation is being made. We make an effort to make as little disruption as possible. As always:





How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to <u>newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com</u> and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.

May is gone and the second of our three yearly Super Short Confidence Course shoots has been completed. For this event we welcomed two first time muzzle loading silhouette competitors, Elvio Marchi and Robert Reid. Thanks guys for coming out and giving it a try.

New this year we added a Trade Gun class to our Super Short Course for the first time. Three grizzled mountain men showed up to participate. It ended up in a tense two round shoot-off for first place. The Marines won this one. Trade Gun will be offered again at the September contest. For July we will be shooting our regular Medium Range Course at 75, 100, and 125 yards. On June 10th and 11th we held our annual Guejito Rendevous. This competition allows for a two day "walk-thru" event with Rifle and Pistol on one day and Trade Gun "walk-thru" on the second day. Ten steel targets were placed randomly from 25 to 125 yards and competitors shoot two balls at each target. One point per hit, 20 points possible on each walk. All loading is from a pouch. Just for fun, we also have a ten throw Knife and Hawk competition. One point per "stick". Congratulations to Dan Hannah, as this year's overall winner.

Does Black Powder Shooting sound like it might be fun? Do you know what you need to get started? Here is a short primer to get started. (Note that this is MY opinion and your mileage may vary). First of all, decide what category you want to shoot in. We offer Open Rifle, Primitive Rifle, and BP Cartridge Rifle. Currently the difference between Open Rifle and Primitive Rifle are the sights and how you load. In Open Rifle you can load from the bench and use either fixed, adjustable, or aperture iron sights. In Primitive Rifle you have to load from the pouch and can only use fixed non-adjustable sights. In BP Cartridge Rifle you load at the line and can use any fixed, adjustable, or aperture sights. For this monologue, lets say you want to shoot open rifle. To start with you need a rifle. .45, .50, or .54 caliber rifle will work. A .32 or .36 rifle can be really accurate, but the ball lacks the weight to knock over silhouettes at range. A .58 or larger rifle can be pretty tiring for those not adapted to the recoil. Almost any BP replica rifle will work. A slow twist barrel of one turn in 56, 66, or 70 is preferred. For long range work. A one turn in 48 rifle will work out to about 100 yards but can accuracy can suffer with higher powder charges. Flintlock or Percussion is a personal preference. For me percussion is easier. You will need a "wiping rod" to clean between shots or "as needed" by preference. In open class you can also use it to seat balls during the loading process. (Your under barrel ramrod will work but a slightly longer bench rod is easier), You will need pure lead round balls, cotton pillow ticking patches, patch lube of your choice, percussion caps or 4F pan primer. You will need a powder horn or flask, and a powder measure. An adjustable brass powder measure makes your life easier and they last forever. (Never pour powder directly from the flask/horn into the barrel). You will also need a can of 2F or 3F black powder. A ball starter in the proper caliber with a wide head can save bruising your hands when you start the ball down the barrel. Its always a good idea to keep a nipple wrench and/or a vent pick handy in case you have a failure to fire and need to clean things out on the line. If your choice is a flintlock you might want to keep a spare flint handy as well as the proper tool to change it on your rifle. Also handy to have is a U shaped padded piece of wood to C clamp to the loading bench, This will allow you to lean your rifle against the bench when you load. A scrap piece of carpet to rest the butt of the rifle on the ground saves some wear and tear. (You can find them on the range from time to time when somebody else forgets it's there and leaves it). If you do not use pre-cut patches and prefer to cut at the barrel you will need a small patch knife. Other odds and ends that are useful include a bench rag, (BP is messy), a brass percussion capper, and/or a small priming horn for flintlocks. (Using a small priming horn of 4F powder and a nipple wrench you can usually clear a dry ball in a percussion rifle fairly quickly also). Alternatively a CO2 ball clearing device can be used to force a ball out of the barrel on a percussion or flintlock rifle. Finally, the last thing you need is a positive attitude and a willingness to learn. Everything on a BP rifle is a variable. How you combine the variables frequently results in how accurate your rifle is, and how well you do. Next month we can talk about accuracy and working up a load for your rifle.

Finally, a typical BP conversation on the range during the June rendezvous. Patrick Watson announced: "I have wrinkly balls". Herr Doktor Niel Pisk conferred with Herr Doktor Craig Rogers and offered this medical opinion. "Turn the thermostat up on your lead smelter until your balls turn Frosty, then, back it off a little bit". Then there was a comment about taking two aspirin, etc, etc.
