

YOU CAN WALK AWAY WITH MONEY


Linda Linaker won the \$25 attendance prize. Vernon Lee Leming of Ramona would have walked away with \$100, but he wasn't present.


PISTOL BULLSEYE CHAIR

Casual Shooting Rules and New Member Briefing

- Members are responsible for knowing ALL the Administrative Rules and Range Rules (please take the time to read and understand our rules). The Administrative and Range Rules take precedence over these bullet points.
- This is your range. Please help keep it clean neat.
- The Pistol, Rifle and Archery ranges are open from 7:00 a.m. to local sunset (sunset at the range). Trap ranges are open Tuesday morning, Wednesday and Saturday afternoon/evenings to close, approximately 9:00 p.m.
- The Range (Master) Safety Officer's Word is Final No Exceptions (If disagreements arise, follow RSO instructions. Then take any complaint to the Board of Directors, if so desired).
 A Range Safety Officer may confiscate a membership card for serious rules infraction. The confiscated membership card may be returned at the next Board of Directors' meeting.
- Any member and Range Safety Officer can ask a person for his/ her membership card and picture Identification- These must be produced-no exceptions. Membership card displayed via a clear card pouch and lanyard is preferred while at the range.
- Giving the gate code to anyone- including family, is grounds for loss of membership.
- Failure to obey the range rules are grounds for temporary to permanent loss of membership privileges.
- Stop and wait for gate to close after entering and when exiting the property.
- Always sign in after entering the property at all ranges you use, sign out when leaving.
- Eye and ear protection required for everyone, including spectators, while in a shooting area. Within 25 feet of the firing line is preferred.
- Spectators must stay behind the Blue line/ Yellow line or back of the concrete pad.
- No casual shooting forward of the red shooting line. (All Ranges)
- Sign in first, then unload equipment and firearms only while the range is HOT; members actively engaged in shooting on that range. Do not handle any equipment or firearms while a range is COLD for any reason; shooting stopped, firearms down and possibly people down range.
- If your firearm is on the ban list and you do not have the paperwork- leave it at home.
- Two guests maximum per member- for more; written permission is required in advance from the BOD (Board of Directors). You are responsible for your guest and you must stay with your guest at all times while on our property. Kids must stay with adults at all times even in the primitive area.
- Juniors, those shooters 17 and under, must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or an adult with a signed permission slip from their parent or legal guardian. Youth shooters, 18 to 21, who are members, may not be in possession of a hand gun unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or an adult with a signed permission slip (EF&GA rule). Youth shooters may shoot rifle, shot gun and archery without a parent or guardian. Youth non-members must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or by an adult with a signed permission slip.
- Open or concealed carry of any firearm is not permitted on the Association property. Exception: Peace Officers under color of uniform. Concealed carry is permitted for those with proper, current concealed carry permits.
- Rapid fire is not permitted; defined as shots fired faster than one shot every one to two seconds. As defined by the NRA. Causal shooting RSO has final decision.

- The shooter must be in control of his/her firearm at all times.
 You are responsible for your firearms at all times.
- Your good attitude is necessary and is appreciated.
- Be responsible and respect the rules and your fellow members.
- Emergency Numbers- Posted on Trap Ramada wall and kitchen, by the telephones.
- Closest fire hydrant is on the South East corner of Lake Wolford Rd and Guejito RD.
- Evacuation plan is posted in the club house and Trap Ramada.
- First aid kits are located on the Pistol and Rifle Ranges, in the Trap Ramada and in the Club House. Shovels for fire control are located in front of Trap Ramada, use gate code combination.
- Fire Extinguishers are located in the Trap Ramada and Club House kitchen.
- Bullets or shot shells that fail to fire when the firing pin strikes
 the primer; keep the muzzle of the firearm pointing down
 range and keep the action closed. Wait a minute or so before
 removing the bad round. Place the bad round in one of the red
 cylinders located on each range. Please do not throw the bad
 rounds in the trash, on the ground or in the brass collection
 buckets.

Cease Fire and the procedures that must be follow:

Anyone can call a Cease Fire at any time; a safety issue, target set up or change, etc.

- Immediately cease firing (stop shooting), open the action and remove the live round if present, remove the magazine if so equipped, place the firearm on the shooting bench with the action open, an OCI (Open Chamber Indicator) is preferred, and with the muzzle pointing down range.
- Move behind the yellow line and wait for instructions.
- If your firearm malfunctions, keep the muzzle pointed down range, clear the problem or raise your hand and ask for assistance. Stay on firing line and wait for instructions.
- If you wish to call a cease fire for target change or set-up, casually and politely check with other shooters on the line and ask for a cease fire in some future time, say 5 minutes. This allows those engaged in shooting to empty a magazine, etc.

Hot and Cold Range Terminology for EF&GA:

For casual shooting and possibly sanctioned events at Escondido Fish and Game, the terms Hot and Cold are commonly used. After a cease fire is called, firearms are unloaded, actions opened, magazines or clips are removed if so equipped firearm is placed on the shooting bench with the barrel pointing down range with the action open, an OCI (Open Chamber Indicator) is preferred. Shooters move behind the Yellow Line. When all shooters are off the firing line and behind the yellow line, the range is declared "COLD" and shooters may go down range, non-shooters stay behind the yellow line. While the range is "COLD", do not handle any firearm, any equipment or load or unload vehicles. When the range is declared "HOT", line in front of the Yellow line shooters move to the firing and shooting activities can begin. No one advances in front of the red firing line when the range is Hot.

CONTINUED-

If you and your guests, if applicable, are the only ones on a range, you control the Hot and Cold conditions. All rules apply.

Pistol Range

- Sign in first. Unload accessory equipment and handle firearms ONLY when the range is HOT, Refer to Cease Fire procedures and Hot and Cold Terminology sections.
- Eye and ear protection required for everyone, including spectators, while in a shooting area. Within 25 feet of the firing line is preferred.
- · No shooting forward of the red line.
- All Bullets must impact the backstop Target placement height on the frame is critical to hitting the back stop.
- One target recommended two maximum. No political figures or likeness of any person living or dead. Paper targets only. Target backing cardboard size is approximately 24 x 24 inches. Please keep targets as far from the target frame as possible.
- · Pistols only, no holstered firearms.
- · No cross lane shooting.
- Rapid fire not permitted; defined as shots fired faster than one shot every one to two seconds. As defined by the NRA. Causal shooting RSO has final decision.
- Do not set targets at the 50 yard line during Sanctioned Trap Shooting events.
- Please clean up and sign out when you leave.

Trap Ranges

- Sign in first at Trap Ramada. Unload accessory equipment and handle firearms ONLY when the range is HOT. Refer to Cease Fire Procedures and Hot and Cold Terminology sections.
- Eye and ear protection required for everyone, including spectators, while in a shooting area. Within 25 feet of the firing line is preferred.
- Sanctioned trap events held on Tuesday mornings, Wednesday and Saturday afternoon/evenings, approximately 9:00 p.m.
- For throwing your own targets, check in with the RSO on duty before you unload for permission to shoot. Throw your own birds from the manual trap machine located between trap house one and two. Use of your own trap machine is okay and set-up close to the existing trap machine. Manual throwing your own targets is almost always permitted. Be aware of those on the Pistol Range that may be down range.
- To pattern your shotgun, use the stand next to trap house one and
 the large target frame next to the Pistol Range wall. Leave the target stand close to the front of the trap house and shoot from the
 27 yard line. This will give you a pattern spread at approximately
 30 yards. Please be aware of those on the Pistol Range.
- · Maximum of 2 rounds loaded at any time, no Exceptions.
- · Please clean up and sign out when you leave.

Rifle Range 100 yard

- Sign in first. Unload accessory equipment and handle firearms ONLY when the range is HOT. Refer to Cease Fire procedures and Hot and Cold Terminology sections.
- Eye and ear protection required for everyone, including spectators, while in a shooting area. Within 25 feet of the firing line is preferred.
- · No shooting forward of the red line.
- Pistols okay only at 50 yards or more.
- Shotgun slugs okay, must impact the backstop.

- All Bullets must impact backstop Target placement height on the frame is critical to hitting the back stop.
- One target recommended two maximum- no political figures or likeness of any person living or dead - paper targets only, target backing cardboard size is 24 x 24 inches. Please keep targets as far from the target frame as possible.
- Shoot in your lane, no cross lane shooting.
- Rapid fire not permitted; defined as shots fired faster than one shot every one to two seconds. As defined by the NRA. Causal shooting RSO has final decision.
- Please clean up and sign out when you leave and return shooting bench to its original position if moved for prone shooting.

Rifle Range 150 Yard

- Sign in first. Unload accessory equipment and handle firearms ONLY when the range is HOT. Refer to Cease Fire Procedures and Hot and Cold Terminology sections.
- Eye and ear protection required for everyone, including spectators, while in a shooting area. Within 25 feet of the firing line is preferred.
- No shooting forward of the red line.
- No Pistols allowed No Exceptions.
- · Shotgun slugs okay, must impact the backstop.
- All Bullets must impact backstop Target placement height on the frame is critical to hitting the backstop.
- One target recommended two maximum- no political figures or likeness of any person living or dead - paper targets only, target backing cardboard size is approximately 24 x 24 inches. Please keep targets as far from the target frame as possible.
- #1 and #2 positions are reserved for prone shooting, but prone shooting is okay in other positions. Replace the shooting bench if you move it.
- No shooting permitted on the 15 and 25 yard line.
- Shoot in your lane, no cross lane shooting.
- Rapid fire not permitted; defined as shots fired faster than one shot every one to two seconds. As defined by the NRA. Causal shooting RSO has final decision.
- Please clean up and sign out when you leave. Please return shooting bench to its original position if you moved it for prone shooting.

Archery Range

- · Sign in and out at the Pistol Range.
- · No firearms permitted.
- · Please clean up and sign out before you leave.

Primitive Camping Area

- Sign in on the green sheet located in the box at the entrance to the area.
- Permission to camp is required in advance in writing or in email form from the Secretary. The Secretary will explain all rules and expectations.
- Follow all posted rules for the primitive area and all ranges.
- Adult supervision of minors is mandatory at all times.
- · No firearms permitted.
- No open fires, use the permanent BBQ's located in the camping area.
- Tents only, no vehicles in camping area other than to unload and load. Vehicle or trailer camping permitted outside of the fence line
- · Please clean up and sign out before you leave.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Al Ardale has put together a course titled "Personal Protection in the Home". He has gone to a lot of work building the necessary items used in the shooting section of the course, target frames, barricades, special targets, etc. He did a real nice job. It is a full day session that is scheduled to be offered the second Monday of each month. There is a notice on the bulletin board in the Meeting Hall with more details.

A couple of us took the first class offering and Al used us as "guinea pigs", seeing what worked best for the classroom course and time on the firing line. The book learning was augmented by a visit from Officer L. Shaver of the Escondido Police Department. Al and Officer Shaver were informative and answered our many questions. The time on the range was spent doing various shooting scenarios at 3 and 7 yards. We went through approximately 100 rounds of ammunition punching holes in the targets Al spent so much time working on.

I think I can speak for the others in the class when I say that we learned a great deal and had a lot of fun doing it. I strongly recommend the course to anyone who is serious about home defense.

I would like to thank those members that take the time to put new cardboard on the target frames. It helps the folks in the Red Hats by reducing the time they spend fixing the frames and freeing them up to do the range safety items. I do ask that if you take to time to replace the cardboard, please limit the length to approximately 24 inches (cardboard size 24" x 24"). Having the cardboard longer than 24inches tends to get the cross bar of the target frame full of holes from the lead termites. Also, please try to keep your targets away from the edges of the frame. Those same pesky lead termites tend to eat the uprights when they are covered by targets.

For the past several months, all new members have been interviewed, given a safety briefing and facility tour explaining the ranges and some of the events that take place at the range. The briefing is conducted by Chief Range Safety Officers' and we use the "Escondido Fish and Game Association Casual Shooting Rules and New Member Briefing" as our guide. A copy of Rules and Briefing are included with this month's newsletter for your information. We have worked on Rules and Briefing for several months and this is the final version, for now. Please take the time to read the Rules and Briefing paper. This is partly what the folks in the Red Hats look for while on duty. It is not a complete listing of all Association rules but a guideline that all members are responsible for understanding. If you have questions regarding any range rule, please ask one of the Range Safety Officers on duty.

We live in interesting times and there are going to be challenges in the future keeping our 2nd Amendment Rights.

Pending California legislation

AB 1663 - would repeal several portions of passed AB 962 (ammunition registration).

AB 1810 - calls for mandatory registration of rifles and shotguns.

AB 1934 - would ban unloaded carry in public areas.

AB 2223 - would expand the ban on lead ammo to almost anywhere in the state.
