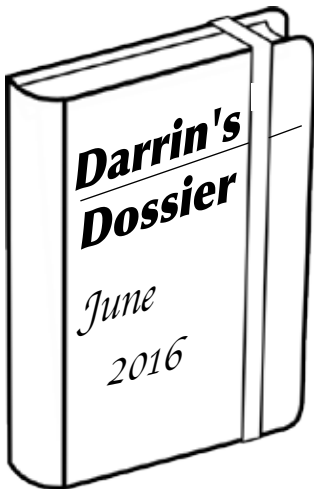
Life Members

Safety and Etiquette

I participate in numerous events and they all have rules and guidelines that we follow. Some of the rules are for etiquette and others are for safety. For example, while shooting trap, we don't talk to each other on the line so that the target machine does not throw additional birds and so that we can maintain concentration. This is a rule of etiquette. We also don't walk without having the chamber(s) and/or magazine empty. This is a rule for safety.

When we correct each other for rule violations, we need to consider the rule type and act accordingly. When someone violates an etiquette rule you can wait for a break in the action and pull the person aside (no need for public embarrassment) and politely council him/her on the proper procedure. If there is a violation of a safety rule, the correct response is immediate, direct instruction. For example, during the Combat Match the RSO should shout "FINGER" if the shooter has his/her finger in the trigger guard while changing magazines. If the RSO waits until after the shooter finishes the course of fire to council and instruct the shooter then we are running the risk of a negligent discharge and possibly even bodily harm. Also, if you are the shooter and the RSO shouts an instruction like FINGER or MUZZLE, don't look around to see who the RSO is shouting at, look at your own firearm and make sure that it isn't you. If it is you, just follow the instruction and make the correction. The proper response from the shooter should be "Thank You!" and we can all continue with the event. Don't take it personally, the RSO should shout the instruction so that you can hear it through the hearing protection and to get it corrected immediately.


We participate in the shooting events to have fun and improve our skills. Part of that is forc-

Some of you might have noticed that many of the shooting benches on the long gun ranges are starting to look a bit ragged. The problem is, I am not quite certain what the problem is. One of our talented RSOs started to replace some of the covers and two weeks later they are starting to look as bad as ever! I would like to know what is going on. If you have any answers let me know. I will pass it on to our Board and to the membership. Let us all take better care of our shooting benches.

Our annual BBQ and 70th anniversary was a bit chilly, but I would say that most of the attendees had a pretty good time regardless. The biggest line seemed to be the black powder event. We apologize if anyone did not get their chance with these wonderful old guns, but there is an “open to the public” event on the fourth Sunday of each month. Please feel free to stop by. I guarantee someone will be willing to let you shoot their rifle and school you about how to handle it.

Speaking of the BBQ, everything seemed to flow seamlessly as the event came together. Parking was well organized, events went well, prizes were handed out, great BBQ was enjoyed, the range was clean and beautiful. Lest anyone think that it all happened by accident, please have another think. Neil Pisk, Ed Migdal, Dick Cross, Darrin Eaton and more people than I have room to list worked endless hours to make everything seem easy. You all have my personal thanks and admiration.

I recently came across some cartridges which I immediately and incorrectly recognized as 30.06 in stripper clips. They were older cartridges and somewhat corroded. The problem came when I placed a couple of them in my 30.06 case sizer and they did not quite fit! Also the head stamp was not one that I could recognize. The solution was to ask someone much more knowledgeable than me about the situation. It turns out that this round is called a 7.65 x 53 mm Argentine. Being .311-.312 vs .308 it certainly was not for use in a 30.06 rifle. The point of all this is that always make certain that you are shooting the proper ammunition and things are not always what they seem to be. There are many association members who can be considered as true experts in the art of reloading and really know their stuff. Don't take chances if you are not certain about the process!

Revisiting a recent issue regarding AR style rifles that fire .223/5.56 cartridges. A little curtesy will go a long way. To the greatest extent possible, try to pick a shooting bench that provides the least amount of hot brass annoyance to others shooters.

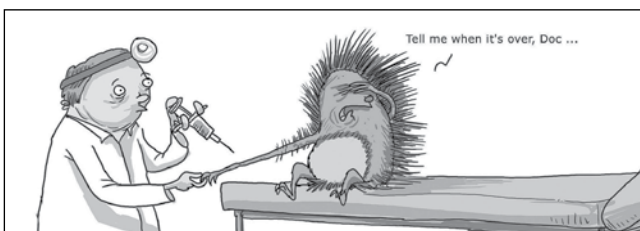

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. **There are 5 main components of a classified ad:**

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
