PRESIDENT'S VIEWPOINT





Specifications of Maintenance Duties- Revised, December 7, 2010

A. Mowing Schedule

Mowing is to be performed as needed in compliance with the following schedule:

- 1. Rifle Range: Twice a month, normally the 1st and 4th weekends.
- Pistol Range: Once a month, normally for the 2nd weekend. Weeds on top of the bank and around target butts to be trimmed at the same time.
- Traps: Once a month, to be done for major shoots (Turkey shoot, BBQ, Etc.). Trim weeds around traps and pads.
- 4. Remaining Grounds: Once a month in conjunction with major events.

It will be necessary to check the monthly club calendar as the above schedule prepares the range for shoots as they are normally scheduled. Holidays and special events at times necessitate a change in the above schedule.

B. Clean-Up

Trash cans are to be emptied as needed. Debris around Ramada's, traps and grounds to be picked up as needed. Must be able to lift 70 pounds.

- C. EF&GA will supply equipment and fuel necessary to perform above work. Contractor to supply fuels and get reimbursed.
- D. Compensation
 - 1. Payment to be made monthly upon satisfactory completion of work as listed above.
 - 2. Position subject to cancellation for unsatisfactory performance.

E. Maintenance

Shall perform minor electrical and plumbing repairs and range maintenance as needed. Routine maintenance (oil change, belt replacement, etc.) will be performed by contractor. Major repairs will be the responsibility of EF&GA.

F. EF&GA Representative

EF&GA to be represented by the Project Manager or the President regarding matters such as actual mowing schedule, satisfactory performance, equipment repairs, etc.


List of Requirements For Maintenance Position

- 1. Must be a valid United States Citizen
- 2. Must be able to read and follow directions as necessary
- 3. Must have basic Electrical and Mechanical knowledge
- Must be able to identify and work flexible hours to maximize work down range when ranges are available.
- Must have excellent operating skills in the operation of farm and landscaping machinery and equipment.
- Is required to maintain EFGA tools and equipment as well as schedule equipment servicing.
- 7. Must maintain an excellent relationship with those using the facilities
- Is expected to know the requirements and restrictions stipulated in the lease agreement with the city regarding proper use and discharge of chemicals, paints, and cleaning materials on the site.
- 9. Must have working knowledge of proper soils distribution and management of the grounds



RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

As some of you have noted, the frames were becoming rather shabby and "chock-full-of-holes"; especially the units on the Pistol Range. The frames on the Pistol Range take a real beating and have a useful life of only a few weeks. Scott Kendall, Steve Kryzwicki, Steve Willer and I had a 'frame party' Saturday, 12 February, and we completed 73 new frames for all ranges. We built the new style frame that has the vertical legs in two sections; which allows for changing the upper half only when it gets shot-up.

A hearty thank you to Scott and the two Steve's for putting in the time to build 73 frames for your shooting enjoyment. Please try to miss the frames and keep your targets as close to the center of the cardboard as possible. Also, please make sure your rounds make it to the impact area on the bank.

On Saturday, 05 February, we held an NRA RSO Certification Class. We have four new NRA Certified Range Safety Officers at EF&GA. The four new RSO's: Paul Becher, Eric Jamois, Richard MacInnes and Orville Wright. When you see our shiny new RSO's, give them a big EF&GA thank you. A big thank you, Frank Alessio, for a great job instructing the class.

We have a new shooting venue, Short Range Pistol Practice (SRPP), beginning Tuesday, 01 March at 1:00 p.m. and every Tuesday thereafter. Norm Porst, one of our RSO's, has put in a lot of time setting up the course of fire and working out the details. The course of fire will be at 3, 5, 7 and 10 yards at the 50 yard line on the Pistol Range. Bring a small table or something to put your equipment on since leaving 'working' items on the shooting benches will not be allowed. Open Carry will not be permitted. There must be a Range Safety Officer present for the practice sessions to take place. Normal pistol shooting will be suspended during the SRPP.

RANGE SAFETY TIP OF THE MONTH.

When on the Pistol Range Firing Line, please keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot; especially if you are doing "high port" shooting. "High port" is holding the pistol, in one or two hands, muzzle pointing up. Move your finger to the trigger once you present to the target. "High port" is one method of pistol shooting that is not seen much on the range.

Why do I mention this? Next time you are on the pistol range at the benches, look up. At last count (two weeks or so ago), there were 29 bullet holes in the almost new over-hang. High port, but bad trigger control, is the only firearm handling method that explains the bullet holes.






