

Barbecue tickets are available from any Board member and there is an order form on Page 11 of this newsletter.


Make Time to Attend a General Meeting

Hi, my name is Daysha. I'm 12 years old and a proud member of the Jr Coaching Team. The other members of the team are David Welchons, Samantha (Sami) Medley, Brook McCarty, Michael Bresnahan, Gracie Bresnahan, James Braxmeyer, Bryce Braxmeyer and AJ.

I would like everyone to know that we take our responsibility very seriously.

My first experience with shooting guns was when I was ten years old and asked my grandfather if I could shoot his pellet gun. Since he spoils me a lot, I was pretty sure he would say yes and he did. Yea! What I didn't know was that there was going to be a long lecture before the shooting started. 

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

f you happen to read this column regularly, you are probably aware that I have been consistently recommending that if you bring multiple firearms (pistols) to the range and keep them together on the firing line, there is a potential safety problem to be aware of. It is far too easy to mix the ammunition with potentially disastrous results. Obviously, it would be hard to mix a .22 round with a .45. On the other hand consider how easy it might be to confuse a 9mm with a .40 cal. The point being that the closer the caliber the easier it becomes to confuse them.

I routinely recommend that you keep the gun(s) you are not using behind the firing line. Now, another complaint has arisen. "How do I know that shooter won't sweep the line with a loaded firearm when he exchanges one for the other?" I would answer that simply obeying standard SOP (range rules) prevents it. **There are to be no loaded firearms behind the firing line at any time. It is everyone's responsibility to make certain that this rule is enforced. Any firearm handled behind the line must be handled on a manner that clearly shows the chamber open and clear.** I also recommend that you employ an empty chamber indicator whenever possible.

The association kitchen and meeting room was broken into recently. Fortunately, our security cameras recorded his picture. The picture has been printed out by the police and a copy sent to each RSO. A copy of the individual has been posted on the bulletin board in the Association meeting room. When you are at the range, take moment to review the poster. He might well be back during any time the range is open to the public.

RSOs take note: There is a special cart especially reserved for the use of our RSOs. Within the large RSO box is, among other things, a set of keys for the cart. If the duty RSO chooses not to use the cart, he/she is directed to carry a first aid kit on his/her person. If the cart is used a first aid kit is kept on the cart for immediate use if required. If the cart is used, the Duty RSO must sign it out and sign it back in.

Once again, each <u>card carrying</u> member is allowed to bring two guests (including spectators) to the range without any special permission. Additional guests are allowed with written authorization from our Recording Secretary Geoff Orchin. RSOs cannot give this permission and are charged with enforcing the rule. Geoff will not make an exception once you are at the range so the best advice is to think ahead and don't embarrass yourself in front of your guests. Geoff can be reached at 760-741-3721. The member is always responsible for the actions of each guest. Make certain that guests have fully read and understand our safety rules.



How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
