
Kudos

- Make Time to Attend a General Meeting



Don't forget about all of the other great Jr Marksmanship events.



Some of you might have guessed that has become one of my pet peeves. Well guess what? Voila, this past Monday everything as locked up all proper like! Maybe the word is finally getting out. Hope springs eternal!

This is the last call for participants in the next first-aid class on March 18th. The cut-off date will be March 3rd.

Unsafe conditions and unsafe actions. Both are the anathema of a gun range. We have developed a set of RANGE RULES (SOP) for the EF&GA which provide the means of avoiding both conditions when followed. Our RSOs are there to help maintain order, but each and every member is expected to know what the rules are and to follow them. In that sense each and every one of our members is an RSO also. Just because an RSO is not around or on duty does not mean it is a good time to get away with something. FOR EXAMPLE: When the rules for the 150 yard range say "No Shooting Closer Than 50 yards" it does not mean that putting a target on the 25yard line is OK! We also do not allow shotguns to be patterned using a rifle/pistol target stand. In case anyone has wondered, those are not tiny worm holes in some of our frames!

I think that a shout-out is due to all the youngsters who helped in the monthly lead removal efforts. The amount of lead pulled out of the pistol range alone is almost beyond belief. Not only does the lead sale help fund many of our junior programs, their efforts help make EF&GA one of the more progressive and environmentally sensitive outdoor ranges in the state. A big thankyou to each and every one of the kids as well as the of the adults and members who work the program with them.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


TRAP CORNER
