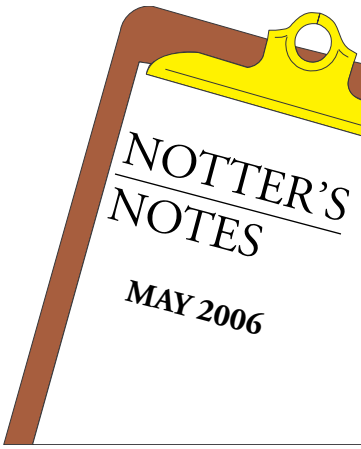

PARTICIPATE IN THE HI-POWER RIFLE MATCH

High-power rifle matches are held on the second Saturday of each month. Match start time is at 8:00 am. The Hi-Power Rifle Match has two separate courses of fire, a 100-yard 4-position match course and a 100-yard prone UIT (universal international target) match course. The 4-position match has prone, sitting, kneeling and offhand stages of fire. Each match course consists of firing forty (40) rounds for score plus unlimited spotter rounds. Competitors may elect to participate in either or both matches. Entry fees are \$5.00 per competitor per match. Juniors shoot free.

Any legal center-fire, cartridge-firing rifle, regardless of caliber or action, is acceptable. Competitors may use open (iron) sights or scopes. Slings are allowed except in the offhand position. No artificial supports are allowed for shot placement. Hearing and eye protection are required.

The intent of the matches is to improve your skills and have fun while doing it. Call the match chairperson listed in this newsletter if you need additional information.

IMPROVE YOUR DEFENSIVE PISTOL SKILLS, ATTEND AN IDPA MATCH

Come out to the IDPA Monthly Match. It is the 4th Saturday every month. Sign up is 8:00AM. Show up about 7:00AM and help set up the targets. We have a lot of fun!

Defensive Pistol matches typically require the use of a service type pistol or revolver of 9mm / .38 special or larger caliber. Shooters competing in Defensive Pistol events use practical handguns and holsters that are suitable for self-defense use. No "competition only" equipment is permitted, since the goal is to test the skill and ability of and individual, not his or her equipment or gamesman-ship.

We set up 4 or 5 stages, where you could be shooting around barricades or barrels, shooting while moving, shooting targets that are moving and engaging multiple targets. Stages are limited to 18 rounds of ammunition; a minimum of 150 rounds of ammo is needed.

That means there is **NO HANDLING OF ANY FIREARMS OR ANY TYPE OF EQUIPMENT UNTIL ALL PERSONS ARE SAFELY BACK FROM THE DOWN RANGE AREA.** This rule includes the packing and unpacking of any equipment.

Range Master of the Month is: Ira Bryant, retired construction worker, avid trap shooter as well as high power rifle and handguns. Ira's knowledge of firearms is extensive and he can always be depended upon for sound advice and information. Please say hi and thank you when you see Ira at the range.

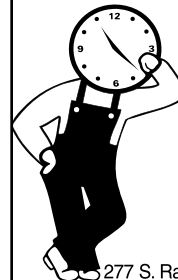

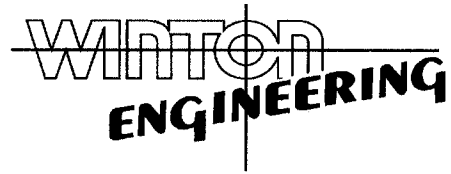

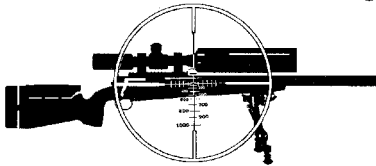
