As far as the Range Enhancement Project is concerned, we have received the plans back from the County with a few corrections. Those are being addressed by the Architect and we should be resubmitting soon. Once the permit is issued, we can proceed with SDG&E and get the new power turned on. Most of the temporary buildings have been emptied and some have been hauled away. I want to thank all the shoot chairs for their cooperation in moving everything in the new storage facility. The Health Department is leaning towards allowing us to install leech lines since the water table in the campground has not risen over nine feet.

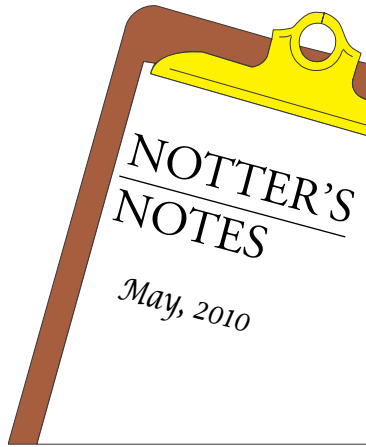
We removed all the rocks in the bank on the trap and 100 yard range. The large one on the pistol range was too large to be moved so we placed dirt over it. While we were doing this, Smitty rented a Gradall with a bucket on it and raised the 150 yard berm to about twenty feet. He also filled the area in on the right side so we do not impact the Oak trees behind it. All stations on the 150 yard range are now open. We will get Frontier Fence in to replace the fence on the right side. We had to remove it in order to get the equipment in there.

The committee for this year's BBQ is working really hard to make this one the best one yet. This is a difficult task since we have had many successful BBQ's in the past.

Please plan to attend the May general membership meeting so you can vote for your favorite candidates. It is very important to these people since they put in a lot of time managing the club for you. Please come and show your support.

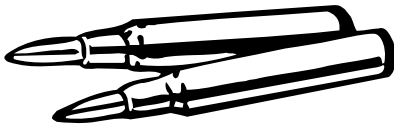

By now, most of you have heard the news via some method that Bud Smith has retired from being the Chief Range Master at EF&GA. Bud has not left the club. He noted that he is feeling tired and needs to rest have fun shooting for a while. Bud put in over three and one-half years as Chief Range Master (now being called Range Safety Officer) and has done a lot for our organization.

Bud developed a very effective team of Range Safety Officers; 90% of which are now NRA certified Range Safety Officers. Hours have been spent developing and rewriting our association rules as well as our range rules. We have a new Range Officer Manual that includes: Current Officers, Shoot Chairs, RSO Checklists, Emergency Procedures, Range Safety Officer incidents reports, Main Gate re-cycle instructions, Range Safety Officer daily duties guide, NRA Rules, EF&GA operating rules and range officer rules, administration rules, Pistol range rules, 100 yard and 150 yard range rules, and Trap Etiquette. A Walk thru manual has been developed for new members.

A training Range Safety Officer is now responsible for briefing the new members on all rules during the safety walk through process. A training team has been formed to train all new Range Safety Officers. All new Range Safety Officers go thru on the job training with a trainer prior to their beginning solo shifts. Bud conducted several Range Safety Officer NRA certification classes and several Range Safety Officer meetings to keep the team up to date on the latest developments. The latest Range Safety Officer meeting was held on March 20, 2010.

Bud also tracked all shifts worked by the Range Safety Officers in order to give credit to those that volunteer their time. Range Safety Officers now earn credit toward their dues for shifts worked. The responsibility of Chief Range Safety Officer is intense and it is a 24/7 - 365 days a year job and Bud did it very well.

The foregoing is a partial list of what Bud has accomplished in his tenure.

I have been asked to fill-in for Bud as Chief Range Safety Officer pending confirmation by the Board of Directors. I accepted the job as a challenge and I hope to keep the train that Bud developed "on the tracks". I also spoke to Bud at length regarding my taking over from him making sure that I would not loose a friend along the way.

I do not foresee any major changes in the operation of Range Safety in the near future. I ask, "if there are any of RSO's that would like help me move forward and become an Assistant Chief Range Safety Officer", I would like to hear from you.

We live in interesting times and there are going to be challenges in the future keeping our 2nd Amendment Rights.

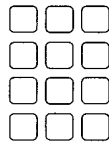

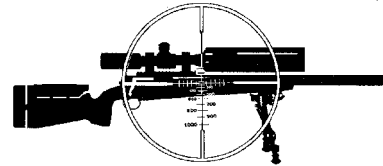
