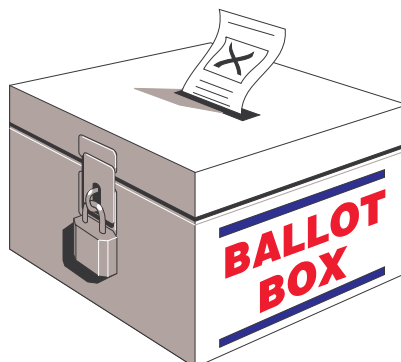

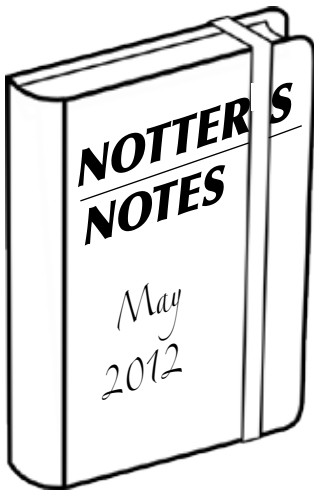

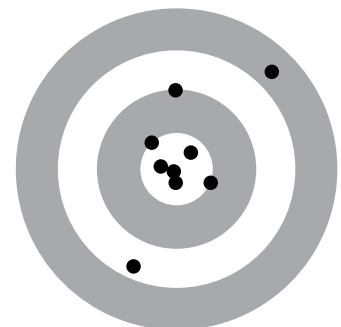

DEFENSIVE SHOTGUN TRAINING

Practice to be Prepared! In this class you will learn the techniques of firearms Presentation, Reloading, Terminal Effectiveness of your weapon and Defensive Accuracy. You will learn and begin to develop these skills in alternate shooting positions and alternate aiming techniques utilizing cover, concealment and a safety room. Previous Basic Shotgun Training would be beneficial but I will move at your learning pace! Students will be introduced to home environment scenarios where you will learn techniques of DEFENSIVE SHOTGUN SHOOTING of a Pump Action or Semi-Automatic shotgun while in the confines of a house where an intruder has gained entrance! Proper and effective ammunition will be discuss depending upon your shotgun and the accessories that are available for your model shotgun. Participants will be required to have: One box of each-- #4 shotgun Shells--Double-Ought (00) shells & 2 boxes of light 71/2 size Bird/Clay shells. This 8 hour class will be available on the First & Second Mondays of each month with class room and Live Fire on the same day.

HIGH POWER RIFLE MATCH

In an effort to improve participation levels and preserve the event from extinction, the high power rifle match will immediately undergo the following changes in format. In odd-numbered months the format will be the traditional 4-position (prone, sit, kneel, offhand) course of fire of 40 rds for score, unlimited sighters. In even-numbered months, the format will change to the International 3-position (prone, kneel, offhand) course of fire of 60 rds for score (20 each position) with unlimited sighters. Both matches have a 1-hr time limit. The prone match currently fired after the position match is hereby discontinued. Match fees are \$5 for members, \$10 for non-members. RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

We completed an NRA RSO Certification class on 07 April. We have twelve newly certified RSO's: Bill Cary, Dave Dekker, Mark Eller, Jon Ferdman, Richard Gentz, Hal Larsen, Ron Lewis, Mike Pierce, Tony Sportelli, Ray Varela, Pat Watson and Milko Zaplata. When you meet them on the range, give them a big "atta-boy".

There are two Casual Shooting Rule changes of note:

1. Junior members, 17 and under "may not bring guests, except for their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) or an adult with a signed permission slip from their parent or legal guardian".
2. Clarifying a rule on the Archery Range: Cross Bows are allowed, target tipped bolts (arrows) only. No hunting type tipped bolts or arrows.

I am going to climb onto my soapbox and pontificate for a while. EF&GA and Its' Members operate on a HONOR system. We assume that everyone is adult and has a moral code they work within. Our moral and ethical beliefs make up our individual Honor system. It is how we go about our daily activities. I know some will not agree with this, and that is okay. That is how our society operates. There are rules of all sorts that we have to work within in our daily lives: Traffic rules when we visit the Range, Rules that govern our work-a-day lives, Rules for how we treat others on the range and of course, our Range Rules that govern how we set-up targets and operate our firearms. We have to keep in mind that we are participating in an activity that can have dire consequences if not taken seriously and safely.

In the not too distant past, there have been some serious violations of our Range Rules. To wit, shooting produce on the trap fields, shooting wildlife, shooting at items that are not targets (i.e., the shotgun patterning stand, the fence posts at the end of the 150 yard range, rocks on the upper backstop area, the oak trees, flag poles, etc.): also, the setting of targets and target frames. Not paying attention to where bullets are going (striking the sand berm and ground on the pistol range). Oh, and let us not forget the holes shot in the Pistol Range baffle and overhead. All of those activities can lead to membership revocation.

In the future, we may have to invite those that blatantly disregard the safety of the range and those around them, to attend a Board Meeting and explain why they think they are special and do not have to abide by our range format. I realize we have a few rules and guidelines, but as we try to explain to the new members on their Safety Range Walk-About, the rules are there for a reason.

My "What the?" for the month. On Sunday, 01 April (no April Fool, but maybe...), our on duty RSO discovered a target frame on the Pistol Range that was a bit odd. Some member had taken extra target backing, affixed it under the existing backing and extended the overall backing to 48 inches. They then placed an 8 or 10 inch paper target in the center of each backing (correct placement for the paper target, but...). The lower target allowed bullets to strike the sand berms and ground. Many words have been written and spoken regarding target backing and target placement, for some reason it is not getting through to some of our members. Every new member for of years has had to attend a Safety Briefing and Range Walk-Through. During the Walk-Through, we stress target backing and target placement. Maybe a few membership revocations will get the message out to the rest of the membership.

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. Use only the correct type of ammunition for your firearm. When at the range with more than one firearm, use one at a time and when finished, store the firearm and its ammunition before using the next one. Check the type on the head stamp of the cartridge (i.e. 9mm Luger, 45 ACP, .243 Win. etc.) and the type is also stamped on the barrel of modern firearms.

There was an instance recently where two identical rifles were side by side on the bench with the ammunition out of box between the two. One rifle was a .375 H&H Mag. and the other was a 458 Lott. Several of the .375 H&H rounds were form fired in the .458 Lott. This was extremely dangerous.
