
Kudos



Editor's Note: Dan Noel is a former Jr shooter. He is a great example of what the Jr program can do for the kids that participate in the program.


The Escondido Fish & Game Association has been in existence much longer than I have been alive. Celebrating the 70th anniversary this year, it was established in 1946 and has grown into what we all know and love today. My name is Dan Noel, I was first introduced to the Junior Rifle Program and the world of firearms in 2006. I was 15 years old at the time, and quickly became a regular attending shooter. At that time, Ren Everett was running the program with the help of countless volunteers running support and on the line. Amazingly, Ren is still running the Jr Rifle program, 10 years later. From the program's volunteers and its curriculum of firearms safety thousands of America's youth have been positively instructed on firearm safety and shooting disciplines.

Now I am a 25 year old productive member of society who served in the Marine Corps, worked as an IT Director for the Department of Homeland Security, reenlisting in the Coast Guard this summer and soon to be married to my high school sweetheart. As I look back at my life and think of how I got to where I am today, being a young shooter at EF&G was a large contributing factor to set my life on the right path. The program taught and instilled in me more than just how to safely handle and fire a weapon (which later attributed to awards in the Marine Corps), it taught me discipline, respect and responsibility. It started with small things like the discipline to wake up early on a

weekend to help set up the range, to control motor skills to shoot effectively. Growing up without a Father figure, it was great



to learn the lessons of respect by watching the examples of the volunteers all those years. I understood the responsibility behind the safety rules and the fundamentals for coaching. All of this and more contributed to when I began coaching at the age of 17, and have been ever since.

Now the program has a dedicated safety class that each youngster sits in prior to stepping on the range. The Jr Marksmanship program is run by dedicated volunteers who all see the importance of the program for the youth. I have always enjoyed giving my Sundays to the program and the kids because instilling a safe and fun environment to teach and coach America's youth is needed in today's world. I want to thank EF&G for allowing me the outlet to continue coaching and for many of the skills that I have today! Semper Fi



Due to problems with people (members or otherwise) leaving the trap Ramada left unlocked and unsecured there will be a sign-in procedure change for any casual shooters who wish to use the Trap Range. In the future please use the sign-up sheets on the pistol range. Use "T" for trap, "P" for pistol or "A" for archery.

All RSOs are requested to save the date for a special meeting that is scheduled for May 21 starting at 0900 sharp. The agenda will be a number of issues specific to RSO conduct, along with rules to be observed and/or changed. Since we currently have about sixty-one active RSOs I would appreciate an email confirming your attendance to make certain we have adequate seating. Plan to bring your RSO manual with you.

While there are those who might disagree with me, our local rattlesnakes are beneficial critters we allowed to share the range with us. They do a lot more good than harm. None the less they can bite which seems to make people a bit nervous knowing they may be around. If you are one of these people, at least this is a good time of year to be somewhat more cautious. The warm weather does bring them out since we are entering their breeding season. I don't want anyone to get bitten. I encourage everyone to be aware of their surroundings and to warn their kids to treat these animals as they would treat a loaded firearm.

With all the nagging I do about range safety I have come to the conclusion that inadequate hearing protection may have left some of our members with the perception that leaving rounds in the chamber is OK when others are down range working on their targets. This is absolutely not the case! Nor is another situation, recently noted, is a tubular .22 rifle considered to be safe when there are still rounds in the tube. Mechanical safeties are something many folks actually believe that a firearm is "safe". Well it ain't quite true folks and I have seen a mechanical safety fail many times.

It always made me a bit nervous, but how many of you are aware that one of the finest pistols ever developed was actually designed to be carried loaded, cocked and locked? The first person to answer by sending me the correct answer via email will win genuine imitation plaque with their name on it naming him/her honorary RSO of the year!

Last but not least my friends I am looking to put together another First Aid class in the near future. If you wish to attend or your card is expired or nearly so, let me know by email so I can get an accurate count for the training booklets.

Casual Trap Sign-In Change

If you want to shoot trap using the spring target thrower or with your own launcher, you need to sign a Green-Sheet. Instead of leaving the green-sheet in the Trap Ramada, the new policy is to sign in on the green-sheet at the Pistol Range. Simply sign in the way that you normally would and put a 'T' in the Range column. This will make the sheet at the Pistol Range be for Archery, Pistol, and Trap. There will also be signs in the Trap Ramada windows noting the change as well.

generates the practical detailed experience necessary in successfully completing your caliber reloads.

Scheduling the second session will be at a mutually agreed to time and date. This scheduling will be completed at the 1st session.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title - This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.
