
The perimeter fence has been installed. According to the priority list the pistol range and the trap Ramada are next on the improvement list. However, we need your help!!

#### **RESULTS OF THE VOTE TO CHANGE BY-LAWS**

The membership voted overwhelmingly to approve changing the "New Range Fund" section of the by-laws to the "Range Improvement Fund". 414 ballots were returned; 366 ballots (88%) were in favor, 13 ballots (3%) were against, 34 ballots were returned blank (8%), and 1 ballot was void (less than 1%).




#### **THANKS FROM SD R& P ASSOCIATION**



#### Escondido Fish & Game Trapshooting Etiquette

- Make your entry far enough in advance, so that the office can properly process it. Clubs want shoots to start on time, but they can't if shooters don't sign up enough in advance so that squadding and record keeping can be done.
- 2. Be ready when your squad is called and also when it is your turn to shoot in the squad.
- Do not lean over each time to pick a shell out of a box on the ground, or to pick up empties. Have your shells where you don't have to stoop to get them.
- 4. Do not raise your gun until the shooter ahead of you fires.
- 5. Remain at your post until the 5<sup>th</sup> man has fired, then move to the next position at the end of the round. Stand facing the traps until the last man has fired the last shot. If you are leadoff, do not fire until all squad members are in position after each change.
- 6. Never load your gun before changing positions. When going from position 5 to position 1, turn to the right to avoid bumping guns with the man coming from post 4.
- 7. Load only one shell at a time except in doubles. Close the gun only when it is your turn to shoot. If a delay occurs, remove the shell.
- 8. Do not let ejected shells from your gun hit or annoy other shooters.
- Do no unnecessary talking when you are on the firing line. When you are not on the firing line, keep your voice down when you are around other squads which are shooting.
- 10. Time your shooting to establish rhythm in the squad. Call in a loud clear voice so there is no confusion about when the puller should respond.
- 11.Be a sportsman at all times. Be sure your competitors get what is due them, but do not be a target claimer.
- 12.Observe safety rules. Do not point your gun at another, even if it is unloaded. On the firing line, always keep your gun pointed toward the ground or the trap houses.
- 13.Shooters are always willing to have you look at their guns, if you ask permission first. Do not pick up another's gun from the gun rack and handle it without asking.

# R A N G E M A S T E RS O U N D O F F

The Range Master coverage seems to be dearly lacking lately. Where are all of the new NRA certified RSO's? Come on people. The safety and well being of all of us depends on the continued coverage of our Range Masters. Please go to the trap Ramada and fill in your name and time you can volunteer in the green Range Master sign up books. Remember that each book is for a different month so remember to fill in more than one book.

There is a Chief RSO class scheduled for November 5. The requirements are that you have to have completed and passed the NRA RSO certificate course and have been a certified RSO for a minimum of one (1) year prior to applying for the CRSO class. Also you will be required to have your RSO student materials (workbook) at the CRSO class. For more information, please contact Frank Alessio.

Range Masters: This is the time of year when non-members like to try their luck at getting onto our property to site in their hunting rifles, etc. <u>ALL</u> Range Masters are charged with the responsibility of checking both current membership cards and photo I.D. Please remember that only two (2) guests per member are allowed on the property unless prior arrangements have been made through the Board of Directors.

Members: The Range Masters will be checking your current membership card and photo I.D. You are responsible for having these items in your possession. In the event you do not have these two items, you will not be permitted to use the property and the Range Master will submit an incident report to the Chief Range Master.

End of Year presentation: For those new Range Masters, we have a tradition here which gives each Range Master an opportunity to win a new Ruger custom rifle at the general member meeting in December. Each time you stand a duty day and sign in on the range green sheets, you are giving yourself one chance to win. Here's how it works. The green sign in sheets are collected all year and at the end of the year the names are tabulated. You receive one raffle ticket entry for each time you have stood a duty post. The tickets are all placed in a revolving drum and one lucky winner is drawn. See how easy that is. The more duty posts you stand, the more entries you have for the drawing.

We have been repairing and replacing target frames at an excessive rate lately. We have been getting reports of paper plates being stapled directly to the wood frames in some cases. I don't see how you could not realize the damage to the frame being caused by this practice. If you must use a paper plate for a target, please be sure it is centrally positioned on the cardboard center of the target frame. Range Masters, please see that all shooters are hanging their targets in the proper locations within the frame structure. Remember that target placement is also critical to insure that the rounds are impacting the backstops. This is particularly true on the pistol range.

The holiday season is once again upon us. On behalf of all the Range Masters, we want to extend a safe and fun Thanksgiving.

Range Master of the Month: Kenneith Notter is our Range Master of the Month. Kenneith is a past President, avid cowboy shooter, NRA Patron and staunch supporter of the Friends of the NRA as well as chairperson for many of the local NRA functions. Kenneith's leadership over the years has been most beneficial to the development and survival of EF&GA. Next time you see (Devil Jack) Kenneith at the range, shake his hand and say thank you for all you have done.
