

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Members and Range Officers,

The Range Master calls out- "Cease fire, cease fire!" What should you do? What should you say? How should you react? Here are the commands a member, guest, or Range Officer should use to take control of the situation to insure safety on the range.

- <u>Unload your guns, drop the mag, open the cylinder, and open the bolt.</u>
- All Actions open
- <u>Guns down</u> on the table or bench with the barrel pointed down range
- Everyone move back behind the yellow line- do not handle guns or ammo
- The RSO will check the line, he will announce the line is clear and the range is cold. If a range officer is not on the range the person calling the cease fire will clear the range and declare it cold.

Please remember when a safety issue is observed on the range, **anyone at anytime** can call a cease fire. Let's all be safe and help our fellow members.

I'm pleased to report our Range Safety Officer team is growing. We have a number of members that have heard my pleas for help and have stepped up and volunteered. Dave Tennant, Jay Zimmitt, Mike Tombrinck, Tom Arendell, Dick Cross, Pete Cypher, Gary Farrar, Nelson Jones. These new range safety officers all volunteered to stand a minimum of one shift per month and some will stand several shifts. Welcome and thanks. The Range Training Team should be complete in 30 days. Any Active Range Officers standing regular shifts with an interest to become Training Officers -- please give me a call. The 150 yard range and the new pistol range are open and will require additional weekend range officers. This Association will need two a.m. range officers and two p.m. officers on the weekends to manage all the ranges. Help your Association and volunteer. The Range Safety Officer is the MOST IMPORTANT PERSON on our ranges and deserves the highest degree of respect. We just need more of them.

In every organization there are always a few members who think the rules do not apply to them. It is not for me to understand these folks, but it is the responsibility of our range safety officers to enforce our Association range rules and administrative rules. Last month a member gave the gate combination to his brother. This violation includes grounds for termination from our Association. A number of members still think they can shoot a pistol at less than 50 yards on the rifle range. (Sorry, this is also against the rules and the member may be facing a meeting in front of the Board of Directors.) If anyone persists in breaking the rules after a range officer has explained them, that member must be prepared to hand over his or her Association membership card to the range safety officer. That member will need to come to a Board meeting and explain his or her actions to the Board and appeal to have their membership card returned. If you do not agree with the range rules or administrative rules, please come to a Board meeting and state your case. Rules have been changed in the past and this Board is interested in your comments and recommendations.

EF&GA has one of the finest recreational shooting facilities in San Diego County. I am very proud to be associated with this fine organization.

Range Master of the month is Jim Galvin with 40 shifts this year. Thanks, Jim! It's all about our attitudes- every member can make a positive contribution.
