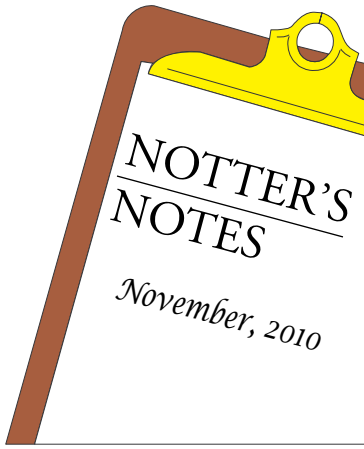

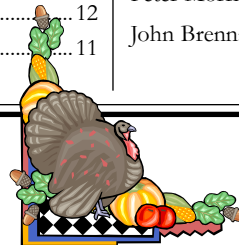

R A N G E M A S T E R S O U N D O F F

Daylight Savings Time ends on Saturday the 6th, Pacific Standard Time begins the 7th.

The holiday season is rapidly approaching. Halloween is right around the corner. After that, comes, Thanksgiving Day, Hanukkah and Christmas Day. I wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving and holiday season. I realize this is a bit early, but I may not be writing the Sound-Off for December and maybe January. I will find some lucky volunteer to do it for me.

Situational awareness is a term used by some and I find it appropriate for today. Being aware of our surroundings; the who, what, when, where and why of it. Being aware of who is around us. Do they appear to know what they are doing with their firearm? Are they paying attention to what they are doing? Are they “fooling” around with their firearms trying to impress their buddy or girl friend. Do they appear to have good control of their firearm? What is going on around you. Are there a lot of folks milling around aimlessly? Is there a lot of “brass” on the ground around the shooting area? Are the shooters around you paying attention as well? Are people handling firearms during a cease fire condition? Are people across the yellow line during a cease fire that should not be? Is the shooting situation safe?

I bring this up because for some reason, be it the time of year, the phase of the moon, or whatever, some of our fellow members are not paying attention to other shooters and our basic safety and shooting rules. There have been many instances of bullets skipping on the ground at the pistol range. Someone shot the Shotgun Patterning Stand from the pistol range, twice. Shooters tossed miss-fired (live) .22 cal. bullets on the ground in front of the shooting line. Live center fire bullets have been found on the ground as well. Live 12 ga. shot gun shells have been found laying about the parking area. Apparently a box of 12 ga. shells were left on a bumper or whatever, then ended up spread around the intersection of Lake Wolford Road and Guejito Road. Range bags, shooting glasses, clothing, chronographs, etc., are being left behind when shooters leave the range. Rocks above the second deer trail at the 100 yard range have been targeted and shot . There are twenty-plus bullet holes in the new pistol range ramada. There are bullet holes in the fence posts by the berm at the 150 yard range and in the trees and signs. I could go on, but I am sure you can think of many other situations as well.

Oh, I almost forgot my favorite, people leaving their guns behind when they go home. Happened just a few days ago (early October); someone left their rifle at the range when they left!!!

Range Safety Tip of the Month – During a cease fire, “Range Cold” situation, no one moves in front of the yellow line except the individual setting up, taking down or replacing targets. Do not handle any firearm for any reason. When the cease fire is called, actions are opened and unloaded (with an “Open Chamber Indicator” in place preferred), magazines removed, the firearm placed on the bench with the muzzle pointing down range. Then move behind the yellow line and wait for further instructions.

Last month I noted and asked - We have five (5), red, “live fire” lines at the range. Do you know where they all are? One red line is on the archery range, pistol range, 100 and 150 yard rifle ranges and the air gun range inside the Clun House. There are really six, the sixth being somewhat invisible. They are at the front of each trap pad, from the corners of each trap pad to adjacent trap pad to the side boundary of the trap range.

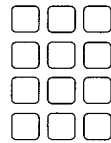
