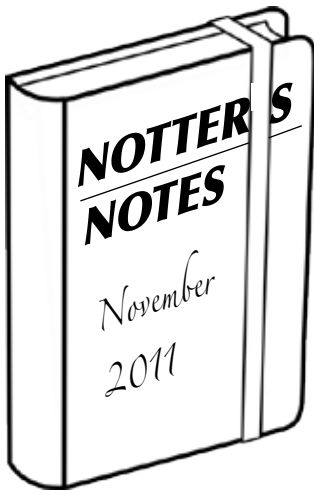
Thanks to the Santa Margarita Gun Club for donating two shooting jackets to our Jr. Rifle Program.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Daylight Savings Time ends 06 November 2011. Remember to set your clock(s) back one hour.

As you read this, the main backstops will have been lead mined or real close to being completed. The mining crew works at night so as to not interfere with normal range functions. We need to do this every once in a while to keep the lead from becoming a problem.

Regarding the green sign in sheets, you will see a minor change to them in the near future. Gone is the big block letters that stated "Please Print". Column one now states "name: please print" and please do. Column two "category", is for you to state "M" for member or "G" for guest. Column three is "time in", column four is "time out".

Column five is for the range you are on, "P" for pistol, "100" for the 100 yard range, etc. Column six "RSO" is new; the on duty RSO checks that box, making identification a bit easier. Column seven, "signature/remarks", is where you should sign your name and note any remarks you may have.

The green sheets are picked up most every day and stored in a box in the trap ramada. I review the sheets and record the duty shifts our Range Safety Officers complete. We give credit for shifts worked which is used for the Christmas Giveaway and other purposes. I review the sheets a second time and record the number of shooters and participants in various events and on each range for each day of the month creating a "Range Usage Report". It is a bit of work, but I want to make sure our RSO's and CRSO's are credited for the time they put in voluntarily.

We are actively recruiting for new Range Safety Officers. If you have a few hours each month you could spend working on the range, give becoming a RSO some thought. There is a training shift where you spend some time with one of our Trainers learning the "ins and outs" of being a RSO. Then, to be considered "active status", you put in one five hour shift a month. The RSO's and CRSO's check the security of the range, its facilities and ensure safety on the range as well. It is a great way to meet other members, learn a lot about the shooting sports and make new friends. During my tenure as an RSO and CRSO, I have learned a great deal about firearms and made some really great friendships.

I feel I need to repeat myself: Steel core bullets are banned at our range, except for a sanctioned rifle shoot. The steel core in the bullet can create a spark when hitting a rock which could start a fire. Some "Wolf" ammunition is steel core. When in doubt, touch the bullet with a magnet. If it reacts to the magnet, it probably has a steel core, do not use it. Steel shot is also banned on our range.

My "What the ...?" for the month. The sand "speed bump" bullet trap on the pistol range is intended to stop the bullet that impacts the ground and otherwise would have skipped or ricocheted into the hill or over it. It is not a backstop, as at least one of our fellow members was using it and thought that is why it is there.

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. Know your target and what is behind it. In almost all cases, you must be sure that there is something that will serve as a backstop to capture bullets that go through or miss the target. On our facility, the hill at the end of the ranges or the berm at the end of the 150 yard range act as our backstops and capture the bullets. The sand trap on the pistol range at about the 35 yard line is for capturing errant bullets that would skip off the ground otherwise. It is not a backstop.
