

(President, Congressman, etc...)




We had a great turnout, there were about a dozen kids competing to impress Sparks with their kits and skills, and of course some really cool prizes.

Challenge

Ms. Bresnahan was holding a pouch of throwing knives. Sparks wanted to try them out so we went to the throwing block at the other end of the shooting range. It is thrilling to make a knife stab into the slab of palm wood. We threw for a while and then we walked back to the club house.

A little while later some more kids came and Sparks gave us an interesting and informative lecture about what you should have in your bug-out bag. Afterward, we had a shelter building contest consisting of three teams. Each team had two team members. Sparks gave us a minute to make our plan, and then he gave us 15 minutes to build our shelter.

Shortly afterwards we had a water boiling contest. We stayed in our teams of two. Sparks had us make a fire with the fire-making items in our bugout bags. Once we had a fire going we could go and collect things off the ground to burn. To win, we had to boil water in eight minutes or less.

After this we cleaned up and chose our prizes. Some of the prizes were an ivory-handled fire starter, two packs of throwing knives, a large box of 22-ammunition, two wrist rockets, knives of various shapes and sizes, and a first-aid kit. The top prize was a pellet pistol. It came with a shooting bag that had lubricant and pellets for the gun. After the bug-out bag challenge, we walked out to get to "eyes" and "ears" for the trap shoot!

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

As most of you, I am quite certain you are well aware, the upcoming Presidential Election is up and coming. It is not my place in this publication to tell you for whom to vote. However I can tell you unequivocally, that the wrong choice will have disastrous consequences for the Constitution as we know it.

I have recently become aware of some range rule violations that need to be addressed. Junior members are issued a card which allows them access to the range along with an adult supervisor. Junior membership does not allow the junior member to bring any guests other than the adult who is there for supervision only. Non-member adult supervisors are not authorized to do any shooting themselves with the possible exception of correcting a given situation. Members who bring minors, as guests or as junior members, are still required to provide direct supervision to the minor when the minor is on the firing line. A situation where a minor is shooting at one position and Dad, for example, is shooting at the next position is not allowed. This would not be considered direct supervision. Please do not argue with the Duty RSO who makes you obey the rules. The most important thing we do is to teach our young ones safe firearm handling and learning safe handling rarely happens by osmosis.

For quite some time RSOs have been using the green sheet calendar to sign up for range duty. Slowly but surely we are moving to a direct on-line sign up. Accordingly, I have arranged for a mandatory meeting for all RSOs on December 11th from 0900 to 1200. I believe that you will find the process exceptionally easy. None the less a little formal instruction cannot hurt. I anticipate that there will be extra time available to address other issues of mutual concern. If you have a smart phone or tablet please bring it with you.

Check your first-aid cards. If it is expired or about to, let me know by email at the earliest opportunity. I am planning to arrange for a class sometime in January. All RSOs need to have current first-aid certification and this is the time to get current.

Final word of caution! Rattlers have been spotted and situation probably will not improve much for a while. Remember this is a wildlife preserve and they are not to be killed. In depth research reveals that I have not been able to find a single record showing a person being chased down and being bitten. Keep your eyes open and walk away. You can always notify me and I will move them (or you) to a safer location.

How to place a classified ad in the newsletter

Please help to keep the classified section easy to read and well organized. There is no cost as long as you are an EF&GA member in good standing. Classified ads run for ONE newsletter (one month). If you want to repeat an ad for another month (with price adjustments, etc...) simply re-submit the ad request via e-mail.

Please submit requests for classified ads via email to newsletter@escondidofishandgame.com and be sure to double-check for spelling and grammar errors.

It may sound obvious but requests for classifieds are frequently received with not enough information to be useful to a reader. There are 5 main components of a classified ad:

Category – Most classifieds fall into one of 3 categories, 'For Sale', 'Wanted', or 'Lost & Found'.

Subject/Title – This will appear in bold in the advertisement. This should be short (2 or 3 words) and concise.

Description – This is the body of the advertisement and can be a few sentences but not more than a paragraph. Abbreviations appear cryptic and are not recommended unless they are well known acronyms.

Price – A specific dollar amount as well as qualifiers give the reader important information. For example, "\$600 or Best Offer, Buyer pays DROS, Will consider trades"

Contact Info – This should be a name AND a phone number (including area code) and/or an e-mail address.


