need some new people to help out instead of all the old guys, including myself, who always show up. This is usually a fun time and we usually plan on feeding you well.


The old well has gone dry! We are working feverishly with the county to come up and inspect the new electrical distribution so we can turn the new well on. We have selected the area between the new building and the fence next to the camping grounds. They will have dust control. There are still a few obstacles to go through but you can be assured that I have the staff and support from your Board of Directors and officers to tackle these obstacles with complete success.

#### Two Anti-Gun Bills Head to Governor's Desk in California Monday, September 14, 2009

On Friday, September 11, the California Assembly passed Assembly Bill 962 by a 44-31 vote. AB962 now joins Senate Bill 585 on the desk of Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger (R) where they await his consideration.

AB962 requires individuals purchasing ammunition be fingerprinted and registered at the time of sale, mandates that dealers keep these records and make them available for inspection by the California Department of Justice. Ammunition retailers would also have to store ammunition in such a manner that it would be inaccessible to purchasers. Finally, mail order ammunition sales are prohibited under AB962. Over twenty years ago, Congress abolished similar requirements because ammunition sales records were found to be useless for solving crimes. AB962 is a dire threat to our Second Amendment rights in the Golden State.

SB585 would prohibit the sale of firearms and ammunition on the property or inside the buildings that comprise the Cow Palace in Daly City, just outside of San Francisco. Simply put, SB585 is a stepping-stone to banning gun shows on all publicly-owned property in California.

Please contact Governor Schwarzenegger TODAY and respectfully urge him to veto AB962 and SB585.

#### The Right of Responsibility


Forty years ago, Richard Nixon came up with a phrase that perfectly described a broad cross-section of America. He called it the "silent majority." These days, our media elites just refer to "the mob."

Gun owners don't make up 100 percent of the silent majority, but I think you'd be hard-pressed to find too many gun-control advocates among them. After all, these everyday Americans understand that gun-control advocates aren't interested in personal responsibility-if they were, they'd actually support competent and responsible use of firearms, instead of chanting the "less guns" mantra they've been repeating for decades. The silent majority understands that responsible behavior isn't something that can be legislated into existence, but it can easily be legislated away. The proof can be found in the crime-ridden streets of Los Angeles; Chicago; Washington, D.C.; New York; Boston; and other cities where gun-banners have made it culturally unthinkable and almost legally impossible to own a gun. The damage that attitude has caused can be found on those same streets, where criminals roam with impunity and the law-abiding are defenseless, helpless and increasingly hopeless.

But people are tired of being told they can't live their lives without more government intrusion and less individual liberty. They're tired of being told that America has to resign itself to being something less than the best. They don't want to hear that they are the problem, and the solution is sacrificing freedoms instead of sacrificing for them. They know that in order for this country to fulfill its promise, we need responsible Americans. They're speaking out by the millions for their right to keep and bear arms, and their right of personal responsibility and self-defense.

### RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

During my walk-abouts wearing my red shirt and hat, I am honored to talk with many of our members and listen to their comments and yes, complaints. The comments are almost always directed to how well the range is looking and how much they like and appreciate the improvements that are on-going. We have one of the finest facilities in the area and I agree. The conversations usually turn to what is next on the list of to do items and I pass on what I know. Of particular importance to all and especially our ladies is that the new rest rooms can not come fast enough. When this appears in the newsletter, the restrooms should be open for business. One comment that is my own, "the restrooms belong to everyone and I hope we all help to keep them clean". The Association does not employ any full time staff, therefore, keeping things neat and tidy falls on us all.

I would like to thank those of you who replace cardboard backing on the target frames. If you plan on replacing cardboard backing, please note the following. The top of the cardboard should be even with the top of the frame if no cross bar is at the top. If a cross bar is at the top, place the cardboard a couple of inches below the cross bar. This will help keep stray rounds from hitting the cross bar. If you use the cardboard that is supplied in the Trap Ramada, first cut off the 'ears' at each end, then cut the cardboard in half length wise. This will yield two pieces that measure 23 inches by 24 inches. Using ½ inch staples to mount to the frame works the best. The target frame sizes have been extensively studied and are designed to accommodate cardboard that is 24 inches by 24 inches. The noted 23 inch by 24 inch works very well. The pistol range and 100 yard range frames are 7 foot, 6 inches tall. The 150 yard range frames are shorter and the shorter of the two are for prone shooting only. Please, please do not move target frames from one range to another.

The complaints I hear are usually directed toward their being 'too many rules'. I often agree that we have many rules for each range and the facility in general. The rules that are posted on the ranges and in various handouts were developed with one idea in mind, Safety. Safety is first and foremost at the range and as it should be in all of our daily activities. I often tell my wife and friends that "a little anarchy is good for the soul": but not at the range. Here we need to be cognizant of our surroundings, our fellow shooters and guests. Remember rule number one – the firearm is always loaded.

General observations. Remember to retrieve your target frame when you are through shooting. If you move a shooting bench back from the firing line, put it back when you are done. The speed limit within the facility is 5 mph, slow down; the dust cloud is annoying and there are folks walking around the grounds. Clean up your brass. If you see loose paper floating around, please pick it up. One target frame per shooter (I have seen one shooter setting up as many as four frames – why ?). Make sure your target is set up keeping in mind that the bullet needs to impact the back stop. Check to make sure you are impacting the back stop. On the 150 yard range, it is critical that bullets impact the back stop, not the oak trees. Shooting at rocks is just plain dumb. Shot gunners, pick-up your hulls (especially you pot shooters, hulls do not belong on the 100 yard range, in the rose garden, in the creek, etc.). Do not smoke on the firing line (if you do smoke, please go down wind from others). Cigarette and cigar 'butts' belong in the green receptacles. Put your trash, empty coffee cups, soda bottles, etc., in the proper place. Sign in and out on the green sheets, members and guests.

I would like to thank those new and current members that have stepped up to become new Range Safety Officers and to thank those that currently serve in that capacity. I would also like to thank the members in general for the kind and friendly reception I receive when asking for membership cards and photo identification. I ask everyone for membership cards and photo identification beginning 01 July and continue to do so until I start remembering those that I have already checked. I ask for your patience with the RSO's in this endeavor.

A personal note: I was interviewed by the North County Times a few weeks back regarding the 'open carry' movement. My comments that were published are my own. I was not speaking for the Association or any of its members. I do not recall identifying myself as member of Escondido Fish and Game Association to the reporter. If anyone took offense, I apologize.
