### PRESIDENT'S VIEWPOINT

Hello Everyone,

Hope this message finds all of you in good health. It has been six weeks now since I started performing maintenance at the range. The berms are now all weed-wacked. I would like to thank Jerry Everett, Craig Rogers, Mark Pederson, and JW Pyles for helping me out the one day on the 150 yard berm. That one was tough because it was not mowed during the work party this spring. I also want to thank Al Ardale for helping me out occasionally and especially when we cleaned up the front entry. It is good that we have this

done before the fire season.


There is not much to report on the Range Enhancement Project. We need approval for the Hydrology Study and that should be it! We had a few minor corrections on this after we submitted and they are being addressed. For those who don't know what a Hydrology study is, I will explain. When acquiring a permit for building in the vicinity of a flood plain, (the creek on the North side of the property flowing to the lake), a hydrology study has to take place to prove that the building in question will not be flooded in the event of a 100 year flood. This may sound silly to some of you, but I had to have one done on one of my development projects. The results of the study indicated that the water would not flood the building; in fact, it would not rise beyond the perimeter chain link fence. They had to include all the tributaries for a mile east of the property when they did the calculations.

We have encountered a couple of mud wasp hives. Kurt and I, (mostly Kurt since I don't like the stings) have addressed this issue and hope to have resolved the problem. Kurt sprayed the hives and I buried one of them. We put out traps along the 150 yard berm and it seems to be working fine. One hive is on the right side of the opening in the berm going onto the 150 yard range and the other is between the 50 yd and 75 yd. butts. Remember, these wasps have underground hives and are not very visible.

For customers that don't know, Smokey's Lake Wohlford Cafe is a designated agent for CA Fish and Game for Fishing Licenses. The DFG will be installing their new ALDS (Automated License Data System) at the cafe sometime between Nov 18th and the 1st week of Jan. 2011. The ALDS is an internet based computer system, the POS (Point of Sale) equipment consists of a 15" touch screen monitor with an embedded CPU, a magnetic card reader, a bar code scanner and a direct thermal printer. The ALDS will print licenses instantly on a highly durable paper and eliminate the need for the pre-printed licenses inventory. The ALDS provides License Agents unlimited inventory and the ability to sell all recreational items including several items that are only available from DFG offices.

At Range Master Appreciation Day, we honor those Range Safety Officers' that "step up" and go above and beyond the normal duties. You see the Range Safety Officers' about the range checking membership cards, identification, and checking to make sure the range safety rules are being adhered to. There is a bit more to the job than that.

The Range Safety Officers' check the security of all locked doors and the perimeter fence. They also perform the following duties: pick up the previous days green sheets and make sure there is an ample supply for future days; check the target frames and replace the cardboard if necessary; rebuild worn out target frames and build new frames; straighten up the target frames and put them in their proper place; clean up the range by sweeping up the brass and putting trash in its proper place that members neglect to do; move the bench rest tables back to their proper place when our members forget; check the first aid kits for proper supplies and work at Range Clean Up days. Only move forward of the red line to put up and take down targets and target stands during a cease fire and the range is "cold".
