
As I write this, Range Master

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF





Well, summer is drawing to a close and fall is beginning to appear. The fire danger is becoming extreme and we all need to be aware of the dangers. On that note, please do not shoot ammunition with steel core bullets and steel shot: They are banned at our range, except for a few rifle shoots. The steel core in the bullet can create a spark when hitting a rock which could start a fire. If a fire should start in our area, please call 9-1-1 and stand by to open the gate when fire services arrive.

On Sunday, August 21, we had a range clean up day (due to publishing deadlines, some information is a bit late). Again this time we raked the trap fields and backstop from the pistol range to the end of the 100 yard range. A little other clean up was done as well. This time around there were 25 members out there working in the hot sun. A hot dog, chili, coleslaw, chips and cookies lunch was provided. There were over 10 RSO's out in the field again this

time around. We have 1500 members in general, "where were you?" We could use some new help for the next clean-up day.

From the San Diego Union-Tribune, Wednesday, September 14, 2011 "A guard on duty near a perimeter fence at the state prison (Otay Mesa) was wounded in the head about 8:30 a.m. Tuesday by what appeared to be a ricochet round from the nearby shooting range, authorities said...the officer was treated and released in good condition..." The RSO's and some members constantly talk about and remind other members about ricochet and skipping bullets, especially at the pistol range. Please note where you rounds (bullets) go down range. At the pistol range, maybe aim off to the side of the target frame once to see where your bullets really go.

On Sunday, 18 September, EF&GA hosted its annual Range Master Appreciation Day, RMAD. Again this year, the event was open to Active Duty Range Safety Officers'. We honored several individuals this year again. The committee had a really difficult task of naming our Range Safety Officer/Range Master and Chief Range Safety Officer/Range Master for 2010-2011. There were and still are several individuals that stood out for their work at the range. Unfortunately, we could only name one in each category. Steve Willer is our Range Safety Officer/Range Master of the Year and Jay Zimmett is our Chief Range Safety Officer/Range Master. Lee Allen was awarded the "Above and Beyond" for 2010-2011 for his work in helping our RSO's get started using our interactive calendar that is used for scheduling shifts at the range.

Beginning Tuesday, 16 August (a late entry), we offered First Aid/ CPR training for our Active Duty Range Safety Officers'. Approximately 25 Active Range Safety officers' and Chief Range Safety officers' attended the course. Marshall Goddard instructed the certification classes. Marshall is a certified instructor and has been training folks for a long time. Marshall tailored the course to our needs at the range.

My "What the?" for the month. Remember to check the area around where you were shooting and where you placed firearms and equipment. Recently, there have been range bags, ammunition, clothing and firearms left at the range. We do not have a storage facility to house this "stuff" waiting for someone to contact us looking for their stuff. Hopefully, if something is left behind, it finds its way into the hands of one of our RSO's and safely handled.

Range Safety Tip Of The Month. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot. When holding a gun, rest your trigger finger outside the trigger guard alongside the gun. Until you are actually ready to fire, do not touch the trigger. Basically keep your finger outside the trigger guard until the firearm is presented to the target. This is especially important at the pistol range. If you are pointing the hand gun up getting ready to shoot, then bringing it down to address the target, keep your finger outside the trigger guard until actually ready to shoot. Check out holes in the pistol ramada and baffle to see what I am writing about. Last count, over 50 holes in the ceiling and baffle.
