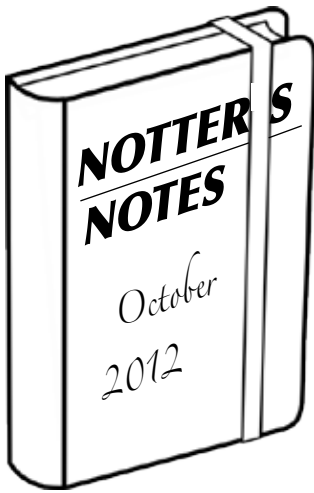

The supervising adult, unless an active member in good standing, is prohibited from shooting {except for instructional purposes}.

2. Junior members may not bring guests, except for their parent(s), legal guardian(s), or an adult with a permission slip from the parent or legal guardian.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Remembering September 11, 2001. A day that changed us all.

Well, summer is over and autumn begins on Saturday, September 22nd. Seems like only a week ago summer was just getting started. The days are getting shorter.

A reminder that range shooting hours are from 7:00 a.m. to “local” sunset, except for sanctioned events, specifically Trap. “Local” sunset is when the Sun sets behind whatever mountain ridge is appropriate for that time of year. The Sun sets at different locations through the year. We have lights under the pistol range and 150 yard range ramadas. They are not, I repeat not, for dusk or night shooting. If you should encounter someone(s) shooting after sunset, please note who they are and

pass it on to me or any Board Member. Shooting after sunset, except for the two Trap days is a violation of our lease agreement.

Wondering around in my head, an “interesting journey”...If only women smelled like Hoppe’s Number 9. 1360, the first firing of a gun from the shoulder in Europe. 1630, the Flintlock with a more reliable ignition system. 1836, Samuel Colt invents and patents the Paterson Colt revolver, uses a percussion cap. 1874, the Winchester. 1880’s, smokeless powder. A firearm has only two enemies, rust and politicians.

When someone tells you where you are missing a target, nod politely and ignore them. If they can tell you why you are missing, listen carefully. (Borrowed from Field and Streams’ ‘The Total Gun Manual’)

At the 06 Sept. ’12 EF&GA Board of Directors’ Meeting, the rule passed at the 02 Aug. ’12 Board of Directors’ Meeting “Any person under the age of 12 is limited to .22 caliber only while shooting on the pistol range”, was rescinded.

The new membership/gate proximity cards will be showing up. To open the gate, the card is moved close to or touching the new box and the gate opens. The card will also be the new membership card. It is the size of a credit card and reading from left to right;

- . a color photograph of the member with their name below
- . EF&GA logo along the top with the member number below
- . NRA logo
- . along the bottom "Property of Escondido Fish and Game Association"

For next year and beyond, there will be an oval holographic sticker with the year printed on it. This being the first year, there is no date sticker. Additional information regarding the new card, when you can have your photo taken and new card issued will be informed elsewhere in the newsletter or by some other form of communication.

Range Safety Tip of the Month. A rule I try to live by and have drilled into my kids. “Always assume every firearm is loaded. Every time you see a firearm, pick up a firearm, or point a firearm, assume that it is loaded and treat it accordingly”.

A reminder to the Range Safety Officers, Tuesday, October 16th is “National Boss Day”. I accept gratuities.
