

Using single-shot air pistols, both shooters can take as many shots as they need to clear their three pigs, and the first shooter to knock down the chicken after clearing their pigs wins the round. Match winner is best out of three rounds. Kind of like History Channel's "Top Shot" final except you get a couple of chances to redeem yourself after a bad first round! Combines all the marksmanship fundamentals and fun aspects of regular silhouette shooting with the elements of rapid reload and target acquisition and knowing your competitor is getting closer to that chicken faster than you are! RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

As many of you may remember, we just recently finished our mining operation and recovered many thousands of pounds of lead. Most of the recovered metal was lead shot which can be recycled and readily sold to shotgun reloaders. This is a good thing. On the other hand one of our RSO's reports that a member was pulling bullets from a berm that turned out to be armor piercing rounds. If you didn't know it before know it now. This type of round is strictly forbidden on the EF&GA range. My guess is that they were 30.06 military ammo because it is available through a number of sources. Now I am not particularly worried about armor being shot up, but they can easily strike a rock and start a fire.

If you are using ammunition that attracts a magnet leave it at home. RSOs are authorized to test any ammunition that may be suspect with a magnet. If it fails the test you will be asked to remove the ammo from the range immediately.

Our Standard target backs measure 24" x 24". An unknown individual(s) replaced a number of our backings with 24" x 48" backings! This means that the frame gets shot up needlessly and that is a no no also! I suspect that some of our members simply cannot read. The only other explanation is that some members refuse to read the plainly stated rules on target placement. We may have to start a new bulletin segment called "Guess Who Ignored the Target Rules This Month". Then we can all laugh and see who doesn't want to follow range rules. Finally, fifteen minutes of fame. Last but not least we have scheduled the next first aid class for November 3rd. Time will be from 0900 sharp to about 1300 hours. 
