

DOVE SEASON OPENS ON SEPTEMBER 1


Enjoy the upcoming Dove season, but remember to clean up after yourself. Don't leave fired shells, drink containers, empty shot shell boxes, etc. behind.

NRA Wraps Up 21st Youth Hunter Education Challenge

NRA is the largest pro-hunting organization in the world, and one of the most effective ways NRA helps protect the sport is through its Youth Hunter Education Challenge (YHEC).

The 21st annual NRA International YHEC brought several hundred of the nation's most serious young hunters and their families to Pennsylvania's northern tier for a weeklong test of hunting and shooting skills. The event, held July 24-28 in Mansfield, Pa., marked the culmination of the most advanced youth hunting program in North America.

In all, nearly 300 participants from 15 states participated in four shooting events and four responsibility tests. Participants fired muzzleloaders and .22-caliber rifles at NRA-approved action targets on courses designed to simulate hunting conditions, shotguns at clay targets on a multiple-station hunter's clays course, and in the archery event, shot at three-dimensional game targets on a wooded course designed to replicate actual bowhunting situations. A new element to this year's YHEC was a written test in the muzzleloader rotation, which tested youngsters on the safe use and maintenance of muzzleloading firearms.

Participants in the challenge are divided into two age classifications, senior (age 15-18) and junior (age 14 and under), and two categories, individual and team. In each event, the highest possible score for an individual is 300; for a five-member team, 1,500. Overall, the highest possible score for an individual is 2,400, while the highest possible team score is 12,000.

For the second year in a row, groups from North Carolina claimed first place in both the junior and senior team categories, and, for the first time in five years, first-time champions were crowned in both the junior and senior individual categories.

Youths from Forbush Elementary School and Forbush High School, both located in East Bend, N.C., took home the junior and senior team titles. The Forbush teams are both part of the Yadkin County School District, which allows hunter education and YHEC as extra-curricular activities. North Carolina, a traditionally strong hunting state, had a winning team in 1985, YHEC's first year, and has an enviable record of accomplishment in the program over the years.

Forbush senior team coach David Moxley has worked with local YHEC teams for two decades. He said of his team, "I'm so proud of them. Our kids put in a lot of long, hard work on all eight events. We focus just as hard on the responsibility events as we do on shooting."

In the individual standings, Brad Landis, 18, from Souderton, Pa., was crowned the overall senior champion. After finishing second overall to five-time YHEC champion Devon Babcock a year ago, Landis worked overtime throughout the past year to claim top honors in 2006. "I've been practicing all year, I didn't stop," said Landis. "The month before the competition I studied and practiced my shooting everyday. YHEC has taught me discipline and the ability to shoot and hunt the right way."

Top honors in the junior individual category went to Matthew Brooks, 14, of Fair Grove, Mo. Brooks, whose father Jerrold is a YHEC coach, practiced two to three hours each day to make himself a better hunter. "When my parents were home, I'd practice with my firearms. When they weren't home, I'd study," he said. "I learned to use a compass and shoot accurately with a variety of guns. And the studying and memory skills that I learned have helped with my schoolwork."

RANGEMASTER SOUNDOFF

By RAY & NEIL

We apologize for missing last month's newsletter.

The event everyone has waited for has finally arrived, the opening of the 2006-2007 hunting season. As most of you know, this is that time of year when the one time seasonal shooter comes to the property to get that special rifle sighted in, and he or she will be needing some special attention from you Range Masters in order to insure a successful and rewarding season. Sometimes a small bit of advice on how to best utilize the bench rest is all they might need. Whatever the need might be, your job is to make it happen with all of the safety skills you've acquired over the years.

Hunters: Here's a short tip. Please remember, maintain, "eye relief". Make sure you maintain a safe distance between your eye and the scope to prevent eye injuries caused by the recoil of the rifle.

Shooters: Once again there seems to be an abundance of shooters that are either using the wrong target frames (short ones), or are placing multiple targets too low on the frame with the result that too many of you are not impacting the backstop. We have been seeing more and more of this practice over the past several weeks and it has to stop. Both of us have had occasion to call a cease-fire in order to correct this condition. Range Masters, you are charged with the responsibility of making sure each and every shooter has their targets placed on the frames as to ensure the correct backstop impact. Please remember also, you may not shoot at any uncovered rocks which may appear occasionally on the backstops. You have no way of knowing where that ricochet may be going. We have neighbors around us who are very tolerant of our needs and we are sure they do not wish to find your ricochets in their backyard. Here is another tip. We realize many of you shoot bulls eye competition and must do a rapid fire practice. Please remember that during rapid fire, you must, at all times, be aware of your muzzle location, to insure that each round is impacting the backstop. Here at EF&GA we still allow rapid-fire practice, however, most private and public ranges discourage this practice.

The National Shooting Sports Foundation put it this way "...Practice Safety At All Times..." "Shooting is among the safest of all sports. However, safety should never be taken for granted when firearms are involved. No trophy, no score, no competition is worth an injury to yourself or others. Safety is your first and foremost responsibility..."

Range Masters: The range master schedule books are located in the first aid box in the trap Ramada. Please remember to fill in the dates and times you wish to volunteer to stand a post. We cannot express how important it is for you to support this program. Without your help this Association could not function, so please sign up today.


