

# RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Members,

As your new Chief Range Master, my first Sound Off would be incomplete without words for my good friend and mentor Ray Bucholz. Ray has been the Chief Range Safety Officer for our association the past 8+ years. He has donated countless hours and has given his time without asking for anything in return. We need more like Ray: unselfish, giving, always helpful and willing to share. When I think about Ray, I am reminded of many things but always RANGE PRIDE. Please do your part in helping keep our range tidy, clean and safe. Ray will now have some time to shoot his Friendship Black powder rifle. He deserves it. Shoot-em straight Ray and keep your powder dry!

I have a clarification for Range Masters and members pertaining to targets depicting images and faces. We have added a line #15 to the Administrative portion of the Range Manual. It reads "The use of targets that display the image of a political, controversial or public person living or dead is prohibited." This page will be sent to all Range Masters that attended the Range Master meeting 3-22-08. If you can recognize the face on the target it is prohibited.

The new longer range is approaching completion and with it brings an urgent need for additional Range Masters. We need men and women who are willing to work 60+ hours a year. That is 12 shifts of 5 hours duration. The AM shift is 7AM until noon; PM shift is noon until 5PM. In the summer we need another shift from 5PM until closing. We need volunteers that will sign up in advance and enforce our administrative policies. We need those willing to work. I am in the process of working up a training program for new Range Masters and a review program for active Range Masters. I challenge all active Range Masters to recruit one new Range Master willing to donate their time to help keep our ranges safe. I will ask new Range Masters if they were sponsored and by whom.

We have had numerous reports from members and range masters that non-members are shooting on our range. This usually occurs on the weekends when the gate is open for non member events i.e.: Cowboy, combat, trap, etc. We need Range Masters on the weekend to police our grounds. It isn't the job of shoot chairs to police the entire range.

Those of you who have volunteered your time to serve our members as Range Masters are appreciated. Your position is the highest most respected and most needed position in our organization. You keep the peace, keep the order and make our ranges safe for members and guests. We all must take the time to review our range manuals and brush up on the rules. Here are a few that need to be enforced daily:

- 1. Check everyone for club ID and picture ID. Make sure they match the sign in sheet.
- 2. Check all ranges numerous times while on duty. Watch for safety violations.
- 3. Enforce all association rules. (read your Range Manuals)
- 4. Be courteous and polite. You have the final word- PERIOD.
- 5. Members and guests must sign in before unloading and unload only when the range is hot or no one is down range.






