I wanted to start out by letting you know that I am performing the Maintenance duties for the Association on a temporary basis. The board has felt for some time now that we need to increase the amount of hours to perform the duties that are needed. So, I am working 20 hours per week instead of the 10 hours a week that Vinnie was spending. There are many times during the week that work could be performed down range in the early hours before the casual shooters arrive. I have taken advantage of that and it shows. Vinnie works the 4:00 to 12:00 shift (on his regular job) which made it hard for him to take advantage of the availability of the range. Business is slow for me right now and this gives us an opportunity to see just how many hours it really takes to perform the work. When we hired Vinnie, we had 4 acres and one rifle range. Now we have two rifle ranges, campground, open fields and a total of over 12 acres to maintain.

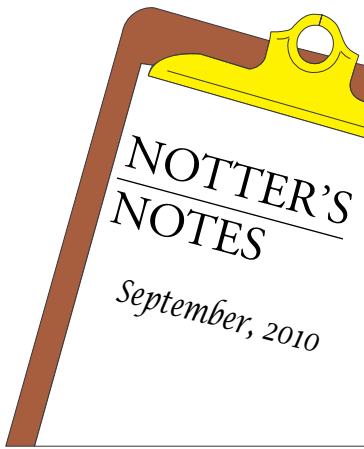

Along with the Architect, I am meeting with the County this coming Monday to pursue the acquisition of the permit. We have performed the hydrology study that they required at the last meeting and are now prepared, hopefully, to acquire the permit. Don't hold your breath but I plan on riding shotgun with the architect so I can better explain things as a client.

All the storage containers have been removed and we are now waiting for the power to be turned on so we can have the last shed removed. When that happens, we will grade the area and put down some recycled road base so the area is suitable for parking.

Prior to the last BOD meeting, we processed 43 new members. This all happened because of organized team work. I want to thank Tom Kendal, Lee Allan, and Jay Zimmitt for getting there early and doing the walk-through's. I also want to thank the board for showing up early to conduct the interviews. Julie and Lucy worked really well together to process the paper work. Mike Marks conducted some late interviews so we could start the meeting Board meeting on time.

APPLESEED SHOOT

On Aug. 14 and 15, 2010, the RWVA (Revolutionary War Veteran's Association) held an Appleseed Shoot at EF&GA. The group is well organized and very safety conscious, with emphasis on marksmanship and Revolutionary War history. 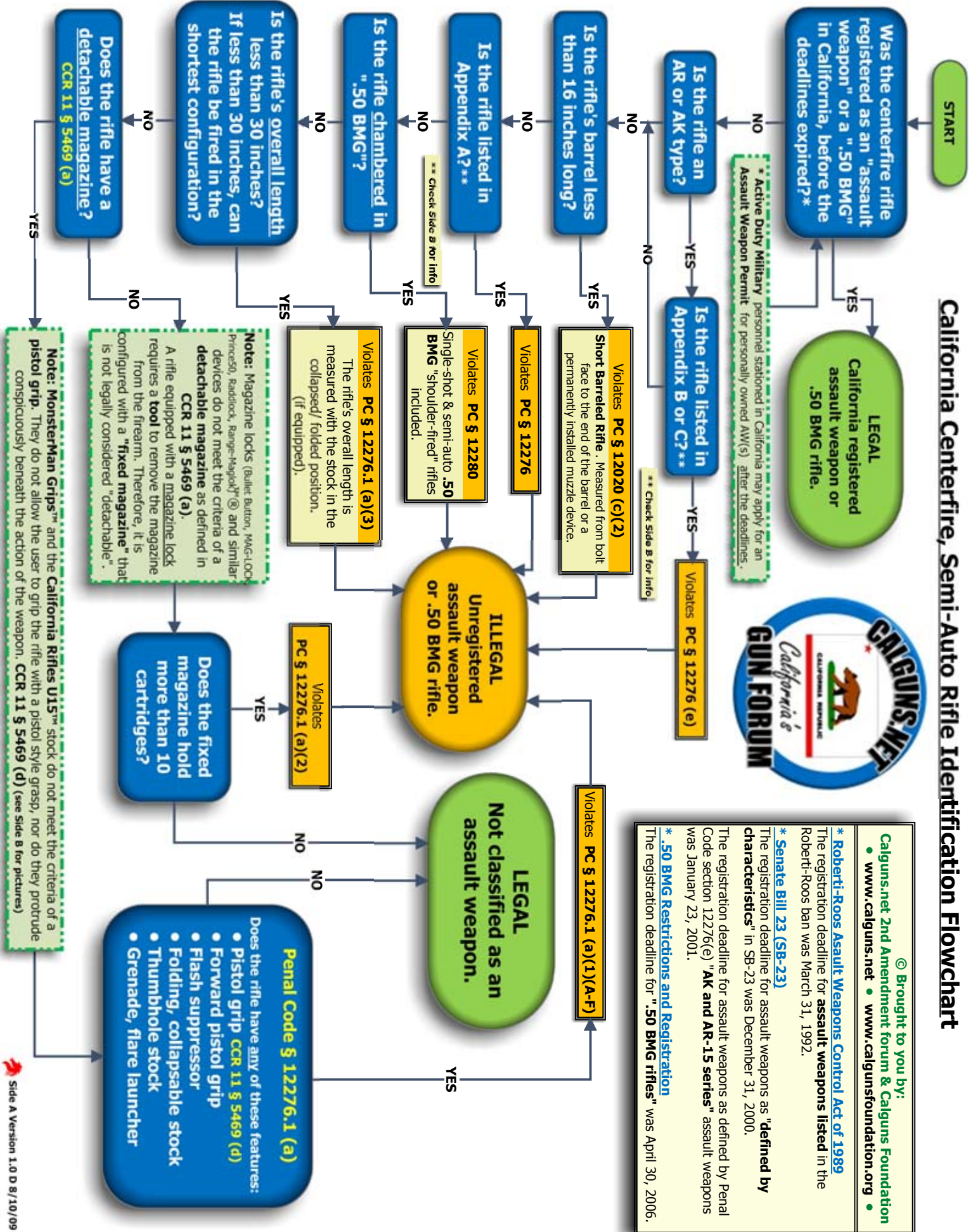

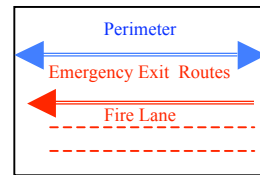

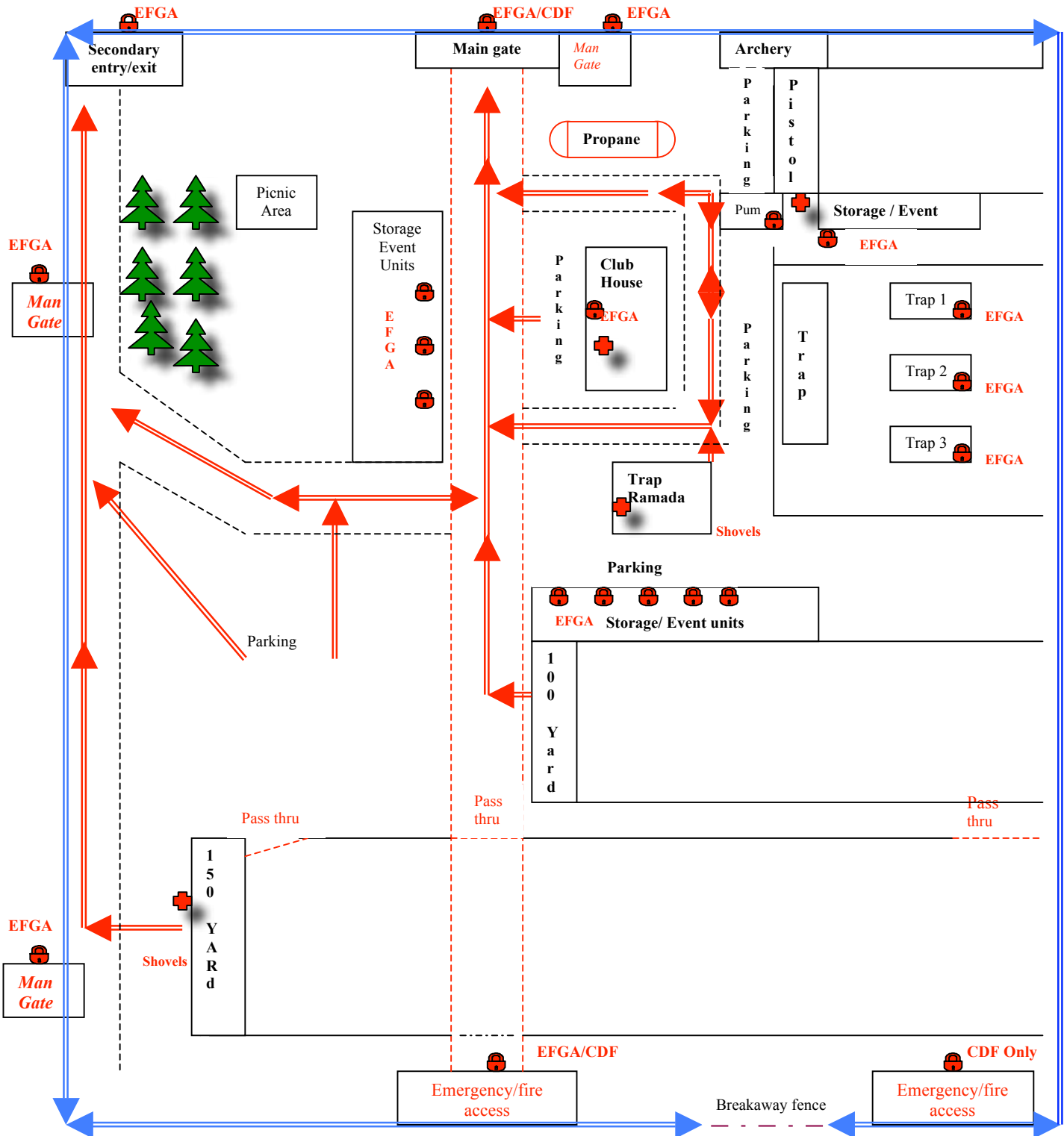
ESCONDIDO FISH AND GAME ASSOCIATION EVACUATION PLAN

R A N G E M A S T E R S O U N D O F F

Please bring your membership card and photo identification with you to the range. If you have not received your new “year” sticker, call the Association Clerk and get one. The Range Safety Officer’s (RSO’s) have been instructed to deny range use to anyone not in possession of their current membership card and photo identification. If you do not have your current membership card, the RSO will ask you to leave. Failure to comply with any RSO direction can lead to loss of membership.

I would like to congratulate two of our trap shooters. Steve Willer has qualified Expert – Trap and Norm Porst has qualified Distinguished Expert - Trap. To qualify Expert, one must shoot 10 rounds of 19 or better and to qualify Distinguished Expert, one must shoot 10 rounds of 22 or better. For those of you that are not familiar with Trap Shooting, a round consists of 25 clay targets shot from the trap house at five different angles and traveling at over 60 miles per hour. Breaking the clays is more of an art than a skill. Each angle has its own lead; that is the distance you must be in front of the clay target when you shoot. The newsletter generally lists those that have shot perfect rounds of 25, 50, 75 and 100 straight.

For those of you that have never shot a round of trap and think you might like to, we have some really great trainers and coaches; Annette Champion, Bill and Barbara Griffith, and Bob Schoenfield, to name but a few. If you plan on trying trap, check the monthly calendar for Trap Days: Tuesday mornings, Wednesday and Saturday evenings. If you do not have a shotgun, call one of the Trap Chairs to make arrangements to use one of the Assoc. shotguns. We do not rent the shotguns, but we charge a \$5.00 cleaning fee. Shot shells are also generally available for a modest fee. The Assoc. shotguns are generally not available on Tuesdays.

We also have a five-stand range set up on trap house three. Five-stand has the clay targets coming from many different places; straight at you high up, left to right crossing, right to left crossing, straight away out of the house and a rabbit; the rabbit runs and bounces along the ground. The rules are generally the same as a regular trap. Bob Schoenfield likes to keep things interesting by changing the position of the trap machines and speed that clay target travels.

Trap fees are as follows: members - \$5.00 per round of regular trap and five-stand. Guests pay \$6.00 per round of regular trap and \$7.00 for five-stand. Youth and Junior shooters are a bit less. Guests (non-members) are welcome on trap days.

While I am on the subject of trap shooting, I would like to cover a few of the rules and some trap etiquette. The rules are posted in various places around the range. Eye and ear protection is required. Do not close the action of your gun or mount it until it is your turn to shoot. Chamber only one round (shot shell) at a time unless you are shooting doubles. If you are using a semi-automatic shotgun, please have a shell catcher in place. This keeps ejected shells from hitting the person next to you. When leaving position five for position one in the rotation, turn to the right. This keeps you from bumping into the person coming from position four. Do not rotate (move from one position to the nest), until the rotate command has been issued by the score keeper. Please do not talk on the firing line; the clay targets are launched by voice command via the microphones in front of each shooting position.

Range Safety Tip of the Month – when a cease-fire is declared, no shooting takes place, the firearm is emptied of shells or magazine out, action open with an “open chamber indicator”, preferred, firearm placed on the bench with the muzzle pointing down range and then step behind the yellow line. When everyone is behind the yellow line, the range is declared “cold” and shooters may go down range to check their targets, etc. Please do not handle any firearm or equipment when the range is cold.

Attention Active Duty RSO’s (those that have worked regular shifts in the past year), Trap Masters and Shoot Chairs – Range Master Appreciation Day is by invitation only and is scheduled for all day Sunday, 19 September 2010, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Fun, food (breakfast and a hot lunch) and prizes. All complements of EF&GA, except for the raffle tickets.

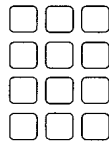
