Third and, I think, extremely important is that the Board of Directors are just folks, like you, and elected to serve the majority of the membership. Please do not feel they are unapproachable.


I hope this helps.

User-Friendliness

I have worked in the IT (Information Technology) industry for the past 30 years and the one request from employers, employees, customers, and general public is that they all want the world to be *user-friendly*. Here is a little secret about the IT industry - The key to making something *user-friendly* is

to make it impossible for a user to select something that is impossible. Behind the scenes we call it making it *idiot-proof*. This is true for firearms as well as computers. This is why I am a big fan of the CHAMBER FLAG.

The chamber flag makes a very clear distinction between idiot-resistant and idiot-proof. It is impossible to discharge a firearm with a chamber flag inserted into the chamber. These are required in the Junior Rifle and Junior Pistol events as well as many other sanctioned events like the Cracker Shoot. It would be a great practice while you are casually shooting as well. If you want to go downrange, after you clear the chamber and remove the magazine, insert a chamber flag. When you are in the habit of doing this, not only are you making it safe, you are being a good example to your guests and any other members around you (Junior as well as Senior). At any General Meeting, they are for sale at the merchandise table. I hear that they are running a special - \$1 each or 3 for \$5. They can truly make the difference between idiot-resistant and idiot-proof.

RANGEMASTER SOUND OFF

Recently, I have received a few complaints that members have tried to reach me with no success. Whether by my home phone, cell phone or via email, considering the number of calls that I field any given week, I am not sure how it could happen. However, assuming they are right my email address is shown above and I guarantee that it works. My cell phone is stapled to my hip and is listed below. Calls and messages come in nearly 24/7! If the line is busy, don't be bashful, try again.

The RSOs keep reporting problems mostly on the pistol range. While there are signs all over, the short range still seems to lead to some confusion. Unlike the rest of the pistol range and all of the long gun ranges you are only allowed to have a single 10" target centered on the 24" x 24" frame. As always, if you are exceptionally tall (or short) the target may need to be adjusted slightly up or down. You can make this call by carefully watching where your rounds impact. If your rounds are landing too high or too low in the impact area, make the proper target adjustment. Keep an eye on your guests so that their rounds impact properly also. Target adjustments may also be required on all the other ranges too. Don't assume that just because you are hitting the bullseye that everything is ok.

Self-defense is frequently on the mind of many people who practice on the range and particularly on the pistol range. Using a firearm for self-defense carries the same responsibility as using it on the range. It is critical to always be aware of where your rounds are going. Wounding an innocent by-stander serves no purpose and in the long run may cause even more problems for you. Keep your mind sharp and always try to be aware of your surroundings.

When going down range to work on or pull a target, always make certain that all firearms are unloaded and on safe. This is a mistake made more often than you may realize. Fortunately we have few accidental discharges, but they do happen and could easily lead to losing one's membership at the very least. I am sure you all know the adage about what happens when we "assume" too much. Remember to use the "Red Down-Range Lights" before crossing the red line to go work on targets. Do not unload anything, do not handle any equipment and do not cross the yellow line when there is **ANYONE** down range.

Note: In the past, wives were automatically members along with their husbands and allowed to bring a guest on their own. Some members might not be aware that a new rule change means that in order to have their own membership card a member's spouse must also be an NRA member. It costs a nominal fee, but not having a membership card has created a problem from time to time and can easily be avoided.




