
Ideas for Completing Your Volunteer Commitment
















Hunter Education Class 5/11/2024, 7/13/2024, 8/10/2024 & 10/12/224 (8 am – 4 pm)

The Hunter Education Course is a nationally approved curriculum designed to teach hunters the knowledge, skills and ethics to become safe and responsible hunters. The covered topics include basic firearms nomenclature, safe firearm loading/unloading practices, wildlife conservation, wildlife identification, hunting ethics, hunt preparations, hunting techniques, shot placement, bag limits, tracking skills, basic survival skills, basic navigation skills, basic first aid, game recovery, field dressing, game care and much more. Every state in America requires a Hunter Education Certificate in order to obtain a hunting license. The certificate issued is valid in all states and in numerous foreign countries, and is good for life. No live fire involved, firearms and ammunition are not required for the course.

Red Dot Sight (RDS) for Handguns 5/13/2024 (1 pm – 5 pm)

Class Description:

Class Description:

This course covers fundamentals of Red Dot Sight (RDS) use on handguns. It was developed from lessons at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center for training academy students, field agents, and mentoring firearms instructors using RDS on duty weapons. Classroom and range time provides exercises, drills and methods to help you learn to effectively use your red dot sight and maximize your potential.

Class Description:

The NRA Pistol Instructor Course is designed to provide the necessary training to become an NRA Certified Pistol Instructor.

The Pistol Instructor Course provides actual hands-on methodologies of the curriculum to provide candidates the opportunity to experience a classroom educational setting. There is a live-fire portion where candidates meet the shooting level also required to become certified instructors.

NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Class

6/1/2024. 8/3/2024 & 10/5/2024 (8 am - 12 noon)

Ammunition is hard enough to find and expensive enough. Now Vista Outdoor, the owners of the largest ammunition manufacturers, Federal, CCI, Speer, Remington Ammo, Hevi-Shot and others, are selling off that division to a Czechoslovakian group, known as CSG. This places our ability to acquire ammunition or components in foreign hands. (National Rifleman, April 4, 2024)

Is there any better reason to learn to reload your own ammunition?

Class Description:

This class will supply you with the knowledge of how to properly and safely reload your used casings into economical, effective and accurate ammunition. As you hone your new found reloading knowledge you will also improve your shooting skills.

The class is structured in two separate sessions:

1St session – This class is strictly academic and is held in the EF&GA Meeting Hall on the above dates from 8am until noon.

2nd session – This is "Hands-On" training scheduled with a mutually agreed upon time and date where you will reload your own cartridges on the reloading bench that day.

The cost of the class is \$125 for EF&GA members and \$135 for non-members. If you need supplies (e.g., cases, primers, projectiles and powder) they are available for a \$15 surcharge.

Prior registration is necessary and a \$20 nonrefundable deposit is required to secure a place in this limited class.

NRA Basic Shotgun Class

Law Enforcement Training

There will be "Law Enforcement" training at the Range in the future and we have purchased some signs indicating "TRAINING IN PROGRESS". Please do not interrupt them and ask them what they are doing. They have been approved by The Board of Directors for "Training" that is different from Casual Shooting rules.

Want to be an RSO?

If you are a member of Escondido Fish & Game Association and you are interested in becoming a Rangemaster/RSO contact me and we can talk about the requirements.

Guests

Members pay attention to your guests. They are your responsibility.

Range is Cold - Blue Lights Blinking

Blue Blinking lights on or off applies to all ranges. If the Blue Blinking lights are on do not unload firearms or gear from your car. Sign the Green Sheet and wait for the range to go hot and then you can unload your firearms and gear.

The Green Sheets

I know this is redundant, but Green Sheets are **STILL** being turned in without the Date and Range information filled in. Please make sure the Date and Range information is filled in on any sheet you sign.

Targets and Target Backers

All shooters remove your targets from the target backers and return the target frames back to the designated area. Take your used targets home for disposal. HAZMAT regulation!

Wildlife

Watch for turkeys, deer and other wildlife on the range. Call a "Cease Fire" if they wander onto the range. There is to be no shooting when wildlife is present.



Smallbore?

As a shoot chair for several events that have the words "Smallbore Rifle" in their name, I'm often asked, "What is 'Smallbore'?" The simple (and trite) answer is, "Not large bore!", which harkens back to the origin of the term. The more informative, but loose, answer is, ".22 caliber rimfire". The term "smallbore" came about because organized, competitive target shooting in the mid-19th century started with large caliber centerfire rifles, usually those used by the military of various countries. Competitions governed by the American and British National Rifle Associations and the International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) were all of this nature. One downside of this was the matches required large outdoor ranges, limiting where and when matches could be held. Other downsides were recoil and cost that weren't conducive to training new (and often, young) shooters.

In the 1870s and '80s, smallbore rifle shooting, particularly indoors, started taking off, aided by the development of the .22 long rifle cartridge in 1887. The first smallbore rifle match in Britain was in 1903; in the Olympics (governed by the ISSF) in 1908; and by the American NRA in 1919. The Olympics dropped smallbore until reinstating it in 1928, where it has been on the schedule ever since. Today, smallbore rifle competitions are held by the NRA, the ISSF, and the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP), as well as Scouting and 4-H youth programs. Matches may be of the "position" type, either all prone or including sitting, kneeling and standing, or, in the case of silhouette, all standing.

Depending on the governing body, the description of the smallbore cartridge varies slightly: The ISSF, the CMP and the NRA Rifle Silhouette rulebooks say ".22 long rifle", ".22LR" or "5.56x15mmR", while the NRA Smallbore Rifle rulebook more broadly states ".22 Short, .22 Long, or .22 Long Rifle. Note that it is NOT just ".22", or ".22 rimfire" or "rimfire", thereby excluding cartridges such as .22WMR, .17HMR, or .223 Remington and any of the other small caliber centerfire cartridges. The round of choice for competition is the .22LR 40 grain round nose standard velocity.

Two disciplines that have not adopted the "smallbore" term are rimfire benchrest and precision rimfire, even though their rules specify .22LR. These are much newer forms of competition than those above and perhaps avoiding the use of the term "smallbore" is intended to eliminate the question, "What is 'Smallbore'?!
